President's Message

It seems amazing that another month has slipped past since our last newsletter.

But as the corny old saying goes "time flies when you are having fun."

Your committee has been very active in all areas. Over the last month the council has completed work on the club that ensures that our facility meets all of the requirements of recent legislation for places of public entertainment. Further works are about to commence which will see an upgrade to the kitchen and a new covering to the floor in the Koolooro room.

Training of all types has continued and fine tuning to the new constitution has been made so that it is ready for presentation to the members at the coming Extraordinary General Meeting.

At a recent presentation evening held at Harbord Diggers we were awarded a \$5,000 grant from the Harbord Diggers (Mounties Group) as part of their community support scheme. This grant is to be used towards the cost of the recently acquired Bobcat which has become an essential part of our patrol equipment. Thanks goes to the Diggers for their generous support.

I attended the recent Northern Beaches Branch Annual General Meeting which was well attended by local Councillors and State Politicians. The clear message provided by all the officials at this meeting was that they have a great deal of respect for what is done by the 15,000 surf lifesavers on the northern beaches who provide voluntary hours to protect the bathing public and undertake other support activities in the local community. It is pleasing to see that the contribution is recognised by these levels of Government and it further reinforces the need for us at Freshie to ensure that we never lose sight of the role that we play in the local community.

We are still waiting for a final decision from council on the timing as to when we will be providing weekend patrols without the support of Council Lifeguards. In ensuring that we will be ready for this contingency we are progressing on the assumption that we will be handed this responsibility this season. But watch this space for further developments.

It has been pleasing to see that as people have been approached to assist in various tasks around the club that they have been eager to help out. All assistance is greatly appreciated and it is great way to get more out of being a member of Freshie.

As the days get warmer and longer more people are starting to reappear at the beach, however it will be a while until the water warms up but if the next month goes as quickly as the last month we will be back in full swing before we know where we are.

Good luck for those heading towards the finals in their winter sports.

Club Captain's Message

Well, it's getting closer and closer to the start of the season yet again. Every year, this seems to come around so much quicker. This year, the first day of patrols is on 3rd October. While that is the start of the patrolling season, we have been busy in the off season preparing for a bigger and better season for 2009/10.

A few things that I have been up to with my team of supporters are:

- Organising the IRB room and ensuring IRBs are ready for the start of the season
- Ensuring that patrol equipment is updated and functional
- Working on the patrol roster for the coming season
- Applying for grants for new equipment for lifesaving and education
- Training for higher awards with Lindsay Davis – our Chief Instructor
- Gear Inspection – 30th August 2009 – your assistance would be greatly appreciated. Email me at captain@freshwaterslsc.com to register your interest.

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will read about a couple of rescues recently performed by club members. If you're involved in a rescue in the off season or out of hours during the season, please let me know as this has a large effect on our funding from the state and federal governments.

I'm also looking to make some changes over the coming season. One of the biggest changes that the lifesaving team is looking to make is to increase the number of patrols on the roster. This will provide a two-fold effect: reduce the number of people on a patrol so that there is not an inundation of members on patrol AND reduce the number of patrols that are required to be completed by **YOU** for the entire season. This will reduce the average from 9 to 7 or 8 for the season – generally one patrol every three weeks instead of every four weeks.



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If you're interested in this, I need **YOUR** support. For Freshwater SLSC to be able to achieve this, we need to have the following award members on each patrol:

- Honorary Beach Inspector
- Silver Medallion – Basic Beach Management
- Silver Medallion – IRB Driver
- IRB Crew
- Advanced Resuscitation Certificated holder
- Spinal Management Certificate holder
- Defibrillation Certificate holder
- Senior First Aid certificate holder

This will also mean that the patrols as they are currently positioned may be completely changed. The people who you have been patrolling with for some time will change. This will give you a fantastic opportunity to meet new people and forge new friendships with people you may not have known were part of our great club.

If you would like to help me to achieve the increase in the number of patrols and thus the decrease in patrols for **YOU** for the season, **I NEED YOUR HELP**. I need **YOU** to sign up for the higher awards that are advertised on FreshNET. If an award is not advertised on FreshNET and someone asks you to participate in completing that award, I need **YOU** to say **YES**. If I do not get the required numbers, we will be at status quo and 16 patrols. I would love to hear your feedback on this proposal. Please email me at captain@freshwaterslsc.com.

I'll also need some help during the season for the administration side of lifesaving. Please don't let this fall on deaf ears – many hands make light work; so please get in touch and offer your assistance.

I look forward to hearing from you and seeing you the beach in the very near future.

Club Security System

The new security system has been up and running for just over a month now and despite a couple of early hiccougs, it seems to be working well. There a quite a few members who have paid for their FOBS but not yet collected them from the office – they are available any time the office is opened.

For those of you who are armed and ready to go, you should keep in mind the following key points –

- You cannot gain access to the building via the glass door leading into the foyer. All access is via the door at the bottom of the ramp leading underneath the club
- Access to the club premises cannot be achieved prior to 5.30am no matter how many times you swipe your FOB
- You need to ensure you are equipped with **your** FOB and not that of your wife, husband, partner, daughter, son etc. As some members have already discovered, no matter how many times you swipe the change room pad, a FOB issued to a male member will not allow access to the female change room or vice versa (at least we hope the numerous unsuccessful attempts at entry into opposite sex change rooms so far is because of having the wrong FOB!)
- General access to the club and change rooms will be available on Sundays from 7.30am to 1pm and from 2pm to 3.30pm.

Ski paddling – There are a few different ski sessions over each week. Tim Munro will be taking the serious sessions mid week mornings and Saturday morning. This will be designed for competent and serious paddlers but not just open men. The afternoon mid week sessions will be taken by Carl, but he will be joining the Manly ski paddlers and doing their session. Kevin Crow will be taking a beginner session on Saturday and Sunday morning (open to everyone including juniors and masters). A wave catching and surf skills session will be held on Sunday mornings and should be attended by all junior paddlers. Note that there will be technique and skills sessions over winter at times yet to be nominated.

Swimming (Warringah Aquatic Centre) – Note that Manly Pool has closed for July so this session moves to the Aquatic Centre. This session is suitable for masters swimmers and others who are transitioning into their squads

Gym – Peter Cullum or Tim Jacobs will be at the gym at the noted times and will be available to assist, and will also write a program for each week (I would strongly recommend you arrange for a time to meet a friend at the gym to do the session with)

Running – There will be two groups that run at this time. Grant Coates will be taking one group that will be faster and will run further, the second group will be a more moderate pace and will not run as far as the first.

Circuit – Tim Jacobs will be taking the circuit class. Note that the start time is 6.30pm and for the month of July there will only be one class. As numbers increase the class will be split into two like last season.

Cycling – The cycling group will meet at Freshie and will do a road circuit. This is simply cross training only to break things up a little. You will need a road bike and a light.
