Mark served on the executive committee for a number of years and was the club's social organiser for many seasons. In true Gilly style, the final song at his funeral as he was sent on his way was, as he requested, AC-DCs Highway to Hell. **Vale Gilly.**

Bob also competed for the club in the 1950s as a member of the March Past team. 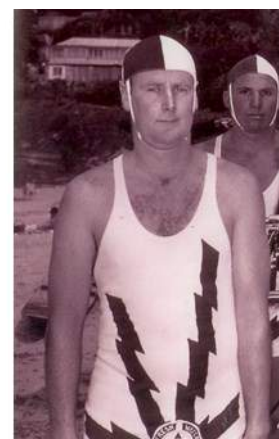
## VIC ORME

Saturday 5 December saw the ashes scattering ceremony for former club member Vic Orme who passed away in September aged 86. Vic was a champion swimmer at the club in the 1940s and 1950s winning a number of club surf and belt race championships along the way. One year saw him defeat club legend Soccer Matheson in the belt race which was no mean feat having regard to Soccer's ability in the belt. Vic was also a member of the club's first Junior R&R team to win an Australian championship in 1947. **Vale Vic.**



## JOHN CRAIG

In January 2016 long time member and former Australian March Past champion John "Noisy" Craig passed away. Noisy was earlier this season presented with his 60 year SLSA service pin, having first joined in the club in 1953. He was a good swimmer in his day, winning the coveted President's Cup in 1956-57. During the 1960s and early 1970s he joined neighbouring South Curl Curl and was a member of their march past team, including the one which famously triple dead heated for the gold medal at the 1965-66 Australian Championships. He returned to Freshwater in the late 1970s and remained a member until his death. He also returned to the march past team and during the period 1978 to 1991 won 12 Branch, 10 Metropolitan, 7 State & 4 Australian gold medals as well as a swag of minor medals. What made his march past success even more remarkable was the fact he was profoundly deaf and was never able to hear the music – he merely followed the rest of his team and was tapped on the shoulder by one of his team mates when it was time to start marching. He was a real character in every sense of the word. He did not enjoy the best of health in his later years but he was a true maroon and white man right the very end. **Vale Noisy.**



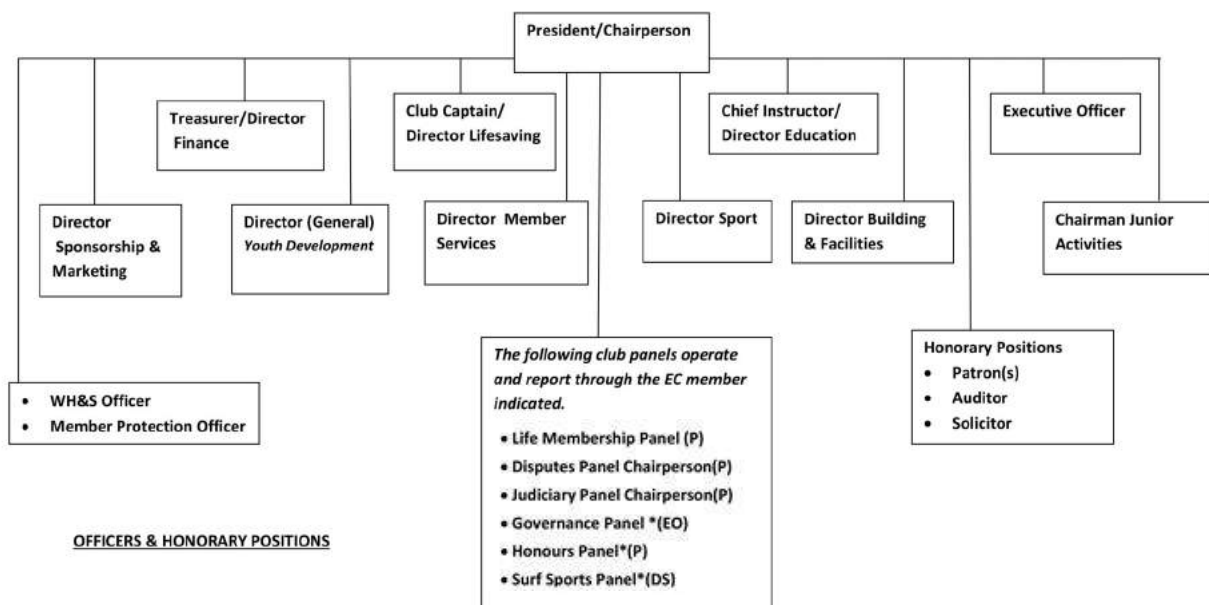

# president's report

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PRESIDENT



Another year in our proud history has drawn to a close and it is our annual report that allows us to reflect on our achievements and provide a record for those who will follow.

When I think about the broad range of activities within our club, my immediate thoughts are always about how well are we delivering on our commitment to the broader community, that they can come and enjoy Freshwater beach in safety. Tom Duffy continued as our Director of Life Saving this year and was again supported by Clare Freakley and other experienced patrolling members. Tom's leadership and connection with the patrolling group is exceptional. While we don't know the results of the interclub patrol rankings, I am sure we will continue to be one of the best performing clubs in the Branch. The attention to detail and commitment made by all our patrolling members allowed us to maintain our record of no lives lost whilst patrolling the beach. On behalf of all our members and I'm sure everyone who comes to Freshwater beach, thank you for your dedication and passion to life saving.

Change is inevitable in any organisation, and this season John Goldrick took over the role of Director Education. John brought some new ideas and was able to rely on the strong platform that has been in place for a number of years. The feedback on the approach and benefit our members received during their proficiencies was wonderful and I'm sure has led to better performing life savers on the beach. We have taken a large group of young members through their SRC and onto patrol as well as converting other SRC holders to their Bronze. There have also been many new members join and attain their Bronze. We have seen many experienced members achieve higher level awards which all helps improve the quality of what we do on the beach. All of our trainees attained their awards at their first assessment which is testament to the quality of the training delivered. I look forward to this continuing in the years ahead.

Last year I reflected on how overworked our IRB drivers and crew are within our club. While it is not something that can be fixed overnight there has been considerable progress with a significantly larger number of members attaining these awards this season. This will continue to be a focus area to ensure we meet our commitments at both a patrol and competition level and ultimately achieve a lessor reliance on a small number of members.

As a club we continue to provide an opportunity for anyone who wishes to compete in any area of life saving competition. This season saw a significant increase in beach based events and a cross-over in training for those whose primary focus is still in the water. It is a great testament to the work Michael Kirkby and the section captains put into all these areas that continues to produce strong levels of participation and results at all levels of competition. We had great success at Aussies

this year. In the First Aid events we were represented in the U17s, U19s and Open events finishing with a bronze, silver and the dreaded leather medal respectively. Our 6 person Open R&R team won gold and the coveted Curlewis Premiership banner and we achieved medals and finals results for other teams. There were many other strong results that can be found in the Sports report section.

What a year it was for our Junior Activities section. We welcomed a new Chairman in Hamish McLean who was thrown in the deep end by not only having to come to grips with overseeing the largest section of our club, but also lead the celebration of 50 Years of Nippers at Freshwater. Hamish and the team have worked incredibly hard and made it a stand-out season for all the young members and their families. A great deal of work was done to get more people involved to lighten the load and there are plans in place to extend this further next season. A wonderful function was held in February where current and past Nipper families had a chance to gather, reminisce and celebrate where we have been and where we will go in the future. Congratulations to all those involved in a great Nipper season.

This season we undertook a review of our Constitution. Wayne Freakley led this work and at our December General Meeting the majority of changes were endorsed. More work has continued to be done to ensure we have the details in place to continue to meet the expectations of our members in how we administer our club. Together with the support of Gayle Taylor in the office, I have no doubt in believing we are at the very top of the tree in meeting the administration requirements to be a successful club.

For the first time in many years, we took the hard decision to raise membership fees. This was not an easy decision, but a necessary one to ensure as a club, we remain sustainable. # executive officer's report



The past season has been busy and challenging. The provision of administrative support to meet the demands of a modern day surf club remains time consuming and at times complex. Changes to the club constitution, pursuit of more flexible liquor licence conditions and the phasing in of the new working with children check obligation have all contributed significantly to the challenges of the position.

## Membership

Total membership has fallen since last season, largely attributable to a decrease in the number of junior activity and general (nipper parent) members. The decrease in membership numbers is consistent with the majority of other clubs in the Branch. The club retains a healthy membership base and is second largest in the Branch.

## Executive Committee

Meetings of the Executive Committee were generally held on the second Thursday of each month. Due to the absence of a number of members no meeting was conducted in October. A total of 11 meetings were held and the attendance record of the committee members is outlined in the table opposite. A number of off-line meetings were also held to discuss life membership nominations and annual awards. This was to ensure sufficient time for discussion of other important operational issues at the scheduled monthly meetings. In keeping with recent years, the increasing complexity of managing the operations of the club meant meetings were generally lengthy. The average meeting time over the course of the year was 2 hours 15 minutes.

# executive officer's report

## Club Governance

The club's Governance Panel is made up of the President, Executive Officer, Club Captain, Director Sport, Junior Activities Representative, a Life Member and long service/senior member. In accordance with the Constitution the By-Laws were reviewed by the Panel in August and September to confirm their on-going relevance. All By-laws, together with any proposed amendments, were subsequently submitted to the Executive Committee for approval. Once approved, action was taken to ensure current versions of all By-Laws were available on the club website.

A number of changes to club procedures were introduced this year. Most involved relatively minor changes to reflect changed practices. All changes recommended by the Governance Panel were accepted unanimously by the Executive Committee.

A summary of the By-Laws currently in force together with amendments made during the course of the year is set out in the table below -

# executive officer's report



The Governance Panel also undertook a comprehensive review of the club's constitution to ensure it remained relevant. As a result of the review a number of changes were recommended including –

- Revised and plain English objectives
- Revised meeting procedures for the Executive Committee
- An alteration of the financial year to May – April
- Adding a requirement the constitution be reviewed at least once every 10 years
- Revised provisions relating to the Life Member nomination process

The proposed changes were supported by the Executive Committee and put to the membership at the general meeting of the club held on 14 December. Following a lively debate all but the revised Life Member provisions were approved by those in attendance.

The Life Member proposals were referred back to the Governance Panel for further consideration. As part of that process a meeting was arranged involving Peter Obern (President), John Swan (Chair Life Member panel), myself and approximately 10 current Life Members to discuss the issues arising from the proposed changes and so better inform the Governance Panel. As a result of those discussions and recent changes to the Associations Incorporations Act, it is anticipated recommendations for further amendments to the constitution will be put to the members during the first half of the next season.

## Membership Records

During the course of the season work has continued to bring membership records up to date in respect of –

- years of service
- official positions held both within the club and other lifesaving entities
- club awards and other forms of recognition
- competition results for championship and other special events

The collation of the information is time consuming and unfortunately not all previous annual reports have included all of the relevant details. The work undertaken to date has greatly assisted in facilitating the club applying for SLSA long service pins for members. Over the coming 12 months attempts will be made to extend the process to other membership categories.

## Water Safety Policy and work health and safety

The club continues to utilise the simplified combined risk assessment form for all water based activities. Generally compliance with the provisions has been good though some areas have not been as attentive to the new requirements as others. This remains a concern as non-compliance with the SLSA procedures, which are in effect work, health &

safety obligations, has potentially significant ramifications for both the club and individual members.

A number of members suffered minor and major injuries during the course of the season while involved in club related activities. This resulted in claims being lodged with ICare (the new name for Workcover).

## General Administration

As indicated earlier in this report, administrative obligations continue to increase in complexity and the associated paperwork continued its growth. Our administrative officer Gayle Taylor attends to the vast majority of general administrative tasks. Gayle provides invaluable assistance to me and other members of the Executive Committee. The club would cease to function effectively without the assistance of Gayle in this role.

The Surfguard system continued to be used to send out routine and special notices to the general membership electronically. It was again used to send out membership renewal forms and the paperwork associated with the Annual General Meeting which continued to result in significant resource, time and financial savings. A physical mail out continued to be used for those members without email addresses. Revised payment and other forms helped streamline this process. Failure by some members to follow the instructions outlined in the correspondence and difficulties negotiating the SLSA payment portal contributed to delays in processing some membership renewal applications.

Over the course of the season, eight editions of the club newsletter *A Fresh Update* were issued. As in past seasons the newsletter incorporated a mix of operational, informative and light hearted information covering the broad spectrum of club activities. There was a continued reluctance by members to provide input for the newsletter which at times made it difficult to provide an engaging document.

## New liquor licence

To provide greater flexibility the club made application to change from its current Limited Licence to an On-Premise licence. The On-Premise licence will overcome difficulties associated with the days and times alcohol can be served at club social functions under the current licence. Unfortunately the process involved in surrendering the old licence and applying for the new one has been lengthy and surrounded by much red tape. Though originally applied for in September the Independent Liquor Authority has still not finalised the application at the date of preparing this report. Hopefully the issue will be resolved by the time the next patrol season commences.

## New working with children checks

The new working with children check system came into operation on 1 April. Various members engaged in roles

which involve contact with members under the age of 18 are now required to have a working with children check clearance. The clearance lasts 5 years and must be sighted before the member can engage with children. The club is subject to random audits by the Office of the Children's Guardian and significant penalties apply if the provisions of the Act are not followed. New procedures have been developed to address the new requirements.

While there are a number of exemptions under the provisions, the need to ensure compliance with the new provisions will add to the complexity of the general administration work.

## Special Thanks

I must again pay special thanks to Gayle for her on-going support over the past 12 months. She continues to take on any and all tasks without complaint and her network of contacts within the various lifesaving bureaucracies continues to be invaluable. I could not undertake the role of Executive Officer without her support.

Lysa Kiely has continued to provide invaluable support in the design and presentation of the club newsletter. Lysa's efforts contribute significantly to whatever success the newsletter may have.

My family also again deserve special thanks. As with past seasons, I have spent many hours after work and over the weekends in my "bunker" pounding away on the typewriter on range of club related tasks. I could not do the job without their support. Now that I have left work and can attend to matters during the day I can hopefully spend more time enjoying their company.

# treasurer's report



I am pleased to report a healthy surplus of \$49,823 for the 13 month period to 30 April 2016. This year we have reverted back to a later close off date to coincide with the end of the patrolling season and to include the financial costs associated with the Australian Surf Lifesaving titles in the season in which they occur.

This season has seen a solid increase in income to \$637,000 due in part to increases in the following areas:

- Member subscriptions – a moderate increase in fees for the first time in some years across all member categories saw an increased benefit of \$12,000.
- Fundraising – the triennial club golf day raised significant funds towards the purchase of a new ATV in the upcoming season. Judy and Steve Bennett should be congratulated for their efforts in organizing this event. The Barney Mullins swim was again successfully organized by Linda Wiadrowski and has resulted in the highest net proceeds since it's inception.
- Sponsorship has increased 20% on last year thanks to a generous increase by the Harbord Beach Hotel and Smyth Estate Agents. Also a big thank you must go to Bill Buckle Toyota for their \$10,000 support of the Australia Day carnival.
- Grants have tripled this year due to a significant contribution from the Mounties Group (Harbord Diggers Club) of \$25,000.
- The Boat section achieved a great result for the sale of one of their older surfboats for \$9,000. These proceeds will greatly assist towards the cost of a new boat in the coming season.

Although small in comparison to other income items I

would like to recognize the contribution, for the first time this year, from the Duke's Café and the gold coin donations raised from the Daily Telegraph newspapers donated by News Corp each week of \$1,677. It is new innovations like this that help sustain the Club's income.

Expenditure has also increased this season but some of this is due to the extended reporting period particularly in "Carnival Entries and Expenses" (\$10K).

This year for the first time, due to the materiality of the amount, we have included in the Financial Accounts the value of Clothing Stock on Hand (\$59,600). A provision for Stock writedown has also been included to cover the possibility that some stock may not realise it's cost value. This change in policy also requires that the comparatives for last year's Accounts be adjusted to comply with Australian Accounting standards.

To all our sponsors and donors identified individually in Notes 3, 4 and 5 of the Financial Report both financial and 'In Kind' we truly appreciate your support.

Once again there are a number of Club members who deserve special recognition for their contributions in undertaking roles to support the Treasury function namely:

**Kay Cowley** – for her time in attending to the many time consuming tasks of cash handling etc as well as contributing to the catering of our important Club events during the year.

**Gayle Taylor** – for attending to all the cash that comes across her desk throughout the year from members.

The Club remains in a strong financial position with \$485,000 in cash and total net assets of \$746,000 This provides assurance and recognition of a strong and healthy club.

## Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of NSW and the Charitable Fundraising Act & Legislation. The committee has determined the club is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AASB 1031 Materiality
- AASB 110 Events after the Balance Date

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based upon historical costs and does not take into account changing money values.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

### (a) Fixed Assets

Improvements made to the club house, equipment and the building costs for the Heritage Centre are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount's of all fixed assets are depreciated over their useful life to the club commencing from the time the assets are held ready for use.

### (b) Inventories

During the year the Club's policy on accounting for Inventory and Clothing Purchases changed. In past years clothing purchases were expensed in the year in which they were incurred. As the value of year end stock increased materially between 2015 and 2016 the Committee deemed it appropriate to take in to account the closing Stock on Hand at the end of the financial year. Comparative figures have been changed to reflect this change in accounting policy. Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or

## Note 2 - Prior Year Adjustments

The 2015 Net profit of \$1,819 has been adjusted to a Net loss of \$10,999 due to the following:

#### a) Clothing Purchases

A significant clothing purchase of \$10,123 incurred in the 2015 year but not paid and brought to account until the 2016 year has now been adjusted and reflected back into the correct period. This has impacted the Profit/(loss) for the 2015 year.

- b) Complying with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Corporations Regulations 2001.

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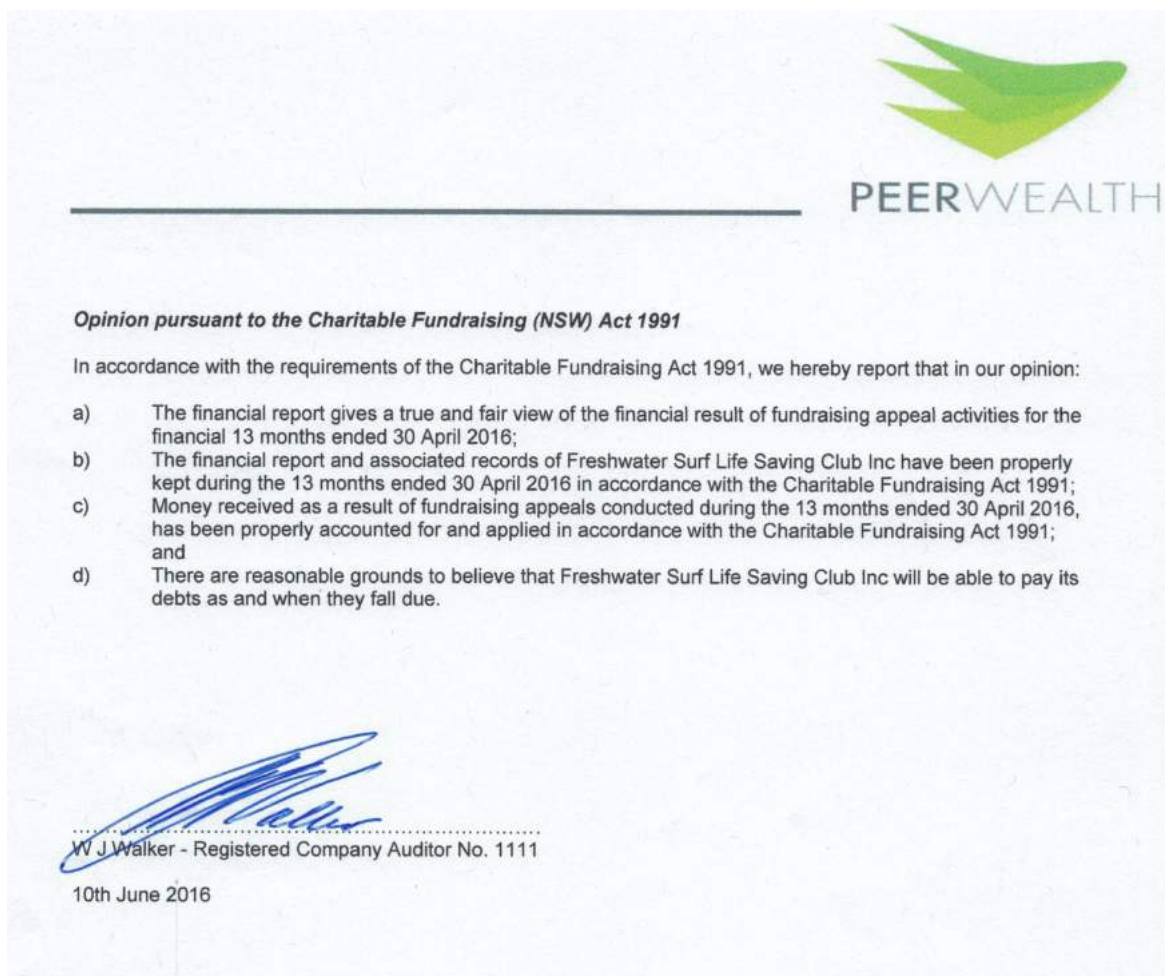

Gayle undertakes hours of SurfGuard administrative tasks and FreshNet data entry each week, allowing me to continue as Club Captain while also working a full time job. I sincerely thank Gayle for her assistance and friendship this season.

### **Patrols**

Patrols were again kept busy this season with overall beach attendance reported at in excess of 287,000 people. While anecdotally the beach feels busier every year, the data shows beach attendance down almost 70,000 from the 2014/15 season. The likely cause of this is an under-reporting of attendance figures, as this data is extracted from SurfGuard Patrol Logs. Many logs had no attendance data recorded.

Combined, our members volunteered an incredible 10,082 patrol hours this season. To place that in perspective, that's in excess of 420 days of combined patrolling hours. This constant diligence ensued that we maintained our proud record of No Lives Lost between the flags at Freshwater.

The 2015/16 Season saw our members undertake 211 rescues, with 131 of these rescues utilising a rescue tube or rescue board. We performed 20 IRB assisted rescues and 48 rescues were untaken without equipment. This season saw Sydney Northern Beaches Support Ski 3 continue to be housed at Freshwater and the RWC assisted with 3 recorded rescues at Freshwater this season.

While on patrol we attended to 223 first aid incidents, almost one hundred more than the 2014/15 season. We happily reunited 37 lost children with their parents and performed 2 spinal management rescues during patrol hours.

Thanks must go to our Patrol Captains who are always first on the beach and last off the beach on any given patrolling day. This season saw Michael Wright, James Crittenden, Kelly Dobrow and Clare Freakley step up to the challenge and become Patrol Captains, with Greg Gardener also returning to his role as a Patrol Captain after a short break. Thanks also to our returning Patrol Captains Belinda Dobson, Sam Thompson, Christophe Capel, John Boakes, Brian Whealing, Tim Kirkby, Paul Lemlin, Brendan Quail, Ben Hildyard, Dierk Hartmann and Alexius Chan. I also wish to thank John Carraro, Laith Farouqi and Helen Cameron who stepped aside this season to allow a new generation of patrol captains to develop their skills. I thank these members for their support, guidance and professionalism in their role as Patrol Captains this season.

The Patrol Audits form part of the SLS SNB quality assurance program for patrols and assess Freshwater's adherence to the lifesaving standard operating procedures as well as the patrols' competency in resuscitation and rescue readiness. Our patrols performed admirably on each occasion, scoring well and places us in good stead against the other clubs within the branch internal patrol audit competition. Congratulations to Patrol 13, led by Kelly Dobrow, who scored a perfect 350/350. Well done!

## Education

The 2015/16 Season saw John Goldrick take over the demanding role of Chief Instructor. John and his Education Team started the season with the challenging task of Proficiencies. John's revised process saw hundreds of current patrolling members refresh their skills in resuscitation, first aid, radios & signals and rescues, allowing them to patrol for the 2015/16 Season.

John and the education team have also trained 64 new Bronze Medallion members and 31 new Surf Rescue Certificate members who have enthusiastically joined our patrol teams this season.

This season we have also continued to champion higher awards at Freshwater, with many members completing advanced resuscitation, first aid, Powercraft and Silver & Gold Medallion awards. I encourage all members to aim to achieve one of these next season.

## Equipment

This season marked the final year of a 3 year phase in of

the new Surf Rescue Uniform. This season, all new patrolling members received the new uniform and given supply constraints, all current patrolling members are on track to exchange for the new uniform by the start of the 2016/17 season. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Harbord Diggers who this year came on as a Uniform Sponsor for our patrol uniforms. Harbord Diggers' generous contribution allowed us to continue to purchase the new patrol uniforms for our members and their logo is proudly printed on the back of our patrol shirts.



This season has also seen Freshwater SLSC be in the position to purchase an array of new lifesaving equipment thanks to the generosity of our sponsors and through State and Federal grants.

The Federal Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF) Grant again this year allowed us to purchase and maintain our array of lifesaving equipment including rescue boards and tubes. Through a State funded grant we were able to purchase an IRB motor. This vital piece of lifesaving equipment will allow us to maintain our fleet of IRBs in working order and so allow us to always be rescue ready.

The 2015/16 Season also saw Freshwater transition to a new patrol tent arrangement. We now have two 3mx3m pop up patrol tents which can be easily transported on and off the beach, erected with fewer members and afford greater resistance to damage.

The 2015/16 Season was also the last for our Blue Rhino ATV which due to the challenging operating conditions we work in, has started to show it's age. A working party was formed during the season to investigate and purchase a new ATV for the 2016/17 season and I look forward to reporting the outcome in next season's annual report.

## Meritorious Rescues

*Looking back at the 2015/16 Season -*

### Freshwater SLSC Meritorious Award for Lifesaving or Bravery 2015/16

#### Incident at Freshwater Beach 14th June 2015

On the morning of Sunday 14th June 2015, shortly after our annual working bee had finished, our emergency call out team was activated via 13 SURF (NSWSLS State Operations Centre) for reports of a person fallen off the cliff on the Southern Headland at Freshwater. Club members who were still at the club, assisted by the on call Sydney Northern Beaches duty officer and members of our emergency call out team, scaled the rocks with our first aid and rescue equipment to find a young man who had fallen from the top of the cliff. NSW Ambulance Paramedics, NSW Police, the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter and NSW Ambulance helicopter medical retrieval doctors attended the scene but we were unfortunately unable to resuscitate the young man. Our condolences go to the deceased's family and friends after this tragic accident. A memorial paddle out for him was held at Freshwater in the week following.

My thanks and praise go to our members who assisted in this incident. Thanks also to Trish from the Sydney Northern Beaches Trauma Incident peer Support Team (TIPS) who came to support our members during this time.

#### Freshwater SLSC Rescue of the Month

##### December 2015: Paul Lemlin

On Monday 28 December 2015, Paul Lemlin performed an after-hours rescue of a swimmer caught in a rip in large swell in the southern corner of Freshwater Beach. Shortly after 6pm, after the patrol had packed up, Sean Mcbean (Council Lifeguard) noticed a swimmer in difficulty making no progress against the rip. Paul immediately grabbed a rescue board and ran down to the southern corner, utilising the southern rip to paddle out through heavy surf to reach the patient. The young lady, a British tourist, was distressed and screaming for help. Paul returned the patient to shore on the rescue board and with Sean, administered first aid and oxygen therapy before an Ambulance arrived.

Well done to Paul & Sean who certainly prevented a drowning tragedy that night.

##### January 2016: Harry Mainsbridge - Patrol 13

On Australia Day, while patrolling the southern end, Harry Mainsbridge and Kate Wheatley noticed a board rider in difficulty being washed up onto the rocks at the southern end of Freshwater Beach. Harry, without concern for his own welfare, entered the water and swam out through the southern rip to access the surfer

who at this stage, had been washed up onto the rocks. Harry swam up onto the rocks and provided immediate first aid treatment to the injured surfer, using his patrol quartered cap to stop the bleeding from deep lacerations to the patients arms.

Kelly Dobrow the Patrol Captain then took control of the incident, supporting Harry with more patrol members who entered the water on rescue boards and walked around the rocks with resuscitation and first aid equipment. The patient was treated for severe lacerations and a suspected wrist injury and was then walked back along the rocks and treated by NSW Ambulance Paramedics before being transported to hospital.

Well done to Harry and Patrol 13 for this well coordinated rescue.

Over winter we will be running additional courses to get more people qualified or updated before the start of the new season.

## IRB Crew

Assessment by Council was stalled over the plan to relocate the public toilets out of the club building but a meeting with the Mayor and other Council officers in Feb 2016 resolved the issue sufficiently to allow the planning to continue.

Further meetings with senior Council Planning staff unlocked the remaining obstacles and a formal Pre DA meeting took place with Council in April 2016. With formal feedback from Council being positive, an action plan has been established to take the project to the next phase of preparing the DA plans suitable for lodgement with

Council. This next phase requires significant financial investment and so a call to members will follow shortly to engage with anyone holding skills capable of helping with the DA package preparation. It is desirable to lodge a DA within the next 3 months.

Well another season has flown by not long after it seemed to start. The youth within our great club continue to contribute in all areas of club life and in many respects are setting the pace for other club members to follow.

## Education

## Sports

## Life Saving

This season Grace Kiely won the Branch Junior Life-saver of the Year title, meaning that Freshwater has won the female category of this award twice in the last three years and three times in last 5 years. Grace unfortunately was unavailable to continue onto the State titles, however her SNB replacement from Narrabeen Beach went on to win the State title.

Season 2015/16 was a special year whereby the Freshwater nippers section celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Thus it was with pleasure that in this anniversary year we revived our Junior March Past team, whereby they proudly represented the club at the SNB Branch Championships.

Freshwater Nippers continues to manage a large volume of nippers; 750 in total this season. The JAC, the junior coaching staff and respective age structures, delivered a successful season whilst meeting SLISA certification and regulations.



One of our primary challenges in a club of our size is providing effective communication across all families. This season we entered the Team App platform, after a full investigation on how best to disperse information to all families. This was accepted and became effective, once senders worked out the best way to push information and once receivers worked out how best to receive their information (via email or Team App notice). In total we now have 620 members who also gain easy access to the Freshwater shop for club and beach products.

With respect to the shop it was very successful for the clothing and uniform in particular and is highly valued and appreciated. Plenty of preparation work was undertaken by Tania McLean and Karen Blakeney in processing our best choice in terms of value proposition and the look and wear. The outcome of new swim wear, all weather jackets, spray jackets more than met expectations. In addition we stocked essential items such as goggles and sun protection cream. ## Nippers Coaching Report

There were some very challenging sessions on the beach throughout the year and it was great to see so many kids taking the surf head on and coming out of the session feeling stronger and more confident – after all this is all training to become lifesavers and at the end of the season we had under 9s capable of getting out through the surf and rescuing people should the need arise! And what the older kids were doing in the surf was Professional Ironman stuff.

Water events were hard to get through at most SNB carnivals due to the size of the swell with Queenscliff cancelled altogether for the younger age groups and limited to only a few events for the older age groups.

The Nipper Nats saw some superhero efforts from a lot of kids facing solid 4ft waves at the southern corner and it was even bigger for the 13s and 14s in the middle of the beach. Branch Titles saw a bluebottle invasion like we have never seen before but we still managed to get some very good results across all age groups.

State was held at Lake Umina and it was a weekend for the pool swimmers. Unfortunately for us, our sessions were held in 3ft surf almost every session which meant we were just a little bit off the pace on the way back in. Next year we will be doing more Manly Dam sessions until the end of the season to ensure we are ready for all conditions.

Whilst the point score will show that we were not very successful at State this year, it does not show that we had plenty of people in finals - unfortunately we could not turn that into points. I know we will be better next year after some of the conversations I had with some of the kids at the conclusion of the season. They are hungry for more and I can't wait to get started again for next season and they feel the same way.

I believe the project we are working on at Freshwater in terms of training will continue to improve and we will be seeing the fruits of our labour in the coming season. We are already working on next season's calendar to ensure we upskill every nipper at Freshwater. We will continue to have fun and with that, we will find even more success in 2016/17 and years to come.

It is not a sport that is limited to age groups and specialists, but rather is an activity that you can participate in for your entire life.

At Freshwater we try to allow anyone who participates to achieve their potential and meet their goals. We may not be the largest team at carnivals, and we certainly don't win the overall pointscore at major championships, but we can be proud that we have representation across all facets of the sport and contribute to surf sports at all levels. We have current champions and are producing future champions. We have a happy and successful team that walks onto any beach ready to race and compete at the highest level. We run some of the most successful surf carnivals and events on the annual calendar with competitors coming from all over the country to attend. We are the envy of many clubs throughout the country.

At Freshwater we offer participation in every aspect of sport offered by SLISA, with some activities more popular than others. The season of 2015/16 saw participation in the following areas: Boats, March Past, R&R, Beach, Life Saving Competition, Surf Board Riding, and Craft and Swimming events. We had no participation in IRB racing this season.

The Panel we formed a few years ago to represent each section of SLISA sport continued this season and was referred to as the Freshwater SLSC Sport Panel. The Sport Panel has proved to be very successful in bringing together all the various disciplines of surf lifesaving sport into one united group. It has ensured respect between each of the groups and a much closer relationship between each. The Panel met on a regular basis this season and discussed matters affecting members across all sections. The representative of each section was called their Captain.

To be on Freshwater Beach on any Saturday morning through summer was a sight to see. Every discipline noted above would train, side by side, preparing for their competition. Marchers, R&R competitors, board and ski paddlers, swimmers, boat rowers, sprinters, all showing off their skills to the public of Freshwater. We introduced an initiative of a regular BBQ to try to bring the groups even closer together and the result was very pleasing.

The competitors who represented Freshwater throughout the season did their club proud. The club attended local carnivals, some regional carnivals and the Branch, State, and Australian Championships. Results from all carnivals and championship events are included at the rear of this annual report.

The structure of surf sports remained consistent with previous years with the general structure comprising: Support Services, Surf Sports Sections, and Event Management.

## Support Services

Michael steps down this year, but the support Freshwater has been given through Michael's involvement has been invaluable over the years.

## Australia Day Open Carnival

Our Australia Day carnival continues to build and is on its way to returning to its former glory as one of Australia's premier club carnivals. At the height of its popularity, the carnival used to be held on the Australia Day long weekend, but its success started to dwindle when the Australia Day holiday was changed to follow 26<sup>th</sup> January every year. Each following year as the 26<sup>th</sup> day, and our carnival, moved to mid week (Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday), our entry numbers dwindled and the regular Saturday Manly carnival started to gain momentum. 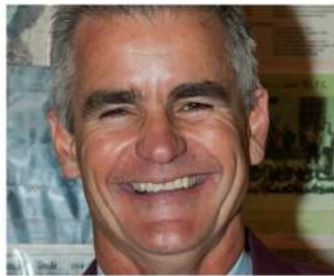
