EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR CLUB CAPTAIN

As many of you are aware this season will be my last season as Club Captain and we are looking for expressions of interest to take on the role of Director of Lifesaving for the 2019/2020 season. Whilst ideal to have a handover for the last couple of months of the patrol season it is something that can be arranged in the off season in preparation for the new season. Just a

quick background on the time related to this role includes approximately 2-3 hours x 3 days a week in addition to the time required on the weekends that vary. Keep in mind this is during the on-season, whilst the hours required in the off-season can be spread out over a couple months and have less urgent deadlines required. The brief summary of what the role involves is as follows:

- Responsible for the conduct and control all patrols and the Club's compliance with any life saving agreements that may be in force from time to time
- Play an active role in the overall management of the Club as a member of the Executive Committee.
- Schedule patrols and roster patrol duties prior to the commencement of each season so as to ensure the Club meets any requirements of Branch, State or National levels of SLSA
- Preparation and submission of the annual budget for the Club's lifesaving activities to the Executive Committee prior to the commencement of the season
- Overall responsibility for ensuring all operational lifesaving equipment is well maintained and ready for use at all times
- Work in consultation with the Chief Instructor/Director Education to ensure that all patrolling members are proficient each year
- In conjunction with the Director Youth Development, development and

- coordination of programs for U13 to U19 members to facilitate an increasing role and responsibility in patrol activities.
- In conjunction with the Chief Instructor & Director Youth Development and relevant school personnel, development and coordination of programs relating to Riverview students and their integration into lifesaving and competition activities within the club
- Maintain a record of members' performances while on patrol, including communication with members who miss patrols to ensure they comply with any obligations arising under Club rules.
- Other duties and responsibilities as provided for in the Club Constitution and any By- Laws

COMPETITION NEWS

The Branch and State Championships have now been run and won and the Australian Youth, Masters' & Opens events loom large on the horizon.

The Junior Branch Championships concluded with the water events on 10 February and the club was able to add another gold & silver, 5 bronze and sway of top 10 finishes to the impressive results achieved by the land competitors. The club finished in 4th place behind North Curl Curl, Manly & Newport. Among a host of outstanding performances, Joshua Gedz (3 gold and 1 bronze), Leela Scott (3 gold and 1 bronze) Kayvon Scott (3 gold) & Mila McGettigan (2 gold and 2 silver) were particularly successful.

The **Open Branch** saw the club finish in **3rd place** behind the powerful Newport and Manly clubs. It was great to see medals one across a broad spectrum of events on land and in the water with 8 gold, 6 silver and 11 bronze medals being won by the Board, Ski & Swim, Lifesaving, Beach, March Past and R&R sections. Particularly pleasing were the number of U15 & U17 competitors who featured not only amongst the medals but in the top 6. Mila McGettigan managed to take out the beach sprint/flags double in the UI5 event to add to her 2 gold and 2 silvers from the lunior Branch while Zac George, Carl Sorensen, Tamsyn Curly & Lauren Bourgeois seemed to pop up everywhere amongst the results.

Taking into account the results from all three Branch competitions, the club finished in 3rd place overall, again behind the Newport and Manly juggernauts.

The **State Championships** at Swansea proved to be a happy hunting ground for the club. There was plenty of cheering at the State Age event with many Freshie teams and individual competitors making finals. State Age provides tough competition and to make a final is an outstanding achievement for any competitor so there are many of our kids who can be mightily proud of their efforts.

There were some who not only made finals but finished with medals or in the top 6 which is a fantastic effort. Joshua Gedz led the way with gold in the U14 sprint, another as a member of the All Age Beach Relay and a silver as a member of the U14 mixed beach relay. The land competitors again led the way with all but one of those finishing in the top 6 being involved in beach events - testament to the hard work and dedication put in over the season by land coach Michelle Nunura. The lone water based top 6 finish went to Jaslyn Plummer who finished 2nd in the UIO female surf.





The final results saw the club finished in **16th place** and was the 4th best performing club from the Northern Beaches.

Next up was that hardy band of old timers who make up the club's contingent. Again a small group made their way north for this year's event and as in years past, they proved good things do come in small packages. Unfortunately no female competitors were able to get there this year. Under the watchful eye of Masters captain Stephen Bennett, the squad came home in 18th place and secured a swag of top 6 places which included 4

gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze. Leading the way in the medal count was John de Mestre with 2 gold and a silver while Captain Stephen and Michael Kirkby each managed 2 Masters'



Amongst many highlights over the two days of competition, the win by Stephen Bennett and

Steve Davis in the pensioner's double ski race was a thrilling experience to watch. Fifty metres behind in second place and relying heavily on their patented clockwork clown paddling style, the duo hitched a ride on a runner half way back to the beach and managed to haul in the runaway leaders right on the line.

The final results saw the club finish on 71 points and 18th place.

Completing the championships was the Open event which also included the lifesaving competition. As with the Branch championships, the club had finalists and medal winners across a broad spectrum of events on land and in the water. The final day of competition saw a number of our Board, Ski & Swims squad contesting finals and competing against some of Australia's finest surf athletes. Along the way, Joshua Kite claimed the bronze medal in the U17 surf race, Tamsyn Curley 4th in the U17 belt, Natalie Jander 5th in the Open Female belt & Lauren Bourgeios 6th in the UI5 board. On the land, Mila McGettigan came 6th in the UI5 flags and the club's march past team managed a highly credible 5th place.

As has been the case over the past few years, the Lifesaving and R&R sections proved to be the major points winners for the club. Both confirmed their reputations as leaders in their respective areas. In Lifesaving team events, the squad won the Open Patrol Competition

& Open First Aid (4th year in a row) while Andi Malm won the U19 Champion Lifesaver event. In the R&R section, the Open 6 person team (6th year in a row), the Men's 5 (3rd year in a row) & the Open Mixed 5 all won gold medals.

Even though it didn't involve any medals or even making a final, one of the best stories to come out of the championships was the performance of the UI9 boat crew made up of Gemma

Wickham, Cheyenne Hayes, Kandy Lee & Caitlin Doyle.

The girls are in their first year of rowing and sent to the carnival more for the experience than as serious contenders. However under the guidance of sweep Dave Maguire they defied the odds and made it through to the semi finals on the Sunday. While their good form continued in the semi, they were unlucky to be beaten into fourth place and missed out on qualifying for the final by one spot.

With the boat section having a dry run of late at championships as they go through a re-building program, the efforts of the girls served as great example to our other young crews about what can be achieved with

some hard work and dedication.

The final results saw the club finish in 11th place on 62 points.







PROMINENT SERVICE (Max 5)

To recognise members who have provided prominent service to the club during the course of the season in any club related activities.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE (Max 2)

To recognise members who have provided both sustained and conspicuous service to the club at any time during their membership of the club. The award will be presented to any member (not including Life Members) who has served the club at the requisite level in various aspects of club related activities which includes but is not limited to lifesaving, training, competition, administration, coaching, duties as an official, performing any role within the club and participation in club events and social activities.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The following matters will be taken into account –

- The person has been involved in competition as a competitor
- The degree to which the person has assisted the club in training activities, club functions, Australia Day carnival, Masters Carnival, Bennett Iron Man, Barney Mullins Swim, patrol and lifesaving functions, training and assessment and other approved Club activities
- Whether the person had fulfilled his her Club patrol obligations
- Any other matters the Executive Committee considers relevant.

YOUNG CLUB PERSON OF THE YEAR

Given to the person (or persons) in the U23 or younger age groups recognising significant involvement during the course of the season in multiple aspects of club related activities including the level of support provided to other members. Club related activities includes but is not limited to lifesaving, training, competition, administration, coaching, duties as an official, performing any role within the club and participation in club events and social activities.

CLUB PERSON OF THE YEAR

Given to the person (or persons) in any age group older than U23s recognising significant involvement during the course of the season in multiple aspects of club related activities including the level of support provided to other members. Club related activities includes but is not limited to lifesaving, training, competition, administration, coaching, duties as an official, performing any role within the club and participation in club events and social activities.

CLUB HONOUR BLAZER

The major annual club award awarded to a person who the Executive Committee determines has made the most outstanding contribution to the club during the season. The matters are taken into account when determining the recipient

- The person's contribution to club related activities which includes but is not limited to lifesaving, training, competition, administration, coaching, duties as an official, performing any role within the club and participation in club events and social activities.
- Whether the person has represented the club at meetings or on committees involving Sydney Northern Beaches SLS, NSW SLS, SLSA or any other external bodies,
- Any other matters the Executive Committee considers relevant


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
