

The men also featured in a number of top 6 finishes with **Ben Kirkby** combining with **Deandra Godoy** for a 4<sup>th</sup> in the mixed double ski and **Tim Kirkby, Nick Doyle, Zac George, Ben Blakeney, Ben Kirkby & Alex Maim** combining to finishing a highly credible 5<sup>th</sup> in the ultra competitive Open Taplin.

Following on the heels of the long weekend carnivals, the **Branch Championships** commenced the next weekend with the **Masters** events the first cab off the rank. And what a start! Under the inspiring leadership of new Masters' Captain **Stephen "Old for Gold" Bennett**, our ancient mariners won no less than 37 medals across a variety of events – the club's best Branch Masters' results in at least a decade. With so many medals won it is difficult to single out individuals but special mention must go to **Sammy Wood** who in first year of competition came home with 4 gold, 3 silver





& 3 bronze medals in both water and land based events. In the men, **Michael "Killer" Kirkby** won 4 gold & 2 silver, Sigi Hill 4 gold and "Old for Gold" won 3 gold and silver.

Next up was the **Junior Branch** beach events and in what is hopefully a sign of things to come, the Freshie contingent led the way. The young maroon and whites won every relay event they entered and a sway of competitors came away with individual gold, silver and bronze as well as bag full of top 6 finishes. The club managed to win a total of 14 gold, 5 silver & 9 bronze medals and ultimately finished the carnival in first place on the point score, 37 points ahead of the powerful Manly club. Again **Michelle Nunura** must take a lot of the credit for all the work she has put in with relay training and general beach sprint and flag work over the season.

# **PROMINENT SERVICE (Max 5)**

To recognise members who have provided prominent service to the club during the course of the season in any club related activities.

## **DISTINGUISHED SERVICE (Max 2)**

To recognise members who have provided both sustained and conspicuous service to the club at any time during their membership of the club. At this early stage of the season we are interested in finding people interested in competing across the full spectrum of surf sports competition.


