

PRESIDENT

What a season we've had with all sections of the club exceeding their efforts of previous years. However, the most pleasing aspect of the 2018/19 season is that I can report once again there has been no lives lost by anyone swimming between the flags during patrolled hours.

Official figures show 50% of SNB clubs have reported a drop in their membership numbers this season and we are one of those. Our total membership has dropped from 1767 last season to 1732 this year, representing a decrease of some 2% and is our lowest membership total since the 2009/10 season. Based on the latest membership figures provided by NSW (May 2019), the club now has the 2nd largest overall membership in the Branch, the largest nipper contingent and the 5th highest number of patrolling members.

The most important component of our club is and has always been, our patrolling members and the 2018/19 season saw us put 345 patrolling members on the beach to ensure the safety and wellbeing of approximately 350,000 visitors. How successful we were can easily be seen by comparing official figures with last year. Our total recorded number of rescues is down from 112 to 38 which clearly demonstrates the effectiveness of our patrol teams. The details of the rescues, first aid incidents and other results can be found in our Director of Lifesaving's report. After 2 years of service to this role, Dee will not be standing again this year and we thank her for her contribution.

Wayne Freakley has again continued in his role as our Executive Officer. This season has seen the finalisation of the new club website and upgrading of office hardware and the implementation of a new independent award panel to review and make recommendations for annual club service awards. There was also the ongoing implementation of the new child protection procedures being rolled out by NSW, collation of records relating to all medals won by members at Australian titles since 1919 and the on-going collation of club records for subsequent display on the television screen which has recently been installed in the foyer area. A more detailed outline of Wayne's achievements is to be found in the Executive Officer's report.

Our Treasurer, Chris Tyrrell has worked in conjunction with Wayne to overhaul the club's financial policies and procedures. This new policy is designed to assist each Executive Committee member in understanding their financial responsibilities, authority and procedures associated with expenditure. Chris has also worked with the proprietors in the Kiosk to ensure a mutually prosperous relationship and has implemented various amendments to the Memorandum of Understanding with the kiosk operators. Chris has also spent time with and assisted each EC member with budgeting and the overall understanding of the club's financial position and reports.



Sadly, our Director of Member Services, Claire de Paoli, is leaving this role after 3 busy, but fun filled years and we're very grateful for her contribution over this time. Claire has completely reorganised our club's merchandise as well as organising many varied events including Freshies on Fridays, through to the Life Member's lunches and other club related events.

We had a focus this year on Youth Development and Clare Freakley and Tom Duffy were elected as Joint Directors of this portfolio. From the outset, they decided to make the portfolio as broad as possible, so they expanded "youth" to include U14s to U23s. Some highlights include a youth party featuring a performance from a local band made up of our own youth club members; an RSA course was run and in return, assistance with service at club functions was provided. They Introduced "female only" strengthening sessions for youth members, run by Sammy Wood and overall, there was amazing participation from our youth members in all domains, including surf sports, education and lifesaving -

- 30 members U15-U17 achieved their bronze medallions
- Mila McGettigan won SNB Junior Lifesaver of the Year (Freshwater has won 5 of the last 6 years in the female category)
- For the first time in many years the club had competitors in every area of competition thanks to our youth members making a resurgence in beach and board riding.
- Various youth acting as coaches in BSS, First aid and beach.

Under the leadership of Jacqueline Phillips, our Education team were responsible for our members attaining 200 varied awards, earning 59 Bronze Medallions and completing over 535 Proficiencies. The team also participated in community CPR training in collaboration with Freshwater Community Bank Bendigo Branch and thanks goes to Emily Lemlin, Kelly Dobrow and Deandra Godoy for volunteering their time to do this.

Mary-Louise Parkinson is our most recent addition to the EC, tackling the very difficult portfolio of Sponsorship & Marketing. It would be remiss of me not to commend Mary-Louise on an outstanding job over the season which saw us not only retain all our existing sponsors, but significantly, add to their number. Her attention to detail and persistence resulted in a new major sponsor – Healthy Care (Nature's Care) and their sponsorship of \$25,000, plus a further contribution of \$7,500 for the Australia Day carnival has allowed us to purchase much needed rescue equipment. She has just returned from her 2 month European adventure and we're all excited to hear of her plans and ideas for next season.

Our Facilities Director, Phil Fagan, has ensured that the focus for the past season has been on maintenance and equipment fixes. These include replacement of the storm damaged ceiling under the front balcony and replacement of the taps in the male showers. Special thanks to Dave Torevell and Wayne Freakley who are painting and repairing the ceilings and columns in the board storage area. Our caretakers George and Michelle Vella, finished their tenure towards the end of June and we thank them for the high standards they have maintained over the past 3 years. We wish them well in their future endeavours and welcome our new caretakers, Josh and Madison Mitchell.

Our Sports Director, Kev Crow had a difficult year, suffering from ill health and family commitments which prevented him from being as involved as he had wanted, but his plans for next season are well underway. Despite this, we had some outstanding results from the various carnivals held throughout the season, culminating in the National titles held at Broadbeach on the Gold Coast in April. Gold medals were won by John de Mestre, Mike Kirkby, Sigi Hill, Andrew de Vries, Tahlia Dearden, Julia Baker, Ian Donald, Chris Tyrrell, Jarrad Freakley, Clare Freakley, Hugo Weston, Seb di Sano, Pat Kiely, Alan Burns, Jane Freakley, Libby Murphy, Lysa Kiely and Bec Kiely. For further details of placings in all carnivals, please refer to the back of this Report.

Our new JAC Chairman, Paul McGettigan proved he was well up to the task and led this section of our club with distinction. Some highlights include:-

- 700 Nippers enrolled for the season.
- 25 U14's completed their SRC and advanced into patrols
- 11 Nippers selected in the Branch High Performance Squads.
- 5 Nippers selected for the SNB Interbranch Team and helped SNB win Interbranch at the annual Surf Life Saving Representative carnival.
- 8 Nipper parents completed their bronze medallion.
- Freshwater won the Branch land carnival.
- Freshwater won the All Age Sprint Relay at State.
- Freshwater finished 16th at State
- Josh Gedz was selected from the U14's to represent NSW at the Surf Life Saving Australia – Interstate Championships.
- Mila McGettigan was selected as Branch Female Junior Lifesaver of the Year.

We are very fortunate to have the financial support of all our sponsors, both large and small, who have supported us again this year. Further details on these sponsors can be found in the report from the Director of Sponsorship and Marketing, but we must acknowledge our 4 major sponsors. We trust their support will continue for many years to come.

Thanks to all the members of the EC and various club members who have provided me with support during the season and I look forward to seeing you all on the beach for the 2019/20 season.

This has been another busy year for the provision of administrative support to the club and its members. Despite increasing work volumes the various obligations imposed by Branch, NSW Surf Lifesaving & SLSA were met as were a range of legislative reporting and compliance requirements.

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Membership

This year saw a revamp of the membership categories by SLSA with all pre-existing membership categories becoming subsets within one of 5 primary membership groups – Active, Associate, Junior, Honorary/Service & Community. While new SLSA Regulations indicated clubs could decide which category members could be assigned to, the SLSA Surfguard system automatically allocates members to one of the 5 major categories. The so-called flexibility available to clubs therefore remains a mystery while the validity of the changes remains in doubt.

While the club's constitution will eventually need to be amended to reflect the changes, that process awaits similar changes first occurring to the constitutions of both SLSA and NSWSLS.

Obtaining consistent membership data remains a challenge because of the vagaries of the Surfguard system. Differing membership totals are still arrived at depending on which reporting mechanism in Surfguard is used.

Based on the same reporting mechanism the club has relied on for the past 7 years, the total membership for this season has dropped from 1767 last season to 1732 this year. This represents a decrease of nearly 2% and is our lowest membership total since the 2009/10 season. The table below provides a breakdown of the traditional membership base for the 2018/19 season and as can be seen most categories have remained relatively stable.

Based on the latest membership figures provided by NSW (May 2019), the club now has the 2nd largest overall membership in the Branch, the largest nipper contingent and the 5th highest number of patrolling members. As can be seen from the following table, our membership numbers in key areas are well above the Branch average:

There were a number of other members who also reached long service milestones this season. However because the Surfguard system will not recognise long service awards until members attain certain ages, they were unable to be recognised this year.



Club Governance

A number of changes were again made to the make-up of the Executive Committee following last year's AGM. This resulted in Committee meetings having an added degree of complexity this season as new members came to terms with their portfolios and obligations as Directors of the Club. Meetings of the Executive Committee were generally held on the second Thursday of each month. As in past years a range of minor business was also conducted off line via email.

A total of 11 meetings were held and the attendance record of the committee members is outlined in the table opposite. Continued improvement in the conduct of the meetings meant the time taken to transact monthly business was generally less than in previous years. The average meeting time over the course of the year was 1hr 36mins.

Again this year, the attendance record for the monthly meetings was less than ideal. A number of members exceeded the number of absences which can trigger a

review of their position under the club's constitution. The absences highlight the ever increasing difficulties faced by volunteers who have to continually balance the needs of work and family with the legal and fiduciary obligations of being a member of the Executive Committee.

In order to improve transparency and consistency in the use of club funds and to ensure compliance with relevant financial obligations, a review of the club's financial procedures was commenced during the season. This is intended to be an on-going review which will examine a range of processes and procedures associated with the receipt, safekeeping, investment and expenditure of club funds. The first part of the process has seen the introduction of new financial expenditure procedures which deal with a range of issues including —

- Delegations to incur expenditure
- Expenditure approval procedures including the obtaining of quotes
- The approval of authorised providers of goods and services in lieu of seeking quotes each time goods are required or services needed
- Establishment of trade accounts and the authorisation of members to utilise the accounts
- Provisions for the on-going review of the procedures.

Membership Records

Work has continued throughout the season to bring membership records up to date in respect of —

- years of service
- official positions held both within the club and other lifesaving entities
- club awards and other forms of recognition
- competition results for championship and other special events

As has been previously noted, it is a time consuming task and it will take some years to complete.

Unfortunately in years past, maintaining clear and accurate membership records was not necessarily given a high priority. This has resulted in many information gaps in the areas of positions held, awards and recognition and competition results.

During the season, SLSA placed on-line a record of the medal winners at all Australian Championships dating back to the 1919/20 season. Work was undertaken during the year to capture that information and as a result, a list of all medal winners in both Open and Masters competition has been completed. Again, because of lack of information on both the SLSA website and in previous club annual reports, some information is missing. A list detailing the number of medals won by members over the past 100 years at Australian Championships is included at the end of the Annual Report. It is not necessarily 100% accurate but is close. If anyone believes the information relating to them is incorrect I encourage you to contact me so the record can be corrected.

Water Safety Policy and work health and safety

The club continues to utilise the simplified combined risk assessment form for all water based activities. While overall compliance with SLSA & legal requirements is generally good, there were a number of issues in the first part of the season. These were eventually remedied as the season progressed. The rule changes regarding use of the gym seem to be have taken on board by the members and compliance was high.

A number of members suffered minor injuries during the course of the season while involved in club related activities. This resulted in claims being lodged with ICare. All claims were accepted and the members reimbursed for any relevant medical expenses.

The area of work, health and safety as it applies to club operations remains an on-going concern and more work is needed in this area. All members need to be vigilant to ensure safety protocols are being followed. Noncompliance with SLSA procedures and WH&S legislation has potentially significant ramifications for both the club and individual members, particularly in relation to insurance cover.

Club Historical Records – formation date of club confirmed

Just prior to the annual report being sent to the printers, a substantial number of historical newspaper items relating to the club were discovered within the archives of the Australian National Library. One item is of particular importance as it at last confirms the club's formation date.

It has long been thought the club was formed in early December 1908. The actual date has however always proved elusive. The item, which appears in The Star Newspaper of Tuesday 1 December 1908, notes a meeting was held on Sunday 22 November 1908 in Undercliff Road for the purpose of forming the club. At the meeting a committee was formed, joining fees set and 100 members enrolled. A further meeting was held at a hotel in Manly the week after followed by a general meeting on the beach on the 29 November. Interestingly, the persons noted as the club's initial President and Secretary do not match our current official records.

General Administration

Administrative obligations continue to increase in number and complexity and the associated paperwork continued its growth. Each of the levels of surf life saving administration – Branch, State and SLSA – has specific requirements in relation to the provision of reports and information. There are also a range of government agencies which, in accordance with legislation, the club is obliged to either report to or maintain records – Department of Fair Trading, Department of Industry, Australian Charities and Not for Profit Commission, NSW Children's Guardian & ICare to name a few.

With Michal Brenchley now working one day a week, the full time staffing of the office has greatly assisted in dealing with the various administrative demands. Michal's engagement has also meant Gayle Taylor can spend more time on facilities hire related issues which remains a vital source of club revenue.

The Surfguard system continued to be used to send out routine and special notices to the general membership electronically. A physical mail out continues to be used for those members without email addresses. We have continued to push the on-line membership renewal process however problems still arise because some members do not follow the instructions properly.

Special Thanks

As always I have to pay special thanks to Gayle & Michal for their on-going support over the past 12 months. Between them, Gayle & Michal attend to the vast majority of administrative tasks associated with the operation of the club, including responsibility for functions and hall hire. Neither complains about any request made of them and they go about their roles with an ever present happy disposition. I could not undertake the role of Executive Officer without their support.

As always my wife Jane also deserves special thanks. She continues to accommodate the many hours I spend in "my office" pounding away on the typewriter and attending meetings on range of club related tasks. I could not do the job without her support.




The 2018/2019 surf life saving season was again an exciting year for the Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club.

During the financial year ended 30th April 2019 Wayne Freakley and I in conjunction with the Finance Committee, Steve Davis & Steve Bennett commenced work on a formal document known as the Financial Controls Manual. The Financial Controls Manual will be a is set of rules, guidelines, conditions and procedures associated with managing and controlling club funds. The document will provide present and future EC members with a guide as to their authority when considering expenditure, whom they can engage when appointing trades and if followed correctly will protect the individuals/ committee members against any undue scrutiny if questioned over any item of expenditure. The establishment of a document such as this is necessary to be as transparent as possible when controlling what are essentially members funds.

The 2018/2019 financial year was very much a "Business as usual" year. There was no significant expenditure on improving the club unlike the previous year as the committee agreed to have a year of consolidation in order to rebuild the general account that had been depleted over the past two seasons. I am happy to report that this strategy has been successful and the club is well geared financially for the next season.

It would be remiss of me to not mention the assistance provided to me by my wife Lisa Tyrrell. Lisa's skill set in relation to Bookkeeping and the Clubs online Accounting system is second to none. I'm not sure how to explain how much work she puts into the club and at all times does it with a smile recognising that we are a voluntary organisation and a great family club. I cannot thank her enough for her assistance.



Further thanks must be conveyed to Steve Bennett and again the former Treasurer, Steve Davis for forming the Finance Committee. Steve Bennett provides assistance in his professional capacity as an Accountant, donating his time to complete BAS returns and overseeing the end of year financial accounts. It is invaluable having this commitment and expertise at our disposal.

The Auditor, Ian Hillsdon has once again been a pleasure to work with. This is the second year we have been working with LNP Audit & Assurance and the team have delivered another quality Audit and at a price that has been discounted, recognising our value to the community. Thanks Ian for your hard work and delivering our figures in a timely fashion.

2018/2019 Financial Commentary

During the financial year ended 30th April 2019 the club experienced revenue of \$572,697 which is a reduction from the previous year of \$30,750 which could be attributed to a reduction in membership during this financial year, and a reduction in Grants awarded to the club.

After all expenses, the club traded at a small loss of (\$960) which is an improvement from the previous year where we posted a loss of (\$23,395). This 2018/2019 profit figure is adversely affected by the growing depreciation expense. During the last season the depreciation expense was \$57,224 and as this is not a cash expense and merely a reduction in asset values, the clubs actual profit is \$56,264 and is a solid result for the year.

Special recognition must be directed to our Sponsors, who have generously supported our 2018/2019 activities.

The Harbord Beach Hotel again contributed \$22,727 in sponsorship funds and this year we moved our "Freshies on Friday" (Friday Drinks) to the pub in appreciation for their long continuing support. The Harbord Beach Hotel has not only supplied general sponsorship which includes the Freshwater Masters Carnival, their generosity stems further into prizes for the Barney Mullins Ocean Swim and overall assistance with discounted supply of beverages for Freshy functions. Our long association with the pub continues to be very strong.

Healthy Care (Nature's Care) became a part of the Freshwater Family contributing a massive \$32,500 to our cause. Natures Care's presence at the Freshwater Australia Day carnival, the Barney Mullins Ocean Swim and other events was much appreciated and we look forward to a long & fruitful association with them. We thank you for your generous contribution.

The Freshwater Community Bank Branch Bendigo Bank has again been a wonderful support in all areas of the club. They contribute funds for general sponsorship, assist with events such as The Barney Mullins Ocean Swim and are valued by

our Executive Committee and the club in general. Without the support of the Freshwater Community Bank Branch Bendigo Bank, many events held by the club would not be as successful.

Once again, Freshwater held the annual Australia Day Carnival, Boat Carnival, Masters Carnival, the nipper Fast and Furious (Bennett Board Carnival). Combined revenue was \$32,418 and after all expenses a profit from these activities was realised totalling \$8,326.

The annual Barney Mullins Ocean Swim enjoyed its best performance ever with record numbers. Revenue for the day totalled \$19,052 and after all expenses, the club enjoyed a profit of \$12,629.

In summary, the club while experiencing a reduction in revenue, traded with improved profits due to the cost controls implemented by all EC members. Freshwater enjoys a healthy cash position with in excess of \$420,000 in combined Term Deposits and Working accounts. The club has no liabilities and is well placed for the next season. It has been a pleasure working with and enjoying the support of the Executive Committee this year. The committee was truly united in its activities during the 2018/2019 season.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2019

The financial report covers Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 April 2019 were providing surf life saving services.

The functional and presentation currency of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by those charged with governance on 3 June 2019.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associateed with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Membership fees

Annual fees for membership are recognised in the year that the revenue relates to.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class Depreciation rate

Buildings and improvements 5%-20%
Plant and Equipment 10%-33%
Heritage Centre 2.5%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(f) Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period the Association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where an indicator exists and regardless for indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss.

(g) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(h) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

(i) New Accounting Standards and Interpretations

The AASB has issued new and amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have mandatory application dates for future reporting periods. The Association has decided not to early adopt these Standards. The following table summarises those future requirements, and their impact on the Association where the standard is relevant:

Effective date for entity

Standard Name

AASB 16 Leases 1 May 2019

Requirements

AASB 16 will cause the majority of leases and deemed leases of an entity to be brought onto the statement of financial position. There are limited exceptions relating to short term leases and low value assets which may remain off balance sheet. The calculation of the lease liability will take into account appropriate discount rates, assumptions about lease term and increases in lease payments. A corresponding right to use asset will be recognised which will be amortised over the term of the lease. Rent expense will no longer be shown, the profit and loss impact of the leases will be through amortisation and interest charges.

Impact

Another patrolling season finished with our volunteers roving our beach for the last time on the 28th April 2019 for the 2018-19 season. Since our first weekend all our patrols have been on the beach through the worst and best of the weather handed to Freshwater, all to ensure the safety of all beach goers who join us in enjoying our gorgeous beach.

My first mention and biggest thank you goes out to all our patrolling members, new and old, who volunteered their time to their rostered, and substitute patrols and those extra volunteer patrols that made so much difference in the assistance of safe guarding our beach. With our clubs' number one priority to patrol our beach, without these individuals our club would not have been successful in upholding our proud record of "No Lives Lost Between the Flags".

My next mention goes to our IRB 'Brains Trust' Team consisting of John Lo Schiavo, David Price, James Coates, Luke Jarman and James Crittenden. A team that was implemented last season, our IRB team has been invaluable to our patrols this season assisting with the strategic arrangement to ensure that every patrol had a IRB driver and crewperson. The role ensured that our team was dedicated to ensuring every patrol could fulfil our lifesaving agreement with an operational IRB; running IRB proficiencies

and new IRB award courses to all our members; ensuring that major events Mullins had adequate powercraft support; as well as fulfilling our obligations to provide support at both State Championships and Australian Championships.

Patrols

The season of 2018-19 has been an incredibly busy season with an overall beach attendance of 341,946 - a beach attendance greater than the 2017-18 season by 54, 971 people!! The numbers were visible every weekend with the carparks overflowing, assorted nipper colours on the beach eager to start their Sunday morning activities and regular beach goers attending with their families.

As a collective, our combined patrol hours over the season amounted to 9,707.72! Though these numbers were down from last season's hours of 10, 129, they do not include the carnival water safety patrol hours, nor any hours our members may have volunteered at other clubs.

During these 9707.72 hours, our members conducted 38 rescues. Of these 27 utilised a rescue tube or board, 4 were IRB and 6 required no equipment. In addition, 1 rescue was



conducted and recorded by the SNB Support Ski 3 housed at Freshwater SLSC. This is a reduced number from previous seasons, attributable to the increased preventative actions by our patrolling members that totalled 7,220 - greater than the two previous seasons by almost 5,000 preventatives.

In addition to these rescues we attended to 120 first aid incidents, reunited 38 lost children (inclusive of the occasional lost parent) with their families, performed 2 spinal management rescues and attended to 4 incidents requiring an ambulance. Importantly we recorded zero lives lost on our beach.

Of course a special thanks must go to our Patrol Captains, who are also the first in attendance and last off the beach at any given patrol shift. The Captains were Nigel Thomas (Patrol 1), Luke Jarman (Patrol 2), Peter Block/Marc Gunning (Patrol 3), Mark Gilbert (Patrol 4), Ian Hills (Patrol 5), James Crittenden (Patrol 7), Paul Lemlin (Patrol 8), Tristan Godoy (Patrol 9), Michael Wright (Patrol 11), Greg Gardner (Patrol 12), Kelly Dobrow (Patrol 13), Ben Hildyard (Patrol 14), Dierk Hartmann (Patrol 15) and Alexius Chan (Patrol 16). This season we saw Brendan Quail step down from his role as Patrol Captain of Patrol 10, allowing for Kim Cook mentored by Sam Di Sano to step up and look after this patrol. All these members have been instrumental in my role this season and for which I continue to thank them for their ongoing patience, expertise and support as Patrol Captains.

Patrol Audits

Audits—Our patrols use this occasion to showcase their lifesaving skills and teamwork. Our Sydney Northern Beaches branch auditors approach in their unsuspecting blue shirts and clipboards at any occasion. As part of Surf Life Saving Sydney Northern Beaches (SLSSNB) Patrol Audit Program, Freshwater was audited 4 times throughout the season. These audits are to ensure that we as a patrolling club are upholding our lifesaving agreements with regards to our personnel, our operating standards and competency in resuscitation and rescue availability.

Education

At Freshwater, we have been incredibly fortunate to attract such consistent numbers of new members eager to join our patrol as new award holders. Without the tireless efforts of our education team, led by our new Chief Instructor Jacqueline Phillips, we would not have such a successful range of skills and expertise on our patrols. Jacqueline and her team have trained 59 new Bronze Medallion members and 34 new Surf Rescue Certificate members who have brought so much enthusiasm to begin their patrols it has constantly kept our patrols engaged. With John Goldrick's step down from the role of Chief Instructor at the conclusion of last season, and Jacqueline's smooth stepping into the role, I would like to thank Jacqueline for all her assistance in supporting me this season and commend her on her achievements obtained in her first season.

Equipment

This season Freshwater SLSC was able to purchase two new defibrillators, one to accompany our secondary first aid kit within the patrol room and another to be located on the external premises of the clubhouse to support our club for any emergency call outs throughout the off-season. We purchased these new items using the Beach Safety Equipment fund. Purchasing the additional defibrillator was to ensure our club along with the other SNB Surf Clubs, will be able to provide the emergency support even whilst our flags are down, not only for our members but for members of the public. We hope this will encourage and inspire the council to support our Northern Beaches Surf Clubs to follow suit.

This season also saw the continued push by SLSA to replace paper logs with the 'Patrol Ops App' in order to sign on and sign off, in addition to recording patrol statistics. This season we saw greater positive feedback than the previous season for the use of the 'Patrol Ops App'. Our patrol captains were able to use this app on their own smart phones in order to note hourly statistics.



Patrol 3

Another strong season for Patrol 3 as we welcomed a number of new bronzies and SRCs alike. We have a tremendous group of young (and older) members who continue to preserve our key callout of "No lives lost between the flags".

Our key highlight for the year was the late shift on the Australia Day Carnival weekend. Huge thanks to Rachel Needham (a new addition this year who has seamlessly jumped in as our star first aider) who cared for the gentlemen and waited with him until his partner was comfortable for him to return home.

We also acknowledge the key efforts of vice captain and all round good bloke, Marc "Bunpa' Gunning who finishes up this year after many years' service to both Freshwater & Northcliffe SLSC. Congratulations Marc!! We will miss your years of experience and wish you well in patrolling retirement and now sole focus on ski training

Patrol Person of the Year

David Price



42.5 rostered, 12.75 substitute, 63 volunteer, 16 water Safety = 133.25 hours

David currently holds his Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate (ARTC), First Aid Certificate, IRB Crew Certificate, Silver Medallion IRB Driver Certificate, Silver Medallion Beach Management Certificate, Training Officer Certificate, Rescue Water Craft Operator Certificate, Pain Management Certificate and Spinal Management Certificate.

David is currently the Vice Captain and IRB Driver of Patrol 14 and has always been more than happy to step in to fulfil the role of Patrol Captain when required. David has fulfilled all his patrol obligations above and beyond with 42.5 rostered, 12.75 substitute, 63 volunteer hours, 15 water safety hours totalling to 133.25. In my first season as Director of Education, the first and most important part of this report is to thank my mentors John Goldrick and Lindsay Davis – previous Directors of Education, for not only their support but the wonderful job they have done establishing a team of such dedicated and committed trainers for Freshwater SLSC. Without the FEAT team, Freshwater SLSC could not have such a highly qualified contingent of proficient patrolling members or successful competitive team. I would also like to make a special thank you to Belinda Dobson for all her help with everything to do with Surf Life Saving at the club, branch, state and national levels and to thank Gayle Taylor and Michal Brenchley whose administrative help while I was learning the ropes and ongoing support have made a big job much more manageable.

This year across the club we attained 200 awards and a summary of the awards achieved this year includes:

- 18 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques
- 59 Bronze Medallion
- 34 Surf Rescue Certificates
- 9 Spinal Management Awards
- 28 First Aid Awards
- 3 Silver Medallion IRB Driver
- 30 IRB Crew
- 4 Silver Medallion Beach Management
- 4 Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue
- 7 Silver Medallion Advanced First Aid
- 2 Rescue Water Craft Operator
- 1 Probationary Trainer
- 1 Training Officer IRB





Proficiencies is one of our biggest tasks and this year we ran 9 formal proficiencies (plus some special ones) for Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation Training and Surf Rescue Certificate for over 370 patrolling and competition members. As the season progressed the numbers of members increased for each date with the peak being 2 sessions where 65+ members were assessed in a day. A really big thank you to our delegates this year, those people who aren't formally qualified as trainers or assessors but put their hands up to help with proficiencies on the day. Your efforts are greatly appreciated and I hope you'll be back to help us again in the 2019-2020 season. Thank you to Alex Malm, Ben Chalmers, Deon Rowe, Gregg Slater, Ian Cradock, Lucas Phillips, Stephen Phillips, Marcel Bick, Mark Gilbert, Nathan Smith and Shanny Dyer.

Proficiencies were also undertaken for IRB Crew (61) and Drivers (25), Spinal Management (59), Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (6), Rescue Water Craft Operator (8). We also had 6 members undertake their Gold Medallion Proficiencies. As the pinnacle of the surf rescue awards, it is a challenging award, with the proficiency requiring candidates to undertake both a physical component and a complex rescue scenario with CPR and first aid skills required. Congratulations to Deandra Godoy, Ian Hills, Adam Phillips, Lucas Phillips, Matthew Chapman and Jason Gard.

Our ability to maintain such a high level of training for new members (SRC and BM), and ongoing attainment of higher awards (eg First Aid and ART) and qualifications for Freshwater members is only possible because of the commitment and time generously volunteered by our trainers, some of whom also further contribute their time and skills as assessors and course facilitators.

To be a trainer for SLS there is a intensive training course and this year we had Andrea Malm endorsed as a probationary trainer, Rachel Needham has joined us to help with training and James Crittenden was endorsed as a Training Officer for IRB. We are also very privileged to have Ben Chalmers, Kelly Dobrow, Wal Dobrow, Jonathan Farrell, David Torevell and Cheryl White who achieved their update in Certificate IV in Training and assessing this year as part of our team. And a special congratulations also to Lindsay Davis who is now also the Deputy Director of Education for Sydney Northern Beaches branch.



At the June 2018 Annual General Meeting, we were thrilled to be appointed to the newly restored role of Youth Development Officers. This is a role that we have both informally been assisting with for a few years now. The Freshwater SLSC Executive Committee, identifying and acknowledging issues regarding youth engagement and retention, wished to formalise programs and strategies to increase engagement and improve retention rates of our youth members, who will become the club's future leaders.

We decided to make the portfolio as inclusive as possible from the outset, expanding the definition of youth from U/14s to U/23's. We focused on engagement beyond competition, encouraging members to explore all facets of the club. We engaged members who were no longer returning to gain an understanding of why they had made the decision to leave, and what more the club could offer them.

The first order of business, as in any good youth program, was to host a party. The Freshwater SLSC Youth pre-season party was held on Friday 21 September and was well attended by a core group of about 30 youth members. The night featured a performance by local band Curd, which consisted of club members Declan Quail, Callum Quail, Tristan Godoy and Sam Parker.

Early in the season we reviewed how best we could communicate with our youth members. Given the limited success with traditional club communication methods such as email, we created a Youth TeamApp. TeamApp has been successfully used by the club for a few seasons now in surf sports and nippers, and we continued to see success with this free app.

Throughout the season we saw amazing participation from our youth members in all domains, including surf sports, education and lifesaving. In education, we had approximately 30 U14 nippers who completed their SRC qualification and have now entered our patrolling team and senior club.

Similar numbers of U15s to U17s have also upgraded from SRC to Bronze Medallions, with many going on to complete higher awards. Thank you to our fantastic team of trainers for dedicating your time to training the new group of lifesavers!

For the past number of years Freshwater has had very strong applicants in the Junior Lifesaver of the Year competition and

have seen many winners including youth superstars Tahlia Dearden, Andrea Malm, Gracie Kiely and Caoimhe Daly. This year another

superstar joined their ranks with Mila McGettigan winning the Junior Lifesaver of the Year title — an absolutely fantastic achievement!

For the first time in many years, the club was able to boast it had competitors in every competition area at this year's championships – beach, lifesaving, boats, board, ski, swim, R&R, board riding and march past. This was in part due to our younger club members making a resurgence in the board riding and beach events, including nippers competing up into open competition to make up teams.

It was fantastic to see the number of youth members step up this season to take on coaching and mentoring roles for our younger members across the board in competition areas. Big thanks to Jess Douglas, Alex Malm and Nick Doyle for taking on coaching in the BSS area, to Tahlia Dearden and Julia Baker in lifesaving and to Mila McGettigan in beach competition.

A particularly pleasing success this season was the number of non-competitive youth members attending the gym sessions on Wednesday afternoons. This season we introduced a female only strengthening session run by Sammy Wood which we hope will continue with even greater numbers throughout the off season and into next season.

Core to our strategy was to demonstrate that the surf club was also a place beyond surf sports competing and patrols. With the support of the Executive Committee, the club internet Wi-Fi was improved and access was given to all club members. As a result, a number of youth members began to use the upstairs area of the club as a place to study and do homework after school, or get university work done on days off. This was great to see, and brought a large number of members together after school and before training sessions.

In November we ran a Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) course at Freshwater SLSC which was offered at a discounted price to our youth members, in return for assistance serving at club functions. A number of members took up this offer, which benefited both the youth member as they gained a recognised qualification assisting them to gain employment, and also benefits the club as we boost our number of members able to serve at our new club bar. Thanks must go to Steve Davis for assisting in arranging this course.

Central to our surf club is patrolling and we spent some time early in the season speaking with our youth members regarding barriers to attendance and participation in patrols. A number of issues such as timing of patrols, uniforms, allocation to patrols with friends, and conflicting sporting commitments continued to appear as we spoke to returning and non-returning members. These issues were then brought to the attention of the Club Captain and Executive Committee, and we continued to work on them throughout the season.

With any new program or initiative, there will be successes and limitations. From the outset, we aimed to measure the success of our initiatives over a number of seasons, with the Executive acknowledging this was a 3-year plan. With every success comes a number of lessons learnt, which we can use to shape our strategy for future seasons. A great success has been splitting the role into 'boys and girls', with each of us focusing on strategies for our respective cohorts. This allowed the kids to approach who they were already friends with/aware of, or who they would naturally feel more comfortable talking to. Further to that, it allowed us to use our years of experience and knowledge at the club to drive programs and initiatives we knew the club needed or would work.

A limitation we found early on, and was told time and time again by the kids, was that they didn't want formal programs, initiatives or groups. In the broader community, volunteer organisation are seeing a drop off in numbers across the board, especially in youth numbers. We need to find the right balance between maintaining our core business of patrolling, while also making sure the surf club stays a place where the kids want to be, and not just an extension of school or somewhere their parents send them. This will be an ongoing challenge for the preseason planning for the 2019/20 season.

To end, we would like to thank all the sections of the club, particularly surf sports, lifesaving and patrols who have continued to engage their youth members in their own teams and programs. On any given weekday afternoon or weekend, there is a healthy number of youth members in the gym, rowing surf boats, paddling boards, training for RnR or enjoying nippers. We have enjoyed fostering this group of members this season and particularly enjoyed watching the numbers grow and look forward to continued successes in the seasons to come.

We had a great start to the season for Freshie Nippers. We farewelled many long serving members of the Junior Activities Committee at the end of last season and welcomed new faces in key roles. I would also like to thank the new and returning JAC members for their continued hard work in their volunteer roles. Everyone worked together well and were focused on building on the work of past members to make Freshie Nippers the best place for our future life savers.

We started the season with just under 700 nippers enrolled and right from the get-go we needed new age managers and assistants for the U6's along with ensuring that all of the other age groups were covered as well with most parents returning for another season to cover off those roles. To everyone's credit they put the hard yards in and as a result we managed to end up with organised chaos! Most importantly, the kids were having lots of fun on the beach and were either making new friends or refreshing old friendships.

With all the training regimes up and running the competitive nippers certainly had a full schedule and we also focused on getting the kids to compete in the Club's Handicapped Surf Race each Sunday much to the pleasure of the older members who enjoyed seeing the nippers getting in and having a go.



For those Nippers who weren't competing at carnivals the Sunday Activities sessions saw plenty of fun and action on the beach and in the water headed up by Brent Cahill and the respective Age Managers, with a focus on learning those necessary surf skills with the odd tug-of-war and beach sprint thrown in for good measure.

The season saw some spectacular success in the land events at carnivals which was all down to a much focused Michelle Nunura as our Land Coach with the Team taking out 1st place at the Land Branch Carnival in February followed by gold in the All Age Relay at the State Titles in March, 2019. In addition to this our individual Nippers and relay teams won a smattering of gold and silver at both these carnivals as well, not to mention our flag competitors.

In the water the kids gave it their all in surf races and on boards and we will continue to look to build on this side of our club's training regime with a view to being more competitive in the future.

Also in November, and unfortunately for us, our signature carnival, the Freshie Fast & Furious Bennett Board Carnival was cancelled on the day due to dangerous surf conditions. I think it is safe to say everyone was horribly disappointed that morning but when it comes to the surf, safety always comes first. We are so in debt to the wonderful group of parents responsible for the setup and the whole shebang that is the carnival so thank you to Michal Brenchley, Monique Nitz, Jen Bourgeois, Richard Hawtin, Tom Duffy, the setup crew, and everyone else who pitched in not only on the day but in the weeks leading up to the carnival. Your efforts are always greatly appreciated and it was a real shame we couldn't get started on the day as we all know what a great carnival it is for the kids.

Further congratulations go out to the five nippers who were then selected for the Sydney Northern Beaches Branch Team to compete at the Interbranch Carnival which they won at Black Head Beach in December:

As is the case each season our U14 nippers were undertaking their training to be assessed on the Surf Rescue Certificate and thanks to the dedicated training team of John Goldrick, Kelly Dobrow and others, 25 of them passed and they then pulled on their fluoro orange shirts as part of the water safety team and joined the patrolling ranks to keep Freshie Beach safe for all.

In late January, Josh Gedz from the U14's represented NSW at the Surf Life Saving Australia – Interstate Championships 2019 in the Pathways and picked up gold in the Cameron as a runner. This is great achievement for Josh and we hope he can keep up the representative honours as he moves into the Senior Club next season.

In early February it was announced that Mila McGettigan, our Female Club Captain, had been selected as Female Junior Lifesaver of the Year by the committee at Sydney Northern Beaches Branch which is a great honour for her and our Club. Mila is the third U14 Freshie female in 4 seasons to take out this award and she now follows in the footsteps of Caiomhe Daly (2017-18 winner) and Grace Kiely (2015-16 winner). A great tradition for our U13 girls and boys to follow. Mila subsequently went on to represent the Branch at the State Competition in April but was not able to take out that award.

Back at Freshie we had more parents step up and graduate as IRB crew, IRB drivers and water safety. Thank you all for your contribution. It is greatly needed and makes things so much easier for the whole junior Club.

As mentioned earlier, February saw us off to North Narrabeen for the Land Branch Titles with a 1st place at the carnival followed by 5th place at Palm Beach in the Water Branch Carnival. Overall we came 4th on the combined results. Achieving a better outcome in the water will be a real focus for the Club for next season and we have some real up and coming stars so with the right training we can look forward to some positive results on that front.

















The month of March saw us off to the State Titles hosted at Swansea Belmont SLSC where our Team of 73 Nippers spent 3 days battling the sand and surf with some great outcomes all round. Overall we finished 16th on 52 points which was a great effort and something that we will aim to improve on going forward.

The highlights of the State Titles were a gold in the All Age Relay, the penultimate event on the land in surf carnivals, gold in the U14 Male Sprint taken out by Josh Gedz, and a silver in the U10 Female Surf Swim which was claimed by Jaslyn Plummer in her first big season of competing with Freshie.

The kids competed with great spirit and determination and did themselves, their parents and our Club proud. They all looked great in their State Team uniforms and many of them stepped up in age groups to help form teams which is a testament to their courage, determination and outstanding team spirit.

Two weeks later, in mid-March, we held our end-of-season Presentation and awarded our perpetual trophies as well as our Club Champions for each age group and said goodbye to our U14's as they 'aged-out' of Nippers. We also recognised all Nippers who had achieved a place in a final at State and there were quite a few!

It was also an opportunity to thank all of those parents who constantly go above and beyond the call of duty to make sure that the kids at Freshie Nippers can experience the best of times with their teammates and friends.

In April Josh Gedz, from the U14's, headed up to Kirra Beach to compete in the Aussie Titles in the Australian Youth competition where he came 5th in the final of U14 Male Beach Flags and 4th in the final of U14 Male Beach Sprint. An outstanding effort against the best Australia has to offer!

We have also had a 11 of our Nippers selected in the SNB Development Squad who will hold various training sessions during the off-season so a big congratulations to Ollie McDonald, Charlotte Block, Leela Scott, Tom Northcote, Seb Ellens, Artie Leiper, Mila McGettigan, Josh Gedz, Jaslyn Plummer, Charlotte Watton, and Stephie Fejes.

And now it is time to thank a long line of people who give up their time, effort, expertise and energy to all make the Nippers function come to life during the season. To the water safety, the IRB drivers and crew, the Age Managers and Age Assistants, the uniform ladies, the gear and board guys, the Sunday Activities setup and pack up crews, and all of those parents who just step in and help on BBQ's, carnival setups and everything else that needs to be done a huge thank you for all of your help over the season. 

Saturdays again were the significant training session for the week, with the Saturday Super Sessions comprising surf swimming, board and ski paddling, iron-

Therefore their belief (in the end) that they can put in what is needed to challenge the best in the event almost saw them medal at the Aussie's (again) this season.

The Season -

Again this season there wasn't a lot of Carnivals to attend:

We started at South Curly's 100 Year Carnival, then a couple over the Bridge at North Cronulla and Wanda, then two local carnivals at Manly and Freshwater for the Australia Day weekend. The next was an early Branch Titles at Palm Beach followed by the East Coast Masters at Collaroy, the State at Blacksmiths Beach followed by The Aussies in Queensland.

In all only six (6) Club Carnivals were held, this including the two (2) in the Sydney Branch, with four (4) in the SNB Branch, plus the three (3) big Championships of Branch, State and Aussies.

The outcome of these different team adjustments added to inconsistences in our results and the continuous unstable team effect hampered their regular positional training which is critical to any early season improvement which produces the strong team necessary to attack the "big" one(s) at the end of the season.

Team competitors this season totalled only sixteen (16) in all, but unfortunately injury, work, plus others unable to travel to the Australian Titles in Queensland had the Team again struggling to find the 12 members require to put on the beach each carnival. Fortunately as in the past seasons the few extra numbers and support from backup members saw that we were able to put a Team on the beach every time we needed to. Thank you "all" for that help, without it we wouldn't have made it to the Branch, States and Aussies.

Having such a strong March Past competition right on our local door step means Freshie are lucky but we also need to have a strong competitive Team to compete each carnival.

This meant putting a "different team structure" into each carnival throughout the season excluding the State and Aussies. At the State Championships the team performed exceptionally well – particularly in resuscitation and the scenario. Julia's swim to the buoy in the Swim/Tube/Board relay was so exciting to put us in 1st place and Jordan and Lucas got us up there in the surf



The reward was a State gold medal – 1st place.

At the Aussies we could not replicate this result and finished a disappointing 6th although only 2 points separated 4th, 5th and 6th. Despite every effort to thwart misjudgements we were not able to do this in every situation. Some silly points were lost which could have easily changed the whole result. There is always next year!!

First Aid

This season there were just two teams competing for Freshwater. Whilst numerous attempts were made to get some other teams competing the timing for training and attendance at carnivals just didn't come together. Cheryl White and Kelly Dobrow also stepped back from competition this season, although they continued to support as officials and with some coaching.

Coached by Tahlia Dearden was a new Under 15 team of Finlay Miller and Luke Thornton. These boys are both Under 14 nippers. Their first competition at Branch was



quite testing and they did not have a lot of preparation. At State they achieved a significant improvement in their scores and came 5th – well done!

Julia Baker, competing for the 8th season in First Aid and Tahlia Dearden competing for her 7th season in First Aid had an outstanding season coming 1st at Branch, State and

Australian. Their scenarios run for 12 minutes and in that time they have at least five patients with multiple injuries. Not only do they need outstanding first aid skills, they also need to be intuitive, show empathy, work together as a team and have mental toughness. Depending on where you are in the draw you may face hours in lockdown before participating in the competition. You are handed a radio and walked in to a scene with possibly only a sentence or two to give you an indication of what may lie ahead.

Julia and Tahlia have shown incredible skill and teamwork since first competing as an Under 17 team in 2013-14 and coming 3^{rd} at the Aussies. Since then in Under 17 2014-15 they came 2^{nd} at Branch, 4^{th} State and 1^{st} Aussies, in Under 19 2015-16 2^{nd} at Branch, 2^{nd} at State, 2^{nd} at Aussies, in Under 19 2016-17 1^{st} at Branch, 1^{st} at State, 1^{st} at Aussies, Opens 2017-18 2^{nd} at Branch, 1^{st} at State, 3^{rd} at Aussies. This season has been a clean sweep -1^{st} at Branch, 1^{st} at State and 1^{st} at Aussies.

While the 2018 competition season was one of the most successful in the Club's history for this tight group of competitors, the 2019 has proven to be even better. That was despite the decision to conduct the Australian championships at Broadbeach.

When held at the Gold Coast, the announcement to hold the competition away from the Kirra precinct rarely evokes an enthusiastic response from competitors. That is especially so for the R&R fraternity who face the increased threat of the dreaded 'dry run through' being the culmination of a season of training and competition. Predictably the competition was moved to Kirra and it was there Freshie achieved some awe inspiring results.

Despite only having 4 teams, all consistently performed at the highest levels throughout the season. Among the many highlights –

- All teams winning medals at Branch, State and Australian titles
- The Open 6 person, the Open Men's and Open Women's teams winning gold at the same Australian championships. This is the first time any club has achieved this at a single Australian championship carnival.
- The Open 6 person team successfully defending its State title for an unprecedented 6th year in succession.
- The Open Women's 5 person team successfully defending its Australian title.

- The Open Women's 5 person team winning its 8th successive Branch title and close 2nd at the State championships.
- The Open Men's 5 person team winning its Australian title without any deduction noted on the score card.
- The Open 5 Men's 5 person team successfully defending its State title for a 3rd year in a row.
- All teams making the finals at the Australian championships and winning medals.
- Freshwater winning the 'Ron Sandstrom Trophy' as champion R&R club at the Australian championships.

Despite the success our Club and its teams continue to enjoy in this Surf Sports discipline, it remains disappointing there are no emerging junior teams.

With such strong numbers of Nippers at the club it remains a mystery why there is no interest in the event from the junior membership.

This is particularly so when other clubs with much smaller competitor numbers can consistently field teams. At this season's Age championships, there were a number of teams in the 2 person event from SNB including Collaroy, North Curl Curl, Queenscliff and Mona Vale. Sadly there were none wearing the Freshie colours in an event which can teach those very important lifesaving skills from such an early age. Hopefully our Age Managers can assist in rectifying this issue in the upcoming seasons.

Open Mixed 5 Person

This team came together last season following the retirement of patient Gabi Rebecchi and the inclusion of Grace Kiely. After winning their Aussie Gold on debut at last year's championships, the team was determined to continue to perform strongly throughout the competition season and it did so splendidly. Under the watchful eyes of coach lan Donald and his able assistant, Jarrad Freakley the team started the season as it had finished the last, winning both Manly and Freshwater carnivals.

Despite her herculean efforts, the team was somewhat apprehensive about the final result because of the difficult 'pick up' conditions and the struggles encountered by the team at that point. With the scores being read and it becoming clear the winner was the team with the best swim time, the women were ecstatic in the knowledge it had achieved success for a second consecutive year. The result establishes this women's R&R team as the most successful in the Club's history.

During her time competing for Freshwater in R&R, Libby has competed in numerous Australian finals including one as a member of the 1st all female Open 6 person team to compete in an Australian final.

The 2019 Freshwater Australia Day Open Carnival was sponsored by **Healthy Care** and held on Sunday 27th January – it was publicised as being part of "Perfect Australia Day Weekend" of surf events along with Manly LSC. AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS TOUR TO BROADBEACH, GOLD COAST, QLD

On the competition side we continued to impress at the National level, coming 17th in the overall pointscore. Some of the results at the National titles held at Broadbeach on the Gold Coast were outstanding. In the Masters, Mike Kirkby and John de Mestre won gold in the 55-59 years Board Rescue, their 3rd title in succession and John also won the 50-59 Open Water race. Gold also went to our 170 years Surf Teams consisting of John de Mestre, Sigi Hill and Andrew de Vries.

In the Open competition, our Open Women's R&R team consisting of Libby Murphy, Lysa and Bec Kiely and Clare and Jane Freakley successfully defended their title by winning gold. The Open Men's 5 R&R team of Chris Tyrrell, Ian Donald, Jarrad Freakley, Seb di Sano and Alan Burns also won gold and our 6 person R&R team Chris Tyrrell, Ian Donald, Clare and Jarrad Freakley, Hugo Weston and Pat Kiely took out the gold also.

How pleasing was it to see the Open First Aid title go to Julia Baker and Tahlia Dearden. Julia has now won a gold medal in this event in the U/15s, U/17s, U/19s and Opens for the club while Tahlia has won gold in this event in the U/17s, U/19s and Opens. Many silver and bronze medals were also won in both the Masters and Open carnivals and a full list of the Championship results is included in the "Competition Results" report.
