REMEMBRANCE DAY CEREMONY

JACKA PARK 11 NOVEMBER 2022

On Remembrance Day, a number of Club members attended the Remembrance Service held at Jacka Park.

The Memorial Garden and Wall of Remembrance commemorates those who have served in conflicts in which Australia has been involved.

Situated at the corner of Wyndora Avenue & Oliver Street, Freshwater, it features a flagpole, "wall of remembrance" and plaques in a formal garden formed by brick terraces at the western side of Jacka Park. An earlier memorial obelisk is incorporated in a new garden area.

The memorial garden was first opened in 1979. The garden and wall of remembrance were upgraded by the Harbord RSL sub-Branch and Warringah Council as part of the Australia Remembers campaign and opened on the 20th August 1995. Further upgrades have been undertaken by Northern Beaches Council and the Harbord RSL branch in 2022 and these were formally opened at the Service. It is well worthwhile paying a visit.

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CLUB PANELS HISTORY PANEL & HONOURS PANEL

Names of interested Club members in participating on the Club History Panel and Honours Panel are requested to the Surf Club Manager by 30th November please. A minimum of four(4) experienced members are required by By-Law 11 for each of the Panels. A brief outline of each role is provided below.

HISTORY PANEL

The History Panel shall be responsible for the collation, recording, archiving and display of Club photographs and other Club memorabilia.

The History Panel shall be made up of a minimum of 4 senior members of the Club who shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

The History Panel shall report to the Executive Committee at least once every three months commencing in September, through the Executive Officer.

HONOURS PANEL

The Honours Panel shall be responsible for assisting in the identification and assessment of recommendations for Club and external awards and assisting in the preparation of any supporting submissions where appropriate.

The Honours Panel shall be made up of a minimum of 4 senior members of the Club who shall be approved by the Executive Committee from nominations received.

(The Honours Panel shall report to the Executive Committee at least once every three months commencing in September, through the President/Chairperson of the Honours Panel.


FRESHIE BAR UPGRADE COMPLETE



JOHN MILLS OAM - FRESHWATER SLSC & COFFS HARBOUR SLSC, NSW

John is arguably Australia's longest serving and one of the most successful surf sports coaches, dedicating countless volunteer hours driving athletes to excellence with second to none expertise in training and surf knowledge – creating sustained and significant difference to athletes' lives, particularly in regional New South Wales.

John has had an unbroken level of commitment to the Surf Life Saving movement. He actively competed at the highest level for 20 years and has coached both informally and more formally for some 60 years, all on a voluntary basis. His record is truly outstanding and remarkable.

His versatility and innovative ability across disciplines as diverse as R&R, Craft and the art of surf swimming put him in an elite category indeed.

John can genuinely be seen as "a lifesaver for life", an exemplary role model who has been a positive influence over many years for so many by those fortunate enough to have known him. His willingness to offer advice and guidance to those from other Clubs further epitomises the benefit John has provided within the movement which means so much to him.

John has made an eminent, respected and notable contribution to the development of surf lifesavers at all levels over half a century that is both significant and influential. His impact has been truly remarkable and described by many as life changing.

Michael Bate has 52 years of continuous SLSA surf lifesaving membership, and has contributed to SLSA in a distinguished, significant, conspicuous, and sustained manner for a period in excess of 50 years.

As a member of the SLSSNB Executive and an integral member of the Branch Building Committee between 2004 and 2009, Michael was at the vanguard of SLSSNB purchasing its own Branch Headquarters. Further, Michael's business acumen was instrumental in SLSSNB in achieving the key financial goal of long term financial stability.

Michael also played a significant role in the successful establishment of a long-term future fund to help protect the SLSNSW from financial stress.

Michael was Chief Referee at many Interstate AND SLSNSW championships. Michael is a distinguished Referee who is highly respected by organisers, officials, and competitors in this role.

Michael distinguished himself in the international competition arena and was highly regarded by his teams, international officials and opposing teams. Further, the teams led by Michael distinguished themselves both with success in the competition arena and as outstanding ambassadors for Australia.

COMP PROFICIENCY

To all cadet, open and master's competitors, a reminder that it is your responsibility to ensure that your proficiency is current (dry skills, wet skills and on-line components).

You also need to have a **minimum of** 15 hours of patrol hours logged prior to 31 December if you wish to enter carnivals from January 2023.

Under the current SEMS (carnival entry system, we cannot enter any competitors into carnivals that do not meet requisite proficiency and patrol hours.

Under 14 Competitors that wish to enter into U15 events must have their SRC completed and also meet the minimum of 15 hours of patrol prior to 31 December 2022.

PATROL NEWS

PATROL 8

A QUICK AND DECISIVE RESPONSE

On the afternoon of 29 October 2022, Patrol 8 had to deal with a beach-goer having a stroke in the water. The incident occurred directly in front of Toby Jacobs who has recently obtained his Bronze. Toby immediately and correctly identified the signs of a stroke and called for assistance by radio. An emergency doctor happened to be at the beach and she took control of the incident. Special mentions also to Alex Malm and Jackie Phillips who provided significant assistance as did the ever-present Freshwater Life Guards. The patient was discharged from the hospital after 4 days and returned to the beach to thank the Patrol and the Life Guards. Many thanks to Toby and Patrol 8. Your quick thinking and immediate care and response were integral to the successful outcome of this incident.

PATROL 12

STEPS UP AND DELIVERS

The afternoon of Saturday 5 November 2022 saw Greg Gardner leading Patrol 12. It was a busy afternoon for them. The surf was large and the rips were strong. Around 2:45 pm Andrea Bohm's eagle eyes spotted 2 swimmers caught in the northern rip. She was then, with the great assistance of Adam Ewers, able to shepherd the swimmers onto the rocks near the pool. The swimmers were then given some free, but invaluable, advice about swimming between the flags. Then, just before 5 pm, a spearfisherman reported to the patrol that his mate was in trouble out near the northern point. Greg Bartlett, on his first patrol as an IRB driver, with the assistance of Nick Keown visiting from South Curly, launched and successfully navigated the large swell to land his maiden rescue. Congratulations to Patrol 12. You did a great job on a tough day.

REMINDER - REQUIREMENTS FOR LONG SERVICE

For the information of Members, By-Law 9 sets out the requirements to qualify for Long Service status. In summary, you need to have patrolled for:

(a) a minimum of 25 hours per season for 10 years; or

(b) a minimum of 25 hours per season for 8 years & another 4 seasons at 16 hours per season.

The purpose of Long Service is to reward Members who have consistently met their patrol obligations. Members are generally required to patrol for 36-40 hours per season.

Those of you who have reached the 10-year mark in your patrolling career might wish to consider continuing to patrol. If you make it to 15 years (with a minimum of 30 patrol hours per season) you can be awarded the National Medal, which is awarded by the Governor-General.

CONGRATS TO NEW IRB CREWIES

The Club is pleased to congratulate our newest IRB Crew graduates, Simon Dudley, Andre Eerenstein, Ksenia Lisitskaya, Maurice Mandalinic, Ava Moon and Carl Sorensen

FRESHIE MASTERS CARNIVAL



Last Saturday Freshwater hosted the worlds best and longest running masters carnival in what could only be described as classic surf carnival conditions. With Saturday dawning to great weather and a solid swell forecast to drop throughout the morning the decision was made to go ahead in the clean but solid conditions. While the beach was closed to the punters the battle hardened masters pressed on in a swell where 60% of the time you had 100% chance of making it out without getting nailed.

The dropping tide did not bring the respite in surf that was expected over the carnival with the final event the Dash for Cash being held in absolutely epic conditions with 4-5ft sets making it a true test of bodysurfing ability that our own John "Zin Zan" Landells managed well to come in 2nd place in the under 50's. Once again the officials under the direction of Gordon Lang from Palm Beach did a great job to get through the program and ensure that the punters were tucking into a bacon and egg rolls as soon as practical despite the conditions making a few races take a little longer than anticipated.

We had just over 200 entries from across 15 clubs and Freshwater was represented well across the beach where we finished a credible 3rd place behind North Bondi in 2nd and the winners Manly who had a strong contingent represented across all age groups to take home the Ross Parry Cup (again..)

A huge thanks to everyone that was involved in bringing the carnival together and also to our sponsors for making this event a highlight in the masters surf sports calendar.

WHAT IS A MPIO?

A MPIO provides information about the rights, responsibilities and options available to an individual making a complaint.

The MPIO listens to complaints and concerns from members, and provides information about the rights, responsibilities and options available to an individual. They do not investigate or get involved in the complaint.

An MPIO acts as an impartial body, offering a sounding board to bounce ideas off. They liaise with members of the club including, officials, coaches, competitors, parents, other volunteers, the Club President and Executive.

Freshwater Surf Livesaving Club has 3 Member Protection Information Officers (MPIOs). Each of our MPIOs hold a WWCC and is actively involved with Freshwater SLSC members in varying roles including competition, training, coaching and patrolling.

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

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


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
