

President's Report



t gives me great pleasure on behalf of the Freshwater Executive Committee to present to the membership the 114th Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club's Annual Report

Some normality returned to our overall surf Club operations and our patrols during the 2022 / 2023 season as volunteers we returned to normal patrols. Leaving the interruptions that the pandemic forced upon us, our priorities have been rebuilding our patrolling numbers and the re-education of our existing membership. Firstly, thank you to Richard Hawtin who took over as the Club's Executive Officer this season. Richard has done an outstanding job settling himself and the new look front office team into their roles and the quality and production of this year's Annual Report is testament to their capabilities and commitment. Thank you to Renee McGettigan our Surf Club Manager

and Sylvia Meszaros as Functions Manager for the great collaboration that you both have shown working together to ensure the smooth running of the front of house operations.

For some years now Richard has also taken on the role of organising most of our major events and again this year led our members at the annual Freshwater Open Surf carnival. Richard and Lindsay Davis were also responsible for all the liaison and the delivery of the NSW State Carnival Lifesaving and R&R events that Freshwater hosted as part of the SLSNSW State Championships. Thank you Richard and Lindsay for all your hard work preparing and delivering these great events.

My sincere thanks to David Price our hard working and ever-present Club Captain and all his Patrol Captains for the hundreds and hundreds of patrol hours they and their volunteer teams racked up this year. David remains committed to ensuring that we build up our patrolling numbers to meet the demands that are placed on the Club from the Freshwater Community and the thousands of beach goers that visit the Freshwater Basin each season.

During the season Lindsay Davis our Director for Education and Training and her team of assessors and instructors delivered over 100 new awards for the Club. In typical fashion, Lindsay and her team managed all the paperwork, attended all the Club education updates, supported the Junior Club's education updates, and still found time to train the Lifesaving Team

Competitors that were rewarded with outstanding results at Branch, NSW State, and the Australian Championships.

To Tony Wessling our Junior Activities Chairman and his huge team of professionals, I also want to pass on the thanks of the whole Club. It has been a pleasure working closely with Tony and his team this season as the Junior Club like the rest of the Club, returned to some normality and regular activities. This season the junior Club enrolled just over 520 junior members and delivered great education and competition programmes. The results of the junior Club at Branch and State were outstanding and they have set a great training platform ahead of the coming season.

Special thanks to Sarah Mandalinic and Robin Brenchley for the outstanding work and many hours that you have spent ensuring the success of the Junior Club and assisting the JAC team and all the Junior Age Managers.

I mentioned in my report last year that I was so pleased that Michael Raymer was taking up the role of Director of Finance. Michael will only stand again until 30 September to enable establishment of the finances for Season 2023/4 as he and his family take long overdue leave and and will be travelling extensively and therefore unable to provide the Club the level of service that he wants to provide. Thank you, Michael, for your great contribution that you have provided the Executive Committee. Testament to your professional





service is the excellent Finance report that you have delivered in the Club's annual report.

Our Marketing and Sponsorship team led by Kimberley Dales has had an outstanding season. Kimberley has delivered an exceptional first term, introducing many new long-term sponsors and donors to the Club. Kimberley has also renewed many of our great partnerships with existing Club sponsors and through her diligence provided renewed interest in Freshwater SLSC and our Brand.

Thank you to The Freshwater Community Bank - Bendigo, Harbord Diggers / Mounties Group, The Harbord Hotel, Supamart IGA, Titan Ford, Network 10, Upstate, Neilson Foundation, Sharwood - Sekisui House, Bennett Surf Co, Clarke & Humel, Icon Homes, Highlands Building & Design and our many Community Supporters.

For the past few seasons now, Andrea Malm has represented the Freshwater Youth at many conferences, meetings and weekend retreats and is providing our younger members with her learnings and leadership insights. The Club in very grateful to Andrea for the work that she has done mentoring our younger members, providing great counselling and all the time meeting her own Patrol Captain obligations. Andrea will not be standing again for her role on the board, and therefore on behalf of all the Freshwater members and the Executive Committee we thank her for her years of commitment.

I would also like to thank Shanny Dyer for the way that she has embraced her role as Director Membership Services on the Executive Committee. In her first year in the role, Shanny has added significant value to this area of the Club.

In this year's annual report, the Director of Surf Sports James Coates has included all the seasons results as well as a summary on the many Surf Sports events that the Club runs on an annual basis. It would be remiss of me if I didn't single out the performance of the 6 Person R&R team that won at the 2023 Australian Championships the coveted 6 Person R&R Premiership Trophy. Well done to all our Sport teams that competed at local, branch, State and Australian Championships. A comprehensive list of all our results is in the Competition Results section of this Annual Report.

During the past season the Club was successful with two State Government Grants. The first was for \$150,000 to upgrade our bar area in the Freshwater Room and the second was a \$16,000 Community Grant though the Member for Manly James Griffin's office to upgrade the Club office, the foyer and rear courtvard. In both cases these works were supervised by our Facilities Director Michael Kirkby. Michael's pro bono work through the Artazan Property Group saved the Club significant funds and we are truly grateful for APGs' kind gesture in project managing both these projects. Thank you to SLSNSW and the Surf Sports Commission and State Government Community Grants Team for their support towards our Grant applications.

Finally, the Club is again indebted to our Surf Life Saving parent bodies and their sponsors at SLSA and SLSNSW. We are also grateful to the team at Sydney Northern Beaches led by Tracey Hare-Boyd for their assistance this season.

To our Federal member for Warringah Zali Steggall and our State Member James Griffin thank you both for your ongoing support. To Michael Regan the outgoing Mayor of Northern Beaches Council and Ray Brownlee the General Manager /

CEO at council, thank you again for your support towards our long-term aspirations for upgraded Club premises and assisting Freshwater SLSC this season with significant funds to complete our Club Development Application.

And finally, following the severe floods that we witnessed across NSW over the past 12 months, our Surf Life Saving organisation was described by the peak rescue bodies that we worked side by side with, "as a selfless body of people, that all had the goal of providing help to others, or any a group, or organisation, or a cause, or the community at large, despite their gender, background, ethnicity and without expectation of material reward. That made the Surf Life Saving volunteers a unique group of individuals that deserved all the community's highest praise for the work they do."

It's nice to lead such a great group of dedicated people here at Freshwater.

Executive Officer's Report



t was my pleasure to be elected Executive Officer at the June 2022 AGM for Season 2022/23. This season, being the first "post-COVID-19", provided an opportunity for the Club to approach tasks in a dynamic manner in order to remind, refresh, stimulate and retain Club members of the opportunities that being a member of Freshwater SLSC provides. For all community bodies it has been hard to retain membership numbers for the precovid period.

Season 2022/23 has seen the following initiatives being planned and achieved; 1) A refreshed monthly newsletter;



2) Upgraded Club Bar facilities; 3) Upgraded Club Foyer, entrance and noticeboard; and 4) Back Courtyard refresh. This season also saw the signing of new twenty(20) year lease arrangement with Northern Beaches Council.

Introducing into the Club the role of Surf Club Manager has been an important and successful initiative. It has taken the responsibility for the conduct of a large number of managerial and administrative tasks from members of the Executive Committee (EC) but has maintained reporting lines into the relevant EC Director.

The newly elected Executive Committee also held in August 2022 a Strategy Session with the goal of developing a Club Masterplan to tie in with local council initiatives for the upgrade of the buildings and associated Reserve Area.

During the year a General Meeting was held on the 10th December 2022 with the aim of communicating to our membership the implemented and proposed initiatives for not only this season but looking forward to 2025 and onwards. Presentations were made by the President, and the portfolios of Treasurer, Captain, Facilities and Education.

Membership

Post the relaxation of personal requirements for COVID-19 management, this season saw an overall increase in Club membership. Our Nipper intake was very healthy with over 517 registrations, a significant increase on last season.

A similar significant increase was also seen in relation to nipper parent members. All other categories of membership remained relatively stable with small increases or decreases in line with usual variations.

The table below highlights the 2022-23 membership numbers and categories for the season based on the reporting system used in previous seasons.

Executive Committee

At the 2022 Annual General Meeting, there were several new members elected to positions on this season's Executive Committee – David Price as Club Captain, Richard Hawtin as Executive Officer, Tony Wessling as Junior Activities, Shanny Dyer (Member Services), James Coates (Director of Sport) and Michael Kirkby (Director of Facilities).

There were no changes during the season.

Club Governance

In accordance with the Constitution, existing By-Laws were reviewed by the Club's Governance Panel during the August – September period to confirm their ongoing relevance. All proposed changes to the By-Laws were approved by the Executive Committee without dissent.

In addition to initiatives mentioned elsewhere, this season has also seen commencement of initiatives to review and revise the structure behind key Club documents; Work, Health and Safety Plan, Risk Management Plan, Sponsorship Agreement and Club Function Bookings Checklist.

Club Office Staff

This season saw the full implementation of the role of Surf Club Manager. Welcome Renee to this role. The Surf Club Manager is the key public and Member contact and is responsible for office management, membership registration, mechandise, communication, facilities, shop Management, accounts and liaising closely with the Club's caretakers and event and functions co-ordinator.

In a return to past practice the Executive Committee is also trialling the services of a separate Freshwater Functions Manager. Sylvia Meszaros is currently undertaking that role and in the short time she has been doing so there has been a marked improvement in function income for the Club. In addition to these changes, a casual Administration Assistant will be employed to support the Surf Club Manager through the busy parts of the season.

General Administration

The Freshwater Retail Store (clothing shop) was outsourced from the start of the 2022/2023 season to Delfina Sport (www.delfinasport.com) as a merchandise partner, primary supplier and distributor of the Club's merchandise.

This initiative was not as successful as expected and the agreement was terminated by mutual agreement in March 2023.

For Season 2023/24 the Club will revert back to the previous model under the guidance and direction of the Surf Club Manager and EC endorsed Merchandise Plan, the purpose of which to establish budget, determine order requirements and stock planning. There remains a pressing need to identify someone who is willing to take on the role of operating the Club's Retail Store under the management of the Surf Club Manager.

In December 2022, Richard Hawtin (Executive Officer) qualified and formally took the role of manager of the Club's on-premise liquor licence with the NSW Liquor and Gaming Authorities. The Club appreciates the patience of Wayne Freakley (as the previous incumbent) in transitioning this role (through various unsuccessful attempts).

Associated with this, the upgrade to the Bar Facilities and the broader review of Club process – the Club appointed Dave Inches as Bar Operations Manager. In this role Dave reviewed and finalised a Bar Operations Manual that contains our values and expectations, along with policies and procedures in relation to the operation of the bar and associated area at Freshwater SLSC. Additionally, the Handbook aims to promote good management and fair treatment of all persons (including clients) who may interact with the Bar.

The Club also developed and released a formal Employee Handbook that outlines our values and expectations, along with policies, procedures & benefits for Club employees.

Thank You

The Executive Officer role provides a vital role in the provision of administrative support across the spectrum of Club activities. It is a demanding position and relies heavily on the support of a broader team and especially the Surf Club Manager (SCM) to effectively fulfil its role.

In that regard a huge thank you to Renee McGettigan who throughout this initial "full season" of the role fulfilled the expectations for the implementation of this role. During the post-season there will be further review of the Club administration responsibilities and process and identify improvements for implementation in Season 2023/24.

In support of the SCM role, Mila McGettigan and Janine Fahey provided administration support at times through the season.

Thank you also to Dave Inches for taking on the role of Bar Operations Manager and Sylvia Meszaros for her support in the role of Functions Manager. Also to Alex Malm and Kevin Dyer for taking on Gym and BBQ management responsibilities.

Finally thank you also to our caretakers Ken, Janet and Michael Rickard. There has always been a close working relationship between the office staff and the caretaker and the Rickard family have provided tremendous support throughout the season.

The summer months proved a very trying period for the caretakers as the Freshwater Reserve became the popular night-time place to let off steam. The Club is grateful to the caretakers for care and diligence they showed during this period.

Finance Report



am pleased to report that the Club has finished with a strong financial result for the year, with a surplus of \$42,421 (after non-cash depreciation of \$54,185), an improvement from a small deficit of \$5,810 last year.

The result exceeded budget expectations due to greater activity overall, following the more subdued covid years. This included increases in Sponsorships, JNR Memberships, Grants, Kiosk rental, Hall hire and Carnival activities. This was also partially offset by reductions in Donations, Shop revenue and Covid support.

Overall expense levels were gener ally contained despite cost increases in running costs such as utilities, building and facility costs, administration and support, insurances, and the like.

The stronger revenue position has allowed for increased investments in Juniors, with new board purchases and support, as well as patrol equipment and uniforms. In addition, the cash surplus has allowed for investments in new assets on the Balance Sheet of \$118k, including IRB and Motors \$27k, Security System \$27k, contribution to Bar Upgrade \$25k, Surfboat (net of sale) \$24, Airconditioning \$6k and general Club Furniture & Equipment \$9k.

Revenue has increased overall by \$75,066 or 14% from last year. This has mainly been driven by the generous support of our sponsors and general activity increases across several areas of the Club post covid. Junior membership numbers have improved, Hall Hire revenue is back to pre-covid levels and Kiosk rentals improved with greater beach activity this season.

Our Carnival revenues also improved with a very successful Open Carnival, the ever-popular Barney Mullens, and the hosting of the State Champs. In addition, the Club was successful in obtaining an additional Grant of \$16,000 this year to upgrade the Foyer of the Club.

Grant revenue also includes the annual Beach Safety Equipment Fund grant

of \$10,000, provided by the Australian Government, which will be used to contribute towards a new ATV in the 2023/2024 season.

Revenue was negatively impacted this year by a reduction in Donations, Covid support and Shop sales compared to last year. The shop has been challenging to manage over the last few years with the recently trialed outsourced model not meeting members expectations. The shop has now been brought back to the Club again.

The Club continues to be heavily reliant on Sponsorships, Donations and Grants to support our mission; "To ensure no lives are lost while on patrol, assist members to achieve their full potential and support the community" and I would like to take this opportunity to thank our generous sponsors, donors and supporters for their ongoing support which allows the Club to continue to provide first class Lifesaving, First Aid, Education, Training, Equipment, Facilities, Juniors and Surf Sport programs to our members.

Expenses overall have increased by \$26,334 or 5% from last year. As there is every year there has been a level of variability of expenses across the various activities of the Club, based on activity. The focus of discretionary expenditure this year has been to invest to ensure that our lifesaving, education, junior activities, and facilities are the best that they can be with the available resources. The increase

in revenue has allowed continued strong investments across all these areas this year.

The Club, like the broader economy, has seen general cost increases across most areas of the Club's activities. The focus will continue to be on maintaining control of our costs as we move into the 2023/2024 season.

Balance Sheet

The Club generated a cash surplus (excluding depreciation) of \$96,607 for the year. This was used to fund fixed asset investments of \$117,672. After accounting for other balance sheet movements there was an overall decrease in cash

of \$34,620 to a balance of \$562,966, of which \$300,000 is invested in a fixed term deposit to support the future master building plan.

The Fixed Asset investments this year includes an investment in the Bar Upgrade of \$175,192, of which \$150,000 was Grant funded by the NSW Government Department of Sport, resulting is a net contribution by the Club of \$25,192. To be consistent with prior treatment of major grants by the Club the \$150,000 grant has been applied directly against the total cost of the upgrade on the Balance Sheet and has not been included in revenue.

The following audited accounts provide

a more detailed breakdown of revenue and expenditure as well as the assets and liabilities of the Club.

I would like to thank my Executive Committee colleagues for their support and the tireless work that they do in the background to keep our Club running. The focus this year has been on consolidating the back-office process and ensuring the Club has the processes and resources it needs to meet the needs of the members. – see you on the beach.

Principal activities and significant changes in nature of activities

The principal activities of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc during the financial year were to provide surf lifesaving services.

There were no significant changes in Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc's principal activities during the financial year.

Review of operations

Total revenue and other income increased by \$75,066 (2022: \$57,181) mainly due to an increase in, Sponsorships, JNR Memberships fees, Grants, Kiosk Rental, Hall Hire and SNR Carnivals, offset by reduction in Donations, Shop Revenue and COVID support. Operating expenses increased by \$26,334 to reflect overall increase in activity across the season including expenditures in Patrols and JNR equipment. As a result, the Club recorded a net profit of \$42,421 (2022: Loss of \$5,810). Net assets increased by \$42,421 (2022: \$5,810) reflecting the operating profit result and net cash position decreased by \$34,620 to \$562,966 (2022: Increased by \$777 to \$597,586). Cash decreased mainly due to investments in Property, Plant & Equipment.

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No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or could significantly affect the operations of the Club, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the Club's in future financial years.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2023

The financial report covers Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Club, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The principal activities of the Club for the year ended 30 April 2023 were providing surf lifesaving services.

The functional and presentation currency of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by those charged with governance on 6 June 2023.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that comply with Australian Accounting Standards – Simplified Disclosures and the Australian Charities and Not for profits Commission Act 2012.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

These financial statements also comply with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW).

Comparative Amounts

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

New and Amended Standards Adopted

The Club has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Club.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Write downs of inventory values are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(d) Revenue and other income

Revenue from contracts with customers - The core principle is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model: (i) Identify the contract with the customer, (ii) Identify the performance obligations, (iii) Determine the transaction price, (iv) Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations, and (v) Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred.

Principal revenue streams are recognised as follows:

Membership fees

Fees are recognised when payments are received. Membership is not granted or renewed until subscriptions are paid. Memberships are yearly and are in line with the Club's financial year and therefore, recognised as revenue in the financial year. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years. Membership subscriptions received in advance are carried forward as a liability at the end of the reporting period.

Sale of goods and equipment

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods or equipment to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when all performance obligations are satisfied.

Events and Training Income

Revenue from events and training are recognised on completion of the event, when performance obligations are satisfied. Until then, payments received are recognised as deferred income.

Sponsorships

Sponsorships from participating parties are aligned to the financial year of the Club. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years.

Other income

Interest is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method.

Government grants are recognised on an accrual's basis at the time that the eligibility conditions have been fulfilled by the Club.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Grants related to assets

Government grants related to assets, including non-monetary grants at fair value is presented in the statement of financial position by deducting the grant in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Club, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Buildings and improvements	5%-20%
Plant and Equipment	10%-33%
Heritage Centre	2.5%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(f) Financial Instruments

Recognition

Financial assets measured at amortised cost

Financial assets measured at amortised cost are non-derivative financial assets which are held to collect the contractual cash flows. The contractual terms of the financial assets give rise to payments on specified dates that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding. They are included in current assets. The Club's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise 'trade receivables', 'other receivables' and 'cash and cash equivalents' which comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Financial liabilities

The Club's financial liabilities include trade payables. These are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method. The interest expense is calculated each reporting period by applying the effective interest rate, and the resulting charge is reflected in finance costs on the statement of profit and loss and comprehensive income.

Impairment of financial assets

Expected credit losses are recognised if required for trade receivables, cash and cash equivalents and other receivables. Expected credit losses are calculated as the difference between the contractual cash flows that are due to the Institute and the cash flows that the Club expects to receive given the probability of default and loss given default, discounted at the original effective interest rate.

(g) Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period the Club determines whether there is evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where an indicator exists and regardless for indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Those charged with governance make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Inventories

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine inventory obsolescence. During the year, management has written off inventory based on the age and the model of the clothing stocks that in their view, are unsellable. During the year, the Club wrote off \$2,892 worth of stocks. (2022: \$6,080)

Club Captain's Report



he 2022-2023 patrolling season was the first since 2018-2019 not to have any restrictions imposed as a consequence of COVID-19. Like many Clubs, we suffered a reduction in our patrolling numbers through the COVID years. At the commencement of this season, it appeared that we had lost another 80 patrolling members from last season.

It appeared that some of the afternoon patrols might only have 3 or 4 bronze medallion holders. Fortunately, we have a strong Club spirit and there was a ready supply of current patrolling and long-service members, who stepped in to fill the gaps and ensured that the Club could meet its obligations. I am enormously grateful to all those who graciously did extra patrols. Special thanks, in particular, to Richard Hawtin, Michiel Tops, Kris Burrows, Izzy Stapf-Giannakis, Kevin Crow and Kelly Dobrow. My apologies for not being able to name every person who did extra patrols.

It was great to see the number of longservice members pull on the Red and Yellow shirt again, particularly in the Christmas-New Year period. Ken Rickard, in particular, turned the clock back patrolling the rip off the southern flag. He gave 110% and appeared to be having the time of his life.

Fortunately, Lindsay Davis and her expert team of trainers were able to run a few bronze medallion courses and that has injected some fantastic new members to raise the number of patrolling numbers. All of our patrols look very healthy to start next season.

I cannot thank the Patrolling Members and, in particular, the Patrol Captains, enough. It can be a difficult and stressful job, and the Patrol Captains are rarely given sufficient recognition and thanks for their efforts. The Club is fortunate to have such a great group of Patrol Captains. They are:

- Nic Steiger, Grayson Killen and Jackie Stark shared the duties for Patrol 1.
- Simon Wain stepped up to take over Patrol 2 after having been deputy to the enigmatic Luke Jarman.
- Xander Needham took over Patrol 3 after having the enormous benefit of learning from Peter Block.
- Mark Gilbert was again the mainstay of Patrol 4, but has been mentoring Grace Seaglove, Natalie Berger and Sascha Gassman.
- Ian Hills and Thomas Hills again led Patrol 5 with a great mix of experience and enthusiasm.
- Dee Godoy was the calm and steady hand in charge of Patrol 6.
- James Crittenden blooded Jake Landells this season for Patrol 7.
- Andy Jones superbly captained Patrol 8 again with great backup from Emily Lemlin
- David Newhouse was the rock on which Patrol 9 was built this season:
- Kim Cook did a fantastic job rebuilding her team on Patrol 10.
- The Dynamic Duo of Kris Burrows and Michel Tops (the order is alphabetical) continued to be the very model of co-captains for Patrol 11.
- Once again, the irrepressible and indefatigable Greg Gardner orchestrated the season for Patrol 12.
- Andi Malm was the cool, calm and collected leader of Patrol 13.
- I picked up the reins for Patrol 14 after Ben Hildyard hung up his whistle last winter.
- Michael Raymer stepped into the big shoes of Dierk Hartmann and performed admirably. It was great to see Dierk back in the second half of the season).
- The greatly experienced pair of Alex Chan and Blake Dyer expertly guided Patrol 16.

Nearly every patrol had to deal with significant issues this season. More than three-quarters of the patrols had to call for an ambulance on least one occasion, and some patrols had multiple calls. Every Patrol Captain performed superbly in managing those incidents.

Once again, our patrols were randomly audited 5 times this season. Although it is no longer a points-based process, it still requires our patrols to establish that they are fully prepared for any circumstance.

Of course, our patrols passed each audit. The only cloud over our season this year was the unfortunate incident in early March when three 18-year-old men went swimming after 8 pm one Saturday evening. But, only two returned. A search was conducted that evening and again the following morning. John Lo Schiavo and Natalie Jander performed magnificently

in assisting the Police with the recovery exercise. Many thanks also to Bennett Frerck and Isabelle Stap-Giannakis who were also closely involved. Andi Malm, the Captain of Patrol 13, and her team conducted themselves with the utmost professionalism in managing the beach whilst the Police Helicopter carried out its task in the middle of the beach.

This season we conducted 144 rostered patrols and provided lifesaving services for:

- the Boat Carnival;
- the Masters' Carnival;
- the Nipper Carnival;
- the Australia Day Open Carnival;
- three separate State Championships events (Champion Lifesaver, Patrol Competition and R&R); and
- the Barney Mullins Swim.

The Club also provided an additional day's patrolling on 28 December 2022, organised by Richard Hawtin, because of the large crowds that came to our beach across the Christmas-New Year period.

The Club had the benefit of 325 Members contributing over 8,652 hours in carrying out that work.

Freshwater has again been one of the busiest beaches in the State. We had recorded attendances of over 360,000. That number should undoubtedly be higher because the Patrol Operations App failed about 10% of the time resulting in a loss of data. Although we only have 46 recorded rescues, we had more than 800 preventative actions. That ratio demonstrates again that Freshwater's Patrolling Members are experts in taking steps to prevent our beach-goers from getting into trouble.



Each year our surf lifesavers must undertake a knowledge and skills review. This season all members were expected to complete full resuscitation without restrictions.

Belinda Dobson was once again instrumental in organising our skills maintenance schedule, undertaking a lot of paperwork and back-office work to make sure the information captured on the "App" corresponded with reality. Our trainers and content experts were very generous in their time attending skills maintenance sessions for SRC, Bronze, ART, IRB Crew and Driver. Surf Rescue Certificate - 28 Successful Candidates

Kelly Dobrow and John Goldrick once aain took on the training of the Under 14 nippers and training started earlier this season to try and 'clear the decks' before the season started. There were 17 successful candidates in this group. Thanks to the parents who provided water safety and helped with 'wrangling'.

During the remainder of the season a small group was successful before Christmas and a few candidates joined in with bronze groups as the season progressed. Some delightful young people joined our patrolling cohort this way and we look forward to them becoming fully fledged patrol members as they turn 15 and complete their Bronze Medallion.

Bronze Medallion

47 Successful Candidates

Our first Bronze group was an SRC to Bronze squad, with most being very competent in the water. Gregg Slater was great as a 'content expert' (in all content actually!) and Steve and I really appreciated his help in training this squad of eleven youngsters.

First Aid

Several First Aid courses were run during the winter months as it is often hard to find the opportunity during the main patrolling season. Thanks to Cheryl and SLSNSW for providing the courses to us. Sixteen people undertook the award for the first time and multiple other members updated their award as part of the ongoing

process of 'keeping up-to-date'. First Aid (HLTAID011) is now a prerequisite to completing the ART (HLTAID015) so this is a pivotal course to ensure our members on the beach are ready for emergency care situations.





Advanced Resuscitation Techniques - 8 Successful Candidates

Jackie Phillips and I ran one ART course during the season. Thank you, Jackie, for giving your time for this invaluable course where candidates gain strong knowledge around emergency care and the use of oxygen.

Silver Medallions IRB Drivers and IRB Crew

David Price, James Crittenden and a number of other Club members spent significant time over winter training IRB Crew and Driver candidates.

This dedication from both trainers and Club members ensured we had replenished ranks of IRB drivers in particular. There were very many cold mornings and even colder candidates and trainers.

Heritage NSW Blue Plaque

Commemorating Duke Kahanamoku Freshwater SLSC was honoured to be presented with the first ever Heritage NSW Blue Plaque on the Northern Beaches. Over 700 locations in NSW were nominated and in the first year of the program 21 were presented. The Freshwater plaque commemorates Duke Kahanamoku, the Hawaiian swimmer and surfer who had a major influence on Australian surf culture. The plaque was unveiled on Monday 17th October by James Griffin, NSW Minister for Environment and Heritage.

Duke is credited with popularising surfing in Australia after performing surfing demonstrations more than 100 years ago, right here on the Northern Beaches in the summer of 1914/15.

On Christmas Eve and on 10 January 1915, using a hand-crafted board made of local sugar pine, he surfed at Freshwater Beach. This same board is on display in the Heritage Room at the Club.

In 2015 there was extensive celebrations around the 100th Anniversary of Duke's surfing demonstrations at Freshwater, and it was fitting that one of the Duke's Day Co-founders, Naomi Wilson, unveiled the plaque with the Minister.

Michael Reagan and representatives from the Freshwater Boardriders Inc, and the Freshwater Longboard Club attended along with Freshwater SLSC members. This was very much a community event.

Remembrance Day Ceremony Jacka Park 11 November 2022

On Remembrance Day, a number of Club members attended the Remembrance Service held at Jacka Park. The Memorial Garden and Wall of Remembrance commemorates those who have served in conflicts in which Australia has been involved.



Situated at the corner of Wyndora Avenue & Oliver Street, Freshwater, it features a flagpole, "wall of remembrance" and plaques in a formal garden formed by brick terraces at the western side of Jacka Park. An earlier memorial obelisk is incorporated in a new garden area.

The memorial garden was first opened in 1979. The garden and wall of remembrance were upgraded by the Harbord RSL sub-Branch and Warringah Council as part of the Australia Remembers campaign and opened on the 20th August 1995.

Further upgrades have been undertaken by Northern Beaches Council and the Harbord RSL branch in 2022 and these were formally opened at the Service.

Anzac Day

The service was concluded by a thrilling and very loud low fly over by a F35 jet! Members then enjoyed a catch up at the Club to celebrate ANZAC day and the end of the patrol season.

Facilities Report



Thave thoroughly enjoyed my first year in the role of Director Facilities and feel we have seen some improvements in the Club building and operations over that period.

Approaching the role with a fresh outlook, the intention was to work closely with the Caretakers, Ken and Janet Rickard, the Surf Club Manager, Renee McGettigan, members of the EC, assemble a new Building Panel, engage with Club members as much as possible, and engage with Council. It feels like the approach was successful with much broader engagement, a number of projects completed, and some new initiatives put in place from an operational perspective.

I'd like to thank Ken and Janet for their ongoing work as Caretakers. It's a very demanding role, requiring attention 24/7, and they have kept the Club in a clean and functional state for their entire term. They have acted in the best interests of the Club at all times and will move out of the role in June 2023.

After an exhaustive selection process, the Club has offered the position of Caretaker for the next two years to Jamie and Tracy Scott. We welcome them to the Club.

Renee McGettigan filled the new role of Surf Club Manager, Renee contributed enormously to the day to day operation of the facility and shared the burden with the Caretakers. I'd like to thank Renee for her work and look forward to building on the role that she has played over the next season.

The EC has been very supportive of me and the initiatives and ideas I have put to them. They have approved expenditure for various projects around the Club and any operational expenditure without hesitation. This is a great outcome for Club members and I'd like to thank the EC for their unwavering support.

We reintroduced the Building Panel this year, and held a monthly meeting. Steve Bennett, Linda Wiadrowski, and Maurice Mandalinic gave up their time and volunteered to sit on the panel. Thanks to all of you for your ideas, contribution and support over the year. A new Club member, Andrew Reed, joined the panel late in the year, and I look forward to Andrew's contribution next year.

Club members have participated more this year, which was a goal of mine at the start of the year. Creating a culture that we all own the Club and we should all take an interest in 'our house' can be powerful and result in a better environment for all Club members. Early in the year we ran a working bee followed by a BBQ, and the turn out of Club members was fantastic. Various Club members have assisted individually in a range of roles, but I will mention each later in the report.

Northern Beaches Council must be thanked for their continued support of the Club and their continued maintenance and work they carry out in and around the Club. Being a Council owned building, there is an agreement in place that sets out what Council are responsible for and what the Club is responsible for. All the external maintenance of the building and the parkland including the dunes and beach are managed by Council. That explains why some of those small things Club members see unattended to take a while to have rectified. The process through Council just takes a bit longer than if the Club was dealing with it themselves. Having said that, Council always react to any emergency or critical matter and our thanks must go out to all at Council. Finally, there still exists some confusion around responsibilities for various areas of operation within the Club as it affects the operation of the building. The fact that many EC members are new to the committee explains this in part, but I hope that work is done through the off season to review responsibilities and clear up any of the uncertainties that exist at present.

A decision was taken this year to approach the facilities portfolio in two parts: Operational, and Projects.

Operational

An attempt was made this year to develop a more strategic approach to maintenance and upkeep of the building. An action list was created at the start of the year and was shared between the Caretaker, Surf Club Manager and Building Panel. This Action list collected all matters that had been raised as requiring attention in the Club over the previous year that remained unattended to. A call was then put to members inviting them to advise of any items they saw that required attention

around the Club. Little response came from Club members, but the list was a good ongoing tool used by myself and the Surf Club Manager to track outstanding building matters. The list also provided the Caretakers with an action list for their own attention. Over the course of the year most items on the list were actioned, but a few that require Council's input remain outstanding. It is hoped this idea will be expanded next year with some form of members mail box where any issues can be logged by members for attention by the Caretaker.

We did not succeed in creating a programmed maintenance plan as had been hoped. This would assist in budgeting for expenditure on the Club and provide more structure around the maintenance work that can be coordinated with Club resources and Council. We plan to work on this with the new Caretaker over the coming year.

It is recognised that the building is in need of constant attention. It sits in an extremely harsh environment regularly battered by storms. Sometimes this leads to circumstances where the Caretaker needs some help to bring the Club and surrounds back to its expected condition. I hold a view that Club members can play a part in the situation, and Club working bees are the ideal way to assist the Caretaker, but also engage Club members with each other. One working bee was held in August of 2022 and most felt the day was a huge success, cleaning up areas much in need of attention, and doing some 'heavy lifting' for the Caretaker. It is intended to hold a few more of these next year, in particular before the season starts in late 2023, and before the start of the Championship carnivals that see Freshwater hosting part of the State Championships again.



Projects

Bar

The Club was successful in obtaining a State Government grant for \$150,000 for the construction of a bar. The Club was required to fund \$25,000 so the total cost was to be \$175,000 and the works came in just under that amount. At the time of writing this report the final claim has not yet been submitted, awaiting reconciliation of the costs and reports on completed work.

The works were designed initially by Club member and architect Maurice Mandalinic, but the initial design proved to be unaffordable. Value engineering was conducted to reduce the scope and create some cost savings while ensuring the functionality of the bar was improved. A final scope and contract was agreed with building company Warrane Pty Ltd, a local Freshwater builder with hospitality and bar experience. The whole building process was delivered smoothly with limited disruption to Club operations and was opened for use in early December 2022.

Thankyou to APG who provided Project Management services to run the project at no cost to the Club. (Michael Kirkby, Facilities Director, is a Director of that business)

Thanks also to Dave Inches, Club member, who has agreed to act as the Club's Bar Manager. Dave was involved in the early commissioning of the bar and has subsequently taken over the operational management of the great new facility. His dedication and commitment to the new bar has been outstanding and he should be congratulated and thanked for his work.

Foyer

Local member James Griffin facilitated a State Government Community Building Partnership grant for the Club that allowed for improvements to the entry foyer area. The entire area was painted, new lighting was installed, the floor tiling was repaired and improved, new furniture was installed, all combining to make the area look fresh and inviting for Club members and hirers alike. These works were completed in January 2023.



Gym

Club member Alex Malm agreed to act as Gym Manager during the year. In that capacity he ensured the gym was maintained and kept tidy. In addition, Alex developed some plans for improvements to the gym after engaging with Club members and specifically known gym users. Phase 1 of that plan was implemented in February 2023 with some new equipment purchased for members use. Thanks to Alex for all his work on the gym. It's a great start to what will be ongoing improvements to the gym.

Courtyard

The courtyard at the rear of the Club used to be frequently occupied by Club members as it was a beautiful space for relaxing and catching up with friends while being protected from the wind and elements. However the space became unusable when the Kiosk expanded into the Club kitchen and started using the courtyard area for storage and rubbish. A small project was completed in March where the area was cleaned up, the walls and pavers were pressure washed, plants were planted, and furniture was procured and placed in the area.

The final element to be resolved is the relocation of the bins, which is waiting on the Surf Sport sections to reconcile craft and equipment in the basement to free up some space for the relocation of the bins to the lockable area near the driveway.

Major Project

Work was started in 2011 on a masterplan for the Club building to make improvements for Club members that would reposition the Club for the next 30-40 years. Members were engaged, Council was consulted and plans were advanced to a stage where a Development Application was being finalised at the time. The incoming Executive Committee at the time voted to place the work on the masterplan on hold and to abandon the idea of a major altogether.

In the meantime Council embarked on their own masterplan, developing a design for the public recreation areas that sit behind the beach between the headlands to South Curl Curl and Queenscliff. Significant public consultation took place and Council adopted a plan for works to that precinct to be delivered over several years as budget became available.

In early 2022 an incident occurred at the Club where some antisocial behaviour led to damage being caused to the public amenities currently being housed in the surf Club building. Various meetings were held at the time with Council representatives including the General Manager where an agreement was reached to fast track the construction of new public amenities in the park and remove the amenities from the surf Club building. That agreement included a commitment from Council to fund the costs of completing the previously commenced DA

plans for redevelopment of the surf Club building.

With Council's commitment, the current Executive Committee agreed to recommence planning of the masterplan and the lodging of a DA with Council. It was agreed to simply pick up the previously prepared scheme and complete the reports and plans needed to lodge an application as soon as possible. Further Club member engagement will follow once the application is approved before detailed plans for construction are commenced. Council have honoured their commitment and have engaged all the consultants at their cost. Ordinarily Council would run this process themselves and just engage with the Club as required, but in this case Council have agreed to allow us to run the process ourselves with their support and coordination. This allows the Club to maintain control of the process and the outcome. A great result for Club members.

At the time of preparation of this report the plans are well advanced but the DA has not yet been lodged. Council has run with the Club's recommendations and has engaged all consultants necessary to complete the design and prepare the DA package including the Club's architect Bonus Architects, who are playing a lead role. Other consultants include BCA/DDA, Heritage, Tree Management, Coastal Assessment, Traffic, Quantity Surveyor, Geotechnical Engineer, Planner, Engineer, Landscape, and Flora and Fauna. It is expected a DA will be lodged before June 30 with approval likely before the end of 2023.

The relationship with Council has improved through the design development process, as they are concurrently finalising their own plans for the parkland including the new public toilets. In most cases the same consultants are been used across both projects and so designs are sympathetic to each other and economies will be gained through the construction phase of both projects. The coordination of the designs of the Club building and the parkland has led to a great outcome for Club members.

The design of the parkland and recreations spaces immediately surrounding the Club will allow café and hospitality spaces being run from the Club building to spill out onto the parkland creating a modern, attractive, and very user friendly precinct.

Once the DA is approved the Club can start to finalise its funding plan and formally seek grants and support needed to fund the building works. Council has already committed to match any funds the Club raises for the works.

Other key points were:

 Access to new opportunities for training was positive.

- There were a number of activities that people would be interested in getting involved in.

We will explore activities such as:

- Group fitness training
- Swim coaching
- Yoga/pilates

Interestingly, nearly 70% said we didn't do enough social events. Most were interested in drinks and parties! Most people thought the Gym needed to be upgraded.

Together with the upgrade of the Club Bar, we initiated a number of social gatherings. At the same time, Alex Malm has been working on improving the Gym (no excuses then!). So getting fitter and enjoying social engagements will be on the rise – but we can do more and plan to have a social committee to plan events through.

This year we welcomed 517 Nippers to the beach. Rebuilding after several years of COVID interruptions, this represented a healthy increase of around 10% on the prior year. Creating Tomorrow's LifesaversAgainst the goal we set ourselves – we successfully graduated 20 U14's through



the Surf Rescue Certificate Program (SRC) most of whom have now moved on to be Patrolling members, exercising the skills they have built up over 9 years in the Nippers program. A big call out to Lindsay Davis, John Goldrick, Michiel Tops and Kelly Dobrow for their support in training our Under 14s through the SRC program.

More broadly, our Under 14 class was exceptional and made the Club very proud this year. After a very close selection process, Jasper Pinnuck and Flo Veitch were selected as Junior Club Captains. Jasper and Flo led our

junior Club members and represented the Club passionately and respectably through the season. It started with an Acknowledgement of Country on the first day of Nippers and through to leading our State Team and wrapping up the season at our Under 14 Graduation Dinner in April.

We were also lucky to be represented by Ewan Humphreys (U14) in this years' Junior Lifesaver of the Year program. The program is about helping promising future lifesavers hone their leadership skills while learning more about the Surf Lifesaving movement. Ewan was Highly Commended at the Branch event and was lucky enough to be chosen to represent Northern Beaches Branch at the State JLOTY event. We are very proud of Ewan's achievements.

A Fun and Inclusive Sunday Nippers Program

Having fun and being inclusive for everyone, whether competitive or not, is a core part of what we aspire for our Nippers program. This year we focused on ensuring the program was fun for everyone irrespective of whether kids (and parents) were motivated by competition or other aspects of the Nippers program.

Freshwater Nippers



This year we had 33 age managers, looking after over 500 Nippers each week, working through the program. While our Age Managers come from all walks of life and bring a diversity of experience and background, they all brought a passion for leading and teaching our Nippers about surf safety and beach skills to help build confidence and competence of all Nippers on the beach and in the water. Without these dedicated individuals, we couldn't run Nippers. On behalf the Club and all the Nipper children, thank you.

Some of the highlights from the season included:

- With the COVID years almost behind us, we re-energised our Pre Season Camp – welcoming over 40 Nippers and their families to Ingenia One Mile Beach in September for a 2 day camp to engage in some pre-season fun and games and building the camaraderie within and across age groups.
- With the support of our amazing
 Freshwater SLSC Education team, we
 broadened our core Nipper program
 beyond beach and water events to
 also include more formalised lifesaving
 training in the form of Resuscitation,
 First Aid, Signals and Radio training
 for age groups U11 and up. This has,
 and will continue to augment the focus
 on surf skills which is the heart of
 creating tomorrow's lifesavers.
- We welcomed Channel 7 Weekend Sunrise and Primo to Nippers to share what Sunday morning Nippers is all about. A highlight of the season for many of our Nippers was meeting James Tobin from Channel 7, and waving to the television viewers across Australia while proudly showing off the surf and beach skills they had learned.
- Our Under 9's were especially lucky to trial Take 3 For the Sea program educating our Nippers about plastic pollution and investigating the effects of plastic pollution on our very own beach at Freshwater.



- To celebrate the holiday period, we once again hosted our famous Twilight Nippers just before Christmas. While it was a wintery day, the Nippers really lit up with beach games and of course welcoming Santa's arrival on the ATV.
- The Nipper Challenge Camp, held during the summer holiday period attracted cover 50 Nippers to the 3 day program that covered beach and water skills as well a first aid and broader surf lifesaving skills. Many parents took advantage of the opportunity to work remotely in the Club on these days while their Nippers were participating in the camp activities on the beach. The winning team over the 3 days were lucky enough to receive fantastic prize bags with goodies from our generous sponsors and community partners, including Titan Ford, Harbord Hotel, Grill'd, Freshie Chickens and Mr Gelato.
- We inaugurated our "Fun Junior"



KELLY MARSH WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ACHIEVEMENT

In september 2022 Kelly traveled to Riccione Italy to compete in the world life saving championships. Between the ages of 19-22, Kelly served as an ADF reservist and was chosen to represent Invictus Australia.

In a world-first, Invictus Australia, with the support of Surf Life Saving Australia, has sought and been granted permission by the International Life Saving Federation to enter a combined military veteran surf life saving team into the Riccione 2022 Lifesaving World Championships. Historically, individual athletes have competed under their Club cap at this pinnacle event. Now for the first time, Team Veteran Australia entered as a team made up of military personnel from different surf Clubs around Australia competing under a single cap.

Kelly competed in many events, Pool, board, ski and beach sprint. Kelly was successful winning 3 worlds medals including: 3rd 50m pool obstacle rescue relay 3rd Ski relay

1st 40-45 Single ski

The following day we arrived on our home beach away from shark infested waters in aim to back up the successful results.



It also marks a rare feat whereby a mother, father and children have united as a team to win an Australian Gold medal. In liaison with Club statistician Wayne Freakley, I would go as far as to say

this is the first time this has been achieved in the sports history. Overall, these results were very pleasing and a testament to the commitment demonstrated throughout the season. It is now our task to return to the turf in 2024 to defend these victories.

I would personally like to thank all those who supported our squad at any point throughout the season. To those who came up to the tent and said G'day, or to those who gave us a wave whilst on the beach training. We pride ourselves on being a welcoming group and are always happy to embrace and provide support. His numeracy skills and ability to conduct an audit go a long way towards ensuring all teams receive accurate results and depart the beach sooner rather than later.

To our coaches Alan Burns, Chris Tyrrell and Wayne Freakley, a huge thank you. Your dedication to the sport is an inspiration for us competitors and your ability to organise training sessions despite numerous commitments amongst the squad has enabled the season to flow seamlessly.

To my fellow competitors, it is a privilege to be able to compete at such a high level that facilitates success whilst also being a part of a group that has so much fun. For me there will always be more to our participation than simply competing in the event itself and that is built upon teamwork, mateship and amusement. I will look back on this season as a successful one and hope to see you all back again on the beach next summer.
