



t gives me great pleasure to present to the members of the Freshwater Surf Life Saving club the 115th Annual Report.

There are many key highlights for the season, but the highpoint has been the outstanding number of patrol hours that the patrolling members of the club have volunteered this season. Our patrol numbers continue to grow and the number of new awards this season are a testament to our members wanting to learn and participate in the latest education modules.

It's often said that good leadership comes from someone that you can trust and is able to extract the full potential from their team members. David Price as our club captain is an outstanding leader who over the past season has inspired his Patrol Captains who in turn influence their individual patrols.

David has just clicked over 2000man hours of club and volunteer patrol hours since joining the club in 2009 and regularly is called out by Surfcom for out of hours rescues and emergency situations. David, thank you for your mentoring, loyalty, and your dedication to the role of Freshwater Club Captain. To support the patrolling numbers and the club's education process Kelly Dobrow our Director of Education and her loyal panel of educators and assessors have also done a magnificent job this season. Providing the resources to make sure that all active members are up to date with SLSA education policies and procedures.

Kelly has spent hundreds of volunteer hours ensuring that the club meets its obligations and as part of the education process, provide an important pathway from educating new members to boost our Patrol numbers.

Kelly has also played an important role with our very competitive Lifesaving Teams throughout the season, highlighted by winning the NSW State Lifesaving overall point score.

Richard Hawtin our Executive Officer has also provided great support over the past season. Richard still regularly patrols, filling in when needed as well as fulfilling his normal patrol obligations. Richard has also provided great leadership to our administration and office staff and when required has manned the office to maintain the club's day to day procedures when



needed. We also welcomed Carla Thornton in January this year as our new club administration officer.

Richard is also the current club licensee and as such is responsible for the probity around the operational issues for all functions at the club.

A huge thanks to David Inches who manages the club bar and facilities and to Sylvia Meszaros our functions coordinator for their collaboration with Richard over the past season.

I also want to give a shout out to Richard for the role that he played in delivering the clubs annual open surf carnival as well as the other club events that he participates. What was pleasing for me personally was to see the junior Freshwater members competing at this year's Australian Junior Championships and competing in several Australian junior

finals. Well done to all involved and a detailed account of their performances is part of the JAC report in this year's Annual Report.

Brian Green OAM


Brian Green was a life-long resident of the Northern Beaches where he served as a Warringah Councillor (1980-85, 1987-99), Deputy Shire President (1981-82, 1984-85, 1988-89), Shire President (1991-93) and Mayor of Warringah Council (1993-95).

In 2002, Mr Green was awarded the title of 'Emeritus Mayor' in acknowledgement of his service in the role of Mayor and was in office for more than two terms.

He played an important role in the initiation and delivery of a range of projects and programs that were of benefit to the community including playing an integral role in the Freshwater Surf Life Saving clubs new building and community centre that opened in 1984.

Brian was a member of the Freshwater club from 1983 to 2003 and served as our Honorary Vice President for a number of seasons. In 1995, Brian was awarded the Paul Harris Rotary International Fellow and a 50-year service award for service to the Australian Surf Lifesaving Association by the Freshwater SLSC. Executive Officer's Report

t was my pleasure to be re-elected Executive Officer at the June 2023 AGM for Season 2023-2024. This season, continued to provide an opportunity for the Club to approach tasks in a dynamic manner in order to remind, refresh, stimulate and retain club members of the opportunities that being a member of Freshwater SLSC provides. For all community bodies it continues to be hard to retain membership numbers for the pre-covid period.

Season 2023-2024 saw fewer initiatives being planned and achieved after quite a surge in the previous season as reported in the 2022-2023 Annual Report. The key initiatives this year were; 1) Communication to the Club members and the local community around the plans for the Freshwater Reserve Masterplan (Building Development); 2) Life Members lunch; 3) Replacement and upgrade for the Gym equipment; 4) Kitchen items stored in the new Catering Room.

The newly elected Executive Committee also held in August 2023 a Strategy Session with the goal of developing a Club Masterplan to tie in with local council initiatives for the upgrade of the buildings and associated Reserve Area. For an extended period of this Season, the Club was without a nominated Treasurer, many thanks for Paula Cradock for providing the "book keeping" role with the payment and issues of invoice whilst a Treasurer "came on board". A big welcome to Michael Rees-Evans for taking on this important role from March onwards.

During the year a General Meeting was held on the 17th December 2023 with the aim of communicating to our membership the implemented and proposed initiatives for not only this season but looking forward to 2025 and onwards. Presentations were made by the President, and the portfolios of, Captain, Facilities and Education. Further comments were also provided by the Executive Committee members in attendance.

Membership

This season continued to see an overall increase in Club membership. Our Nipper intake was very healthy with over 685 registrations, a significant increase on last season. Our active patrolling numbers continue to be an issue that requires continuous management, many thanks to David Price (Club Captain) for taking new approaches to ensuring attendance of patrolling members at the beach.

A similar significant increase was also seen in relation to nipper parent members. All other categories of membership remained relatively stable with small increases or decreases in line with usual variations.

Executive Committee

At the 2023 Annual General Meeting, there were several new members elected to positions on this season's Executive Committee – Kelly Dobrow (Director of Education), Tamsyn Curley (Youth Development). Other existing Executive Members retained their positions.

At the AGM Michael Raymer advised he would "step down" from the role of Director of Finance on 30th September 2023. Attempts to find a replacement concluded in March 2024 with the appointment of Michael Rees-Evans into the role. There were no other changes during the season.

Club Governance

In accordance with the Constitution, existing By-Laws were reviewed by the Club's Governance Panel during the August – September period to confirm their ongoing relevance. All proposed changes to the By-Laws were approved by the Executive Committee without dissent.

Club Office Staff

This season saw the resignation in November 2023 of Renee McGettigan from the role of Surf Club Manager. The requirements of the role were re-assessed and in January 2024 the Club welcomed Carla Thornton to the role of Surf Club Administrator. The Surf Club Manager/Administrator is the key public and Member contact and is responsible for office management, membership registration, communication, facilities, shop Management, accounts and liaising closely with the club's caretakers and event and functions co-ordinator.

We also welcomed Natalie Jander as an Administration Assistant on a casual basis for the first half of the Season.

The role of Functions Manager continued with Sylvia Meszaros is continuing to undertake that role and in the short time she has been doing so there has been a marked improvement in function income for the Club. In addition to these, a casual Administration Assistant was employed to support the Surf Club Manager through the busy parts of the season supporting registrations in the August/September timeframe.

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General Administration

The Club welcomed Paula Cradock in the role of Book Keeper on a casual basis (commencing October 2023) to provide support to the financial aspects of the Club whilst a Director of Finance was sourced.

For Season 2023-2024 the Club reverted back to the previous model under the guidance and direction of the Surf Club Office team and EC endorsed Merchandise Plan, the purpose of which to establish budget, determine order requirements and stock planning. There remains a pressing need to identify someone who is willing to take on the role of operating the Club's Retail Store under the management of the Surf Club Administrator.

Dave Inches continued to develop his role as Bar Operations Manager. I am indebted to him, as the formal Licencee for the Club, of his management of the bar and ensuring the designated protocols are being followed. He has spent considerable time ensuring the bar is fully operational to support Club member activities as well as the formal functions that are booked to utilise the bar.

Season 2023-2024 saw the first season of Jamie and Tracey Scott as Club caretakers. The Club thanks them for all their hard work and attention to detail around the club. The building has been kept clean and presentable throughout the season, and Jamie's measured and consistent approach has successfully managed any issues thrown at him.

The Executive Officer role provides a vital role in the provision of administrative support across the spectrum of Club activities. It is a demanding position and relies heavily on the support of a broader team and especially the Surf Club Manager/ Administrator (SCM) to effectively fulfil its role.

In that regard a huge thank you to Renee McGettigan and Carla Thornton throughout the season. During the post-season there will be going review of the club administration responsibilities and process and identify improvements for implementation in Season 2024/25.

In support of the SCM role, Nat Jander and Janine Fahey provided administration support at times through the season.

Thank you also to Dave Inches for taking on the role of Bar Operations Manager and Sylvia Meszaros for her support in the role of Functions Manager. Also, to Alex Malm and Kevin Dyer for taking on Gym and BBQ management responsibilities.

Finally thank you also to our caretakers Jamie and Tracey Scott. There has always been a close working relationship between the office staff and the caretaker and the Scott family have provided tremendous support throughout the season.

The summer months are continuing to prove a very trying period for the caretakers as the Freshwater Reserve became the popular nighttime place to let off steam. The Club is grateful to the caretakers for care and diligence they showed during this period.

Finance Report

am pleased to report that the club has finished with a strong financial result for the year, with a surplus of \$71,334 (after non-cash depreciation of \$59,979), an improvement from a surplus of \$42,421 last year.

The result exceeded last year due to greater activity overall, including increases in Sponsorships and Donations and Grants (up \$9k), Junior Subscriptions (up \$19k), Clothing sales (up \$19k), Kiosk rental (up \$12k), Hall Hire (up \$4k) and Interest Income (up \$11k).

This was partially offset by reductions in Sponsorship (down \$34k), Barney Mullins (poor conditions) (down \$4k), Senior Memberships (down \$5k) and Hall Hire (down \$8k).

Overall expense levels were generally contained despite cost increases in running costs such as utilities (up \$7k) building and facility costs, administration and support, insurances, and similar.

The stronger revenue position has allowed for increased investments in Juniors, patrol equipment and uniforms and the cash surplus has allowed for investments in new assets including a new SSV (\$29k) and minor Security System updates (\$3k) with additional savings towards our building fund.

Revenue has increased overall by \$31,031 or 5% on last year. This has mainly been driven by the generous support of our sponsors and general activity increases across several areas of the club post covid. The club continues to be heavily reliant on Sponsorships, Donations and Grants to support our mission; "To ensure no lives are lost while on patrol, assist members to achieve their full potential and support the community" and I would like to take this opportunity to thank our generous sponsors, donors and supporters for their ongoing support which allows the club to continue to provide first class Lifesaving, First Aid, Education, Training, Equipment, Facilities, Juniors and Surf Sport programs to our members.

Expenses overall have decreased by \$2,118 or 0.4% on last year. As there is every year there has been a level of variability of expenses across the various activities of the club, based on activity. The focus of discretionary expenditure this year has been to



invest to ensure that our lifesaving, education, junior activities, and facilities are the best that they can be with the available resources. The club, like the broader economy, has seen general cost increases across most areas of the club's activities. The focus will continue to be on maintaining control of our costs as we move into the FY25 season.

Balance Sheet The club generated an overall



increase in cash of \$93,239 to a total of \$656,2052, of which \$400,000 (an increase of \$100,000 from 2023) is invested in a term deposits, including savings toward the future master building plan, with \$36,073 spent on fixed asset investments.

The following audited accounts provide a more detailed breakdown of revenue and expenditure as well as the assets and liabilities of the club. I would like to thank my Executive Committee colleagues for their support and the tireless work they do in the background to keep our club running, and for their help with Michael Raymer and Paula Craddock in transitioning the Treasurer's role from one Michael R to another.

The financial report covers Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc (the Club) as an individual entity. Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Club, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The principal activities of the Club for the year ended 30 April 2024 were providing surf lifesaving services.

The functional and presentation currency of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by those charged with governance on 19 June 2024.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that comply with Australian Accounting Standards – Simplified Disclosures and the Australian Charities and Not for profits Commission Act 2012. These financial statements also comply with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW).

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

New and Amended Standards Adopted

The Club has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Club.

2 Summary of Material Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Write downs of inventory values are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

2 Summary of Material Accounting Policies

(d) Revenue and other income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Principal revenue streams are recognised as follows:

Membership fees

Fees are recognised when payments are received. Membership is not granted or renewed until subscriptions are paid. Memberships are renewed annually and are in line with the Club's financial year and therefore, recognised as revenue in the financial year. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years. Membership subscriptions received in advance are carried forward as a liability at the end of the reporting period.

Sale of goods and equipment

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods or equipment to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when all performance obligations are satisfied.

Events and Training Income

Revenue from events and training are recognised on completion of the event, when performance obligations are satisfied. Until then, payments received are recognised as deferred income.

Sponsorships

Sponsorships from participating parties are recognised when received and are aligned to the financial year of the Club. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years.

Other income

Interest is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method.

Government grants are recognised on an accrual basis at the time that the eligibility conditions have been fulfilled by the Club.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Grants related to assets

Government grants related to assets, including non-monetary grants at fair value are presented in the statement of financial position by deducting the grant from the carrying amount of the related asset.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Club, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Those charged with governance make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Inventories

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine inventory obsolescence. During the year, management has written off inventory based on the age and the model of the clothing stocks that in their view, are unsellable. During the year, there were no stocks written off. (2023: \$2,892)

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Club Captain's Report

reshwater SLSC has completed its 115th consecutive season of patrolling without any deaths between the flags. No other Surf Lifesaving Club in Australia can match that record.

This is not an idle boast.

This season Patrols 4 and 16 carried out critical rescues that undoubtedly saved the lives of swimmers who had been swept out of the flags. But for our Members being on the spot, responsive and skilled, the unfortunate loss of lives on the Australian coast this summer would have been even higher.

Alex Chan and his Patrol 16 also deserve a special mention for their expertise in dealing with the two teenagers washed off Freshwater headland in February 2024. In what was undoubtedly a stressful situation, the patrol was instrumental in getting the RWC launched quickly and then treated the family and friends of the teenagers who suffered cuts and lacerations after being knocked over on the rocks by the wave surge.

The Royal Life Saving Summer Drowning Toll recorded 99 drowning deaths across Australia between 1 December 2023 and 29 February 2024[ref]. Those numbers constituted a 10% increase on the 90 drowning deaths recorded last summer and a 5% increase on the 5-year average of 94 drowning deaths. The fact that Freshwater SLSC is not part of those figures reflects the quality of our patrolling members and the quality of our trainers.

SRC

Bronze

We had several Bronze courses run through the season including an SRC to Bronze transition course for those members who already held their SRC award. In total we had 34 successful Bronze candidates including several 15 year olds and some adults. Trainers involved in these Bronze courses included Belinda Dobson, Luke Thornton, Tahlia Dearden, Tom Duffy and Andi Malm.

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART)

An ART course was run by Lindsay Davis, Jackie Phillips, Belinda Dobson, Sharon Johnson and myself at the same time as a Bronze course. This season we trialed running a First Aid course, a Bronze course and ART course at the same time with the same training group. The result was that at all candidates received 3 awards at the end of the course being a First Aid Certificate, Bronze Medallion and ART award. This worked very well and resulted in 10 very qualified new patrolling members. We will be doing this again next season. We also ran some ART update courses to ensure members with an old ART award were updated to the new ART award. With the use of oxygen removed from the Bronze



qualification, it is more important than ever to have more ART qualified patrolling members.

Silver Medallion IRB Crew and IRB Drivers

David Price, James Crittenden, John Lo Schiavo and Jordan Dobson ran 2 IRB crew courses and 1 IRB drivers course through the cold winter months and into the actual season as well. We have 5 new IRB drivers and 21 new IRB crew. All have been allocated patrols and were welcomed with open arms as we had limited IRB qualified members. Another IRB Drivers course has just started in April 2024 with 7 enthusiastic candidates.

Silver Medallion Patrol Captain

This newly modified course run over 2 days was completed by 3 Freshwater members this season being Grace Seaglove, James Crittenden and myself. Having completed the course, I would highly recommend it to all existing and future patrol captains.

Gold Medallion

Congratulations to Alexander Jacobs who successfully gained his Gold Medallion this season. This is an extremely physical award requiring the candidate to swim, paddle, run and complete a complex patient scenario including a rescue and first aid.

First Aid

A first aid qualification is useful in all situations, not just on the beach. We

were lucky enough to have Cheryl White (from the Australian Lifesaving Academy) and Herve Vichemont (from SNB) present some First Aid courses at Freshwater this season. 45 members completed the First Aid courses, some being brand new members who all enjoyed Cheryl's entertaining teaching with other candidates renewing their existing First Aid qualifications.

Rescue Water Craft (Jetski)

Well done to Benjamin Brink who successfully completed his RWC training and has completed several patrols on SNB Support Ski 4 stationed at Freshwater as well as acting as water safety for some SNB events.

Trainers and Assessors This season the Freshwater education team welcomed Luke Thornton as an endorsed Trainer. John Goldrick who has been a trainer for many years received his Assessor qualification.

We also welcomed 4 new probationary trainers with Mark Gilbert, Kirra Budd, Joshua Orr and Isabelle Staph-Giannakis.



Take 3 for the Sea



Facilities Report

eason 2023/24 saw a period of consolidation of the work done in the previous seasons with our caretakers settling into their routine.

Id like to thank Jamie and Tracy for all their hard work and attention to detail around the club. The building has been kept clean and presentable throughout the season, and Jamie's measured and consistent approach has successfully managed any issues thrown at him.

Id also like to thank Carla who has taken on the Club Administration role. The coordination between Carla and Jamie allows a seamless approach to the club buildings operation and maintenance. The Building Panel comprised the same members as the previous year, Linda Wiadrowski, Maurice Mandalinic, Andrew Reed and Stephen Bennett. I thank them for their involvement. Their assistance and guidance has been welcomed throughout the season. Having several sets of eyes on the facility always ensures a better outcome. The ÉC has continued their support of the initiatives presented to them in relation to the club building and I thank them for their support.

Club members engaged very early in the season with a working bee arranged. This again saw a great turn out from club members who assisted to do those larger jobs that are hard for the caretakers to manage on their own. I would love to see more input from club members. What needs improvement, what needs repair or replacement? The more input



the Building Panel can receive from members the better the facility we can provide.

Finally, to Northern Beaches Council we say thankyou. The support you provide and the maintenance you carry out on some parts of the club building as well as the surrounding parkland is appreciated. Being a Council owned building, there is an agreement in place that sets out what Council are responsible for and what the Club is responsible for. All the external maintenance of the building and the parkland including the dunes and beach are managed by Council. That explains why some of those small things Club members see unattended to take a while to have rectified. The process through Council just takes a little longer than if the Club was dealing with it themselves. Having said that, Council always reacts to any emergency or critical matter and our thanks must go out to all at Council.

PROJECTS

Gym

The Gym has had a refresh over the course of the season. Tim Hollingsworth has acted as Gym Manager and has consolidated the ideas previously devised for improvements. Thanks for your work Tim. New equipment has been purchased including a rowing machine and exercise bike in addition to various items like rollers, kettle bells, and skipping ropes. The gym is in good condition now and is well used by members.

Courtyard

The work to the courtyard was completed in the previous season, but the bins are still stored there, leaving the area unattractive and underutilised. The work to rationalise the racing boards in the basement has not yet been completed and so the bins have not been able to be relocated over the course of the season. Hopefully this can be done over the winter off season this year, allowing the courtyard to be available for members next season.

Catering storage

Progressively over many ears, the kiosk operator has taken more and more space in the kitchen at the rear of the club. Once upon a time the club had exclusive use of this kitchen and all the club's own equipment was stored there and easily accessible. The luxury of this space is no longer available, and the club's own catering equipment for events has been largely disbursed around the club. Kevin Dyer agreed to act in a Club Catering Coordinator role, and worked with the Building Panel to devise a plan for the consolidation of all the club's equipment and locate it all in the one safe, secure and accessible location.

The area used for storage of the tables and chairs used in the halls was rationalised and some simple building work was carried out to create this space. The area has been occupied now for over half the season and the catering function within the club is working well.

At the same time we arranged for a sink serviced by hot water to be installed in the rear courtyard to allow our equipment to be washed up after club events and not interfere with the kiosk and kitchen operations. This is also working well.

MAJOR PROJECT

Work on the major club project continued throughout the season 2023/24.

As reported in last years annual report, Council agreed to fund the costs for consultants needed to complete and secure development approval for the project, as well as offering to waive the application fee for the DA.

The club's architect, Bonus and Associates, coordinated the necessary consultants and prepared a budget for consultants fees of \$150,000, which was provided to Council before the work commenced. As is required, Council engaged the consultants directly, although they were instructed and led by Bonus and Associates and Michael Kirkby in a project management capacity representing the club.

The work required by the design consultants to have the DA lodged amounted to approximately \$90,000. After a period of design coordination and engagement with Council staff a DA was finally lodged on 18 August 2023. An application fee of \$21,464.75 was required, and Council informed the club that they will now not waive the fee, and expected it to be paid before any assessment would be commenced. After some negotiation Council agreed to commence assessment before the fee was paid, but as at the time of writing this report, the fee remains unpaid by the club.

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What we have seen since lodgement is a series of frustrating events typical of the assessment and approvals process following Planning laws that exist in NSW today. Because the building is owned by Council, Council is not allowed to be the consent authority for the approval. Accordingly, whilst the DA is lodged with Council, they have to outsource the assessment process to an independent planner, and then have the matter considered by an external planning panel set up by the NSW Department of Planning. The Property team at Council who look after the building are technically the building owner. They are not allowed to liaise or even engage with the assessments team. As you might imagine this creates a complicated and dysfunctional approach to the assessment and approval process. The matter was called before the Sydney North Planning Panel on 11 October 2023. The hearing was a preliminary one where the Panel offered comments and suggestions, but also requested some additional information.

After Council outsourced the assessment to an external consultant planner, a request for more information was issued on 16 November 2023. Consideration of this request led to the pricing of further work required by the consultant team that amounted to proposed costs of \$60,000. This proposed cost was issued to Council for their engagement of the consultants as required to respond to the request. Council ignored the guotes provided. The matter was called before the Council's Design and Sustainability Panel on 14 December 2023. A

request for additional information from that Panel was provided through a report issued by the Panel on 12 January 2024.

Council advised they will not be paying any additional money towards the application on 15 January 2024. Various meetings and conversations with Council officers about next steps followed through to April 2024 including meeting with the CEO, Director Planning, Director Property on 19 February 2024, a meeting with acting the Executive Manager Property and her team 20 March 2024, and discussions with the planner responsible for the assessment.

After a presentation to the EC and the Building Panel by Michael Kirkby at a special meeting held on 23 April 2024 it was resolved that the club would pay the application fee and pay

for the consultant costs to complete the DA. It was also decided at that meeting to take this matter to the membership for endorsement, and a Special General meeting of club members took place on Saturday 25 May, 2024. A motion was put to the membership as follows: That Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club endorse the expenditure of \$75,000 (incl. of GST) to fund additional information/reports from listed consultants to support the request for further information from Northern Beaches Council as part of their assessment of the development application.

Facilities Report

The membership in attendance passed the resolution unanimously. Work has now commenced again to progress the DA.

hat an amazing season we had at Freshwater Nippers in 2023-2024! We set out this year to continue building our Nipper program to achieve our overarching goal of creating the lifesavers of tomorrow through a fun and engaging program for both Nippers and their Parents / Carers. It has been a fantastic season of growth and achievement for our Nippers and we can't wait to see everyone back on the beach next season.

This year we welcomed 640 Nippers to the beach. This was a season of growth – with a healthy increase of over 20% from the prior year. This growth represents the ongoing rebuilding phase as we rebuild the program in the aftermath of the COVID years. We welcomed families from across the Northern Beaches and across Sydney, many of whom have returned to us this year as well as new members who joined us looking for a fun and an inclusive Nippers experience.

Creating Tomorrow's Lifesavers

Against the goal we set ourselves – we successfully graduated 21 U14's through the Surf Rescue Certificate Program (SRC) most of whom have now moved on to be Patrolling members, exercising the skills they have built up over 9 years in the Nippers program. A big call out to Kelly Dobrow, John Goldrich and Michiel Tops for their support in training our Under 14s through the SRC program.

We are proud of this year's class of Under 14s who demonstrated a great balance of having fun as a cohort, but reliably showing up each week to help provide water safety to younger age groups. This year's Junior Club Captains were Louis Stapf-Giannakis and Kayla Davies who together led our junior club members and represented the Club passionately and respectably through the season. Louis was announced as the Northern Beaches branch Junior Lifesaver of the Year (JLOTY) winner and we were proud to see Kayla win a silver medal at state in U14s flags. We look forward to seeing the U14s on patrol and moving into the senior section of the club in the years ahead.

A Fun and Inclusive Sunday Nippers Program

Having fun and being inclusive for everyone, whether competitive or not, is a core part of what we aspire for our Nippers program. This year we continued to focus on ensuring the program was fun for everyone irrespective of whether kids (and parents) were motivated by competition or other aspects of the Nippers program.

Of course, none of this could happen without the dedication and patience of our Age Management team. This year we had 42 age managers and age assistants, looking after over 600 Nippers each week and working through the SLSA learning program while ensuring all Nippers have fun and want to come back week after week. While our Age Managers come from all walks of life and bring a diversity of experience and background, they all brought a passion for leading and teaching our Nippers about surf safety and beach skills to help build confidence and competence of all Nippers on the beach and in the water. Without these dedicated individuals, we couldn't run Nippers. On behalf of the club and all the Nipper children, thank you.

Some of the highlights from the season included:

- We raised over \$2000 in our first ever pre-season Bunnings BBQ. Thanks to everyone who came out and cooked sausages or baked cakes for our fun fundraising event
- We continued the tradition of the Freshwater pre-season camp

 welcoming over 40 Nippers and their families to Ingenia OneMile Beach in September for our fun two-day camp to engage in some pre-season fun and games and to build the camaraderie within and across age groups. The sun was shining and the coaching crew really created a fun and learning environment.
- With the support of Kelly Dobrow and our amazing Freshwater SLSC Education team, we continued to broaden our core Nipper program to also include more formalised lifesaving training in the form of Resuscitation, First Aid, Signals and Radio training for age groups U11 and up. This continues to augment



the focus on surf skills which is the heart of creating tomorrow's lifesavers.

- Our Under 10's and Under 11s were privileged to again complete the "Take 3 For the Sea" program educating our Nippers about plastic pollution and investigating the effects of plastic pollution on our very own beach at Freshwater. We collected even more garbage off the beach and sand-dunes that we did last year.
- Twilight Nippers was bigger than ever – with the entire club invited to join the celebrations. The weather behaved itself and the kids especially enjoyed DJ Kit Kat and watching The Grinch on the big screen in the Kooloora Room. Of course, the highlight was welcoming Santa's arrival on the ATV.
- The Nipper Challenge Camp, held during the summer holiday period attracted over 50 Nippers to the 2 day program that covered beach and water skills as well as first aid and broader surf lifesaving skills. Many parents took advantage of the opportunity to work remotely in the Club on these days while their Nippers were participating in the camp activities on the beach. The Supsquatch made a return this year and was the highlight of the two days.

Honing Skills through Participation and Competition

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Lifesaving

nother successful season draws to a close and there is reflection on the gems we uncovered and what might have been.

With only a small team of Champion Lifesavers and Patrol Comp it was difficult to schedule resuscitation training around so many other commitments. Once again Josh, Luke and Kirra were self-disciplined as needed. Surprise packet Ewan Humphries returned from overseas late January and proceeded to study and prepare. His efforts were rewarded in his results.

When Izzy asked if I would assist a patrol comp team again this season, I was doubtful such a young team would be able to match it with other teams in the Open competition. My immediate action was to contact Andrew McEwan to assist. Its hard to resist such an enthusiastic group, so once again we assisted them as best we could with resuscitation, the written paper and scenarios. New recruit, Sammy Lever, was a great addition to the team and proved herself time and again.

First Aid training had continued throughout most the year, although was often more a social occasion! The HSC also took its rightful place as a priority late in 2023. As the teams got down to the pointy end of the season training got a little more serious.

INSIGHTS

Julia and Tahlia have been competing together in First Aid for 12 seasons with amazing success across that time. Julia offers the following as a reminder of the importance of first aid in our patrolling activities: Our first aid skills and experience in patrol comp really helped us on patrol when carrying out a major rescue. All northern beaches were shut for extreme weather and waves. Around 4pm on our patrol, Julia, Tahlia, Nat and Kirra ran over to the rocks after the emergency signal had been pushed. When we got to the pool, people confirmed at least one person had been washed into the water. We radioed the beach asking for the IRB.

Two teenagers (17 and 15), a boy and a girl, had been washed off the rocks and the girl couldn't swim. The boy managed to make it back to the rocks, but was scraped all over. Tahlia was able to administer first aid, while Julia gathered the patient details. The girl was picked up by the jet-ski in this time and taken back to the beach.

Tahlia cleaned the wounds and dressed them. Everyone assisted in calming the family and friends, and managing curious onlookers that had moved onto the rocks to see. We were able to answer the questions of the police and ambulance officers, and managed a consistently calm situation given the real danger to the patients.


Without our training in administering first aid and a rescue situation as part of patrol competition and first aid there may have been different outcomes.

Competitively, our season started off on the Australia day weekend with back to back carnivals at North Steyne and Freshwater respectively. The weekend would mark the first opportunity for our newly formed men's team to gel in the competitive environment with minor tweaks from last season. I was able to put aside any fear of swimming and channel the right arm on the reel. Hugo Weston stepped into the dreaded role of the belt swimmer. Pat Kielv made the seamless transition from the 6 person to the 5 man patient role bringing with him one of the biggest lung capacities on the Northern Beaches. There was also slight adjustment to the composition of the 6-person team with Pat moving into the draw meaning he'd have to familiarise himself with the challenging beach positions. Our initial hit outs for the season were successful with both teams placing first over both days of the weekend.

This season we had the pleasure of a new event on the calendar. The Weekend @ The Roy was a carnival hosted by local rivals Collaroy with emphasis on team events. The new carnival ran smoothly with big compliments going out to organisers particularly Gary Milsted. It was great to have a day away from the craft and solely focused on the boats, R&R and March Past. We were also lucky enough to have the legend Andrew De Vries come down to get a rep in with the 6 man team. With success, we left with a 'sizey' gold medal, a new towel, schooner glasses and a banging feed at Sloppy Tees.

As the season ramped up, I packed my bags and headed up the coast to Port Macquarie in attempt to promote the sport within the Mid North Coast Local Health District. Whilst I was tweaking on my fronts at Tacking Point for 10 weeks, the great Jane 'Hurricane' Freakley stepped in to enable the rest of the team the ability to train on a regular basis. Both Wayne Freakley and Chris Tyrell enabled the logistics of training to continue smoothly whilst Hugo Weston was self-appointed to the role of Social Coordinator.

Branch Championships were held at Maroubra Beach this year to unite branches creating more healthy competition. Without a coach, the squad was firing and so too was the surf off the back of some awful weather. Despite the fellas lugging a tent 500m from the carpark, it didn't get a run due to high winds and a lack of sandbags, the shelter of the clubhouse providing more





appeal. The 5 man event was a test to see how competitors would fare in the conditions and it was a great opportunity for us to display our preference for size. As the other patients asked Pat to hold their hand on the way out, Pumba left them for dust on his solo venture out to the can. Hugo managed to win the belt swim by 3 minutes, putting the other teams to bed making the event ours to lose. Sadly, the remaining events were dry run throughs for the day, however we still managed to add both events to the growing win sheet - a testament to our dominance in and out of the water. The team celebrated with a mediocre feed from a Vietnamese cafe out of the rain.

State championships were again hosted on our home beach, much to the pleasure of Jarrad who was getting into the routine of being daddy. On the other side of the Freakley's, Clare and Shannon recently welcomed FloJo into the world and both the cousins were down to watch their first bit of competition. In bizzare fashion, it was decided to not put up a Freshie tent possibly due to some remains of PTSD from the Maroubra carnival thus the newborns took shade under the officials tent. Clutch performances for both teams meant two gold medals were won with a shout-out to the 6 person team who won on 0 points, a great effort considering the new combinations on the beach. Special mention must also go to Dave Inches for being the ultimate clubman and shouting the

squad a round from the club bar.

As we headed to Alexandra Headland for the Australian titles, the squad was firing and morale high as I was now available for training sessions. The Freakley family had decided that they had seen enough at state to warrant defending the gold medal from last year's campaign and entered the mixed competition. The aura of the trip was different to previous in that the squad had two newborns to accommodate. For us that meant two extra cheerleaders on the beach. Come competition day, the weather was perfect and we were fortunate enough to have Shannon bring up the North Steyne tent as the Freshwater tent was front and centre of the main live stream. All teams made it through the heats to qualify for the finals. In both the 5 person men's and mixed finals, big swims from Hugo and Jarrad respectively did enough to put teams into the frame for medal contention. Solid performances on the beach meant that both teams were successful in winning the gold medal, both drilling 1 point - a huge effort considering the strength of the field in both events. In the 6 person event, the final was marred by controversy from the outset with a rival competitor seeking leniency for a tweaked calf muscle. Despite being undefeated all season leading up to the final, for whatever reason it was not meant to be and the team blew out to 4th place finishing on 5 points. Although it was a bitter feeling, the fact each member of the squad had finished

the day with a gold medal meant the day had to be labelled a successful one.

I would personally like to thank all those who supported our squad at any point throughout the season and in particular to Serena, Wendy, Lisa Tyrell and Tanya who supported the team on each occasion this year. Another big thank you goes to Jane Freakley who officiated on behalf of Freshwater throughout the season, particularly in the youth competition.

To our coaches Wayne Freakley and Chris Tyrell, your dedication to the sport is what keeps it going and what enables us to be able to represent our club particularly on our home beach. Thanks for your efforts in organising sessions throughout the season despite numerous hurdles provided.

To my fellow competitors, thank you for another season filled with accomplishments and joy. There is something special about a team sport in that it provides moments that you couldn't replicate in any other environment. There are times shared either on trips away, under the tent or even on the start line that make the experience so enjoyable. I look forward to seeing you all next season as we continue to build a dynasty for this club.

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Freshwater Open Carnival

he 2024 Freshwater Australia Day Open Carnival was held on Sunday 21st January – it was once again publicised as being part of "Perfect Australia Day Weekend" of surf events along with Manly LSC. Again attempting to increase the profile of this surf lifesaving weekend on the Northern Beaches against competition from Queensland club events.

The weather for the day was about perfect and relatively benign surf conditions that enabled four(4) Water Areas being "set up" for the commencement of the day with a 6.30am start for R&R and the last Water areas closing around 2.30pm. The full complement of surf carnival events across water, land and R&R were held with disappointing competitor numbers across the beach (sprints/flags) events.

This year also included a team from California Lifeguards who joined in a series of events across NSW and Victoria and were hosted by the club where we provided access to our club facilities while they were here. Entry numbers were around 700 competitors, down from the 2023 carnival.

This year saw the continuation of the extended focus on Board events as part of the "Tim Kirkby Memorial Races" and the "Welcome to Country" initiative. Both continued to promote greater interest in the Freshwater event. Key points for the carnival can be summarised as;

- Focus on the Open Board events with over \$8,500 available as prize money across the male/ female and individual/relay events. Individual race naming right sponsors were, Cunninghams Real Estate, Matt Lemon, James Brooks, APG & Quasar Constructions;
- Focus was extended to the Age (U15/U17/U19) Individual Board Events (male/female) with prize packs for the first three finishers;

- Additionally, Aqua Culture made a \$1000 donation to the Open Male & Female Surf Swim race;
- Additional focus was placed on the U15 Age with their events commencing at 7.30am to support the large number of entries received.

For the carnival itself the events program included R&R using the very north corner of the beach (and concluding around 9.00am), U15 age groups using the northern area and Opens and U19's using the central and southern area. The land area was in the southern end of the beach with March Past in front of the Clubhouse with Michael Bate (President) speaking at the conclusion of the March Past.
