RE: REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE 2024/2025 SEASON

Our club is located within the Lower North Coast Branch on the Mid North Coast of NSW, approximately 2 hours north of Newcastle. Our membership for 2023/2024 was 203 in total, including 76 juniors and 43 active patrolling members. These 43 members were split over 6 patrols.

Looking at the upcoming season, we believe the increasing decline in patrolling members for our area will see our club only have 4 or at best 5 patrols, which may result in each active member having to patrol every weekend, something which is not sustainable.

We are sending this letter in the hope that some of your active members may be interested in visiting our club, staying overnight at our clubhouse and undertaking a volunteer patrol or two one weekend next season.

Our patrol hours are 9.00am to 1.00pm on a normal weekend, and 10.00am to 3.00pm on the peak days (eg Easter and Christmas, the latter being the period where we require the most assistance). In that peak period, each of our patrols requires three bronze members (consisting of one Patrol Captain, one IRB driver and one crewman), however our fully equipped clubhouse will accommodate more, should a larger number of your members wish to assist.

— NEWS FROM AROUND THE CLUB

News from the Surf Life Saving - NSW State Conference

It was announced at the NSW State Conference held on 27 and 28 July that Surf Life Saving NSW is looking at introducing flexible patrolling. This is being considered because it appears that there will be changes to the Life Saving Agreements between Surf Life Saving Clubs and the Councils who are the bodies legally responsible for beaches in New South Wales.

The Life Saving Agreement is the document that specifies the patrolling hours that the Club has to meet and the minimum number of patrolling members required on each patrol.

Significant work has been done by SLS NSW in the last few years to better identify when lifesavers are needed on the beach. The data reveals what we have observed for some time. The peak times for rescues coincide with peak numbers on the beach.

Beachgoers in the mornings tend to be locals who can swim and are less likely to get into trouble. Conversely, people who don't frequent the beach as often tend to arrive from around 11am onwards and will stay for several hours. Unsurprisingly, the peak time for rescues is from mid-December until late February. It has also been identified that there are many rescues after 6pm.

Some of the initiatives that Surf Life Saving NSW is considering include varying patrolling hours and varying the numbers of patrolling members required at different times of the season. This already happens at Freshwater to an extent. For example, we patrol until 6pm in summer, but finish at 4:30pm in April.

Whilst it was announced that SLS NSW would roll out changes before the start of the season, that will not occur. The primary reason is that there is already a Life Saving Agreement in place for this season. So, it will be business as usual this season, but in the coming seasons there may be some changes to patrolling times and the manner in which we structure patrols.

They both look forward to sharing their experiences with the Freshwater members this coming season.
