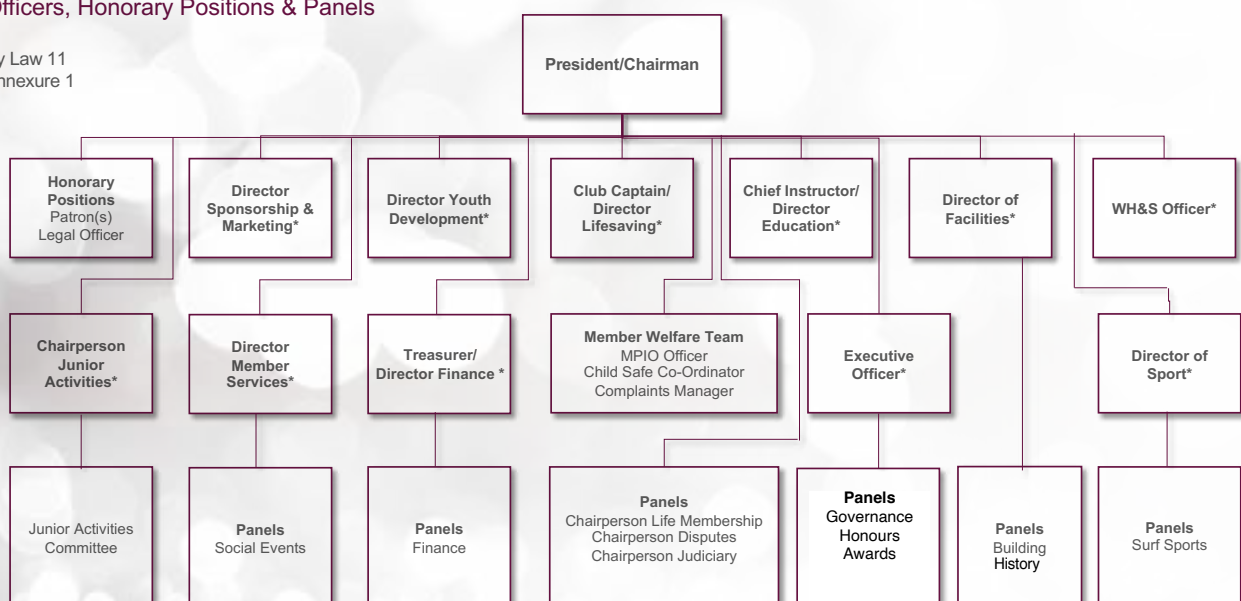

Eric won the Australian Junior Surfboat Championship in 1967 and 1968. There

are very few Australian surfboat rowers that have won 2 Australian Junior Surfboat Championships. He was 2nd in the Interstate Junior Surfboat Race in 1968. Eric stroked a crew of 18 year olds that came second in the NSW Open Surfboat Championships – a remarkable feat and testimony to his oarsmanship. Over Eric's competitive career, he has achieved numerous medals at Branch and State level during his career and is still a member of the current Masters' boat crews when required.

Eric has been and continues to be the "go to man" in the club, whether it be maintaining the boats or trailers, training of a boat crew, updating the history of the club on the club website, arranging ashes scattering for past members, updating the Nippers Honour boards or continuing to make the halls of this club a showpiece for the members and the many visitors and for surf lifesaving generally. Over his 30 years and more recently, he has been the driving force in updating and the upkeep of the clubs Heritage Room, the club historical photos, assisting the boat area and crews, Dukes Day celebrations and historical archiving, the clubs Honour Boards while always maintaining our rich and meaningful Freshwater Heritage.

Many of Eric's time-consuming activities have

been quietly carried out, unseen by most members.

His dedicated efforts are indeed a wonderful contribution to the Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club brand now and into the future.

BRIAN O'CALLAGHAN "CALLO"

Brian O'Callaghan, or "Callo" as he was affectionately known, joined the Freshwater club in the 1947 -1948 season, obtaining his Bronze Medallion on 16 May 1948. Callo held a range of positions in the club including Boat Captain for 3 years, Boat Vice Captain for 3 years, Gear Steward for 1 year, a club selector for 6 years, Committee member for 2 years, Building Committee member for 3 years, and also Freshwater Touring Team manager and carnival committee member. Brian was a highly successful boat sweep, winning medals at Branch, Metropolitan, State and Australian Championships. He was a selected to represent NSW State in the 64/65 and 66/67 teams, and was a member of the Branch team which toured South Africa in the 1964 -1965 Season. He is particularly remembered as the sweep of the Freshwater club's 'Miss Astor' boat which he took out in huge surf during the 1963/64 season. Showing no fear he steered his crew on a monster wave which saw the boat famously disappear in a mass of foam and ultimately get smashed to pieces. The stern of the Miss Astor boat adored the club's wall for many years. In recognition of his outstanding and distinguished services to the club he was made a life member of the Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club in 1968.

COLIN MACLEAN

Long time member Colin Maclean sadly passed away in December 2024 after a long illness at the age of 81. Colin was a member of the Freshwater club for 67 years after joining as a cadet in the 1958 -1959 season when he gained his qualifying certificate. Col subsequently obtained his Bronze Medallion in the 1959 -1960 season and then gained his Instructor's Certificate in 1962. A highly competitive board rider, Colin won the Branch long board championship 6 times, including 5 consecutive titles between 1962 and 1966. He was also a branch medallist in surf ski and board relay events. His last competitive success was in 1999 when he won a Branch Master's silver medal in the 150yrs Taplin Relay. Col was also club champion in board events on several occasions. Ironically, Colin was also selected by the Many Warringah Branch to tour South Africa in the 1964-1965 season alongside Freshwaters Brian O'Callaghan whom we also celebrate in this year's annual report. The third Freshwater member of that touring team was Barry Lumsdaire. Beyond competition Colin was also actively involved in club administration. Colin was also a long term and very active member of the Newport SLSC and could be often seen swapping competition caps depending on which beach he was on. Colin undertook a range of duties during his time at Freshwater including General Committee member.

Executive Officer's Report

It was my pleasure to be re-elected Executive Officer at the June 2024 AGM for Season 2024/25. This season, continued to provide an opportunity for the Club to approach tasks in a dynamic manner in order to remind, refresh, stimulate and retain club members of the opportunities that being a member of Freshwater SLSC provides.

Season 2024/25 saw the following initiatives being planned and achieved – these include; 1) Development Application (DA) Approval; 2) Attendance of 2 x members at National Leadership Masterclass in Adelaide in July 2024; 3) Re-juvenation of Freshie on Fridays; 4) Further development of the Members Lounge with additional furniture added during the season.

During the year a General Meeting was held on the 15th December 2024 with the aim of communicating to our membership the implemented and proposed initiatives for not only this season but looking forward to 2026 and onwards. Presentations were made by the President, and the portfolios of, Junior Activities, Education, Member Services, Captain and Facilities. Further comments were also provided by the Executive Committee members in attendance.

Membership

This season continued to see an overall increase in Club membership. Our Nipper intake was very healthy with over 775 registrations, a significant increase on last season. Our active patrolling numbers continue to be an issue that requires continuous management, many thanks to David Price (Club Captain) for taking new approaches to ensuring attendance of patrolling members at the beach.

in relation to nipper parent members. All other categories of membership remained relatively stable with small increases or decreases in line with usual variations.

It is very pleasing to see an increase in Youth membership for this Season and their active involvement in club activities, whether that be competing, patrolling or supporting social activities. Many thanks go to Josh Orr (Director, Youth) for organising initiatives involving this membership group.

Finance Report

After a difficult year in the Australian economy, with many families facing cost of living challenges and significant costs increases, I am pleased to report another good financial result for the club. For this we owe thanks to our members, sponsors and donors for continued support and involvement in the club. In response to feedback, we have simplified and hopefully improved the presentation of this year's financial statements, to group key components of club activity instead of continuing to list all revenue and expenses lines without particular grouping.

From the table above, it pleasing to note that this year's surplus of \$42,446 is after both non-cash depreciation of \$62,386 and master plan expenses of \$85,682 – spent to get the Development Application approved. That expense is included in the Building Services category and comprises \$21,572 to submit the application to Council and \$64,110 for architectural services to modify the application to comply with changes required by regulatory bodies.

Revenue increased by \$36,003 or 5.6% with notable increases of \$11,096 from Events and Carnivals, \$19,559 from Junior Activities (Nippers) and \$18,454 from Other Income, being interest received on cash and deposits, benefiting from higher interest rates. Club trading of \$259k was up \$2,975 and comprises income from Bar (\$9k), BBQs (\$5k), Club Shop (\$46k), Education (eg

first aid courses) (\$7k), Kiosk (\$64k), Hall Hire (\$72k), Members Services (\$13k) (eg Christmas Party and Award Night tickets), and Senior member subscriptions (\$43k). Donations, Grants and Sponsorships of \$164k were down \$16k overall, but within this category Sponsorships increased \$7k to \$121k, while Grants reduced \$16k to \$35k, in part as club equipment is good order, and Donations reduced to \$8k from \$15k. The club continues to be heavily reliant on Sponsorships, Donations and Grants to support our mission; "To ensure no lives are lost while on patrol, assist members to achieve their full potential and support the community" and I would like to take this opportunity to thank our generous sponsors, donors and supporters for their ongoing support.

Junior Activities of \$165k were up \$20k, chiefly from \$32k more membership fees (136k), offsetting small reductions in junior board hire (\$2k), fundraising and social income (\$3k) and the Nipper camp (\$6k), while carnival income (\$19k) was flat. Expenses overall increased \$66,631 to \$637,691 or 11.6%, chiefly from the \$85,682 master plan expense. Without that large and unusual cost, expenses decreased \$19,051, down 3.2%.

Administration rose \$12k to \$102k due to use of the Titan Ford-branded Ranger during the season, recorded as a \$14k vehicle expense but was not a cash cost due to in-

kind sponsorship from Titan Ford, for which we are grateful. While remaining expenses were constrained, we continue to seek better value, making changes to our Telephone and Internet providers and in progress with changing our electricity provider for better off-peak prices. It is not economic to install solar panels until after the new development. Surf Sports rose \$17k to \$66k, with \$10k spent on board and ski maintenance and refreshing, carnival entries up \$7k to \$24k, surf boats flat at \$6k and State/Branch and Australian Titles costs up \$3.5k to \$24k. Offsetting this cost, competitors contribute levies (\$9k), raise funds and meet minimum lifesaving patrol requirements before being competing for the club.

Junior Activities rose \$15k to \$89k to reflect the larger membership, with \$11k of the increase comprising a \$38k capitation fee paid to SLISA.

Balance Sheet

Club activity generated an increase in cash of \$67,509 to total \$723,714, of which \$550,027 is invested in term deposits, including savings toward the future master building plan, and \$18,260 was spent on fixed asset investments, relating to a mobility chair, improving the members lounge and updating gym equipment. Master plan costs were expensed as they were incurred even if we do not raise the millions needed to implement the approved development application. The following accounts audited provide further details of club revenue, expenditure and cash flows for the year and a snapshot assets and liabilities at 30 April 2025. I would like to thank my Executive Committee colleagues for their support and the tireless work they do in the background to keep our club running.

I look forward to seeing you at the beach or at the club using our facilities or enjoying a function.

Principal activities and significant changes in nature of activities

The principal activities of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc during the financial year were to provide surf lifesaving services. There were no significant changes in Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc's principal activities during the financial year.

Review of operations

Total revenue and other income increased by \$36,003 (2024: \$31,031) mainly due to increases in revenue arising from sponsorships, memberships fees, grants, hall hire and carnivals, offset by reduction in donations, shop revenue and kiosk rental. Costs also increased by \$64,891 (2024: 2,118), mainly coming from increases in member services expenses, club master plan under building services, and patrol and surf sports expenses. As a result, the Club recorded a net surplus of \$42,446 in 2025 (2024: \$71,334).

Net assets increased by \$42,446 (2024: \$71,334) reflecting the operating surplus and net cash position increased by \$67,509 to \$723,714 (2024: increased by \$93,239 to \$656,205). For more details on the operations, refer to the respective sections in the annual report.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2025

The financial report covers Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc (the Club) as an individual entity. Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an incorporated association, a not-for-profit Club, that is registered and domiciled in Australia.

The principal activities of the Club for the year ended 30 April 2024 were providing surf lifesaving services.

The functional and presentation currency of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by those charged with governance on 19 June 2025.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that comply with Australian Accounting Standards – Simplified Disclosures and the Australian Charities and Not for profits Commission Act 2012. These financial statements also comply with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW).

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

New and Amended Standards Adopted

The Club has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted. The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Club.

2 Summary of Material Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Write downs of inventory to net realisable values are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Principal revenue streams are recognised as follows:

Membership fees

Fees are recognised when payments are received. Membership is not granted or renewed until subscriptions are paid. Memberships are renewed annually and are in line with the Club's financial year and therefore, recognised as revenue in the financial year. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years. Membership subscriptions received in advance are carried forward as a liability at the end of the reporting period.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods or equipment to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when all performance obligations are satisfied.

Events and Training Income

Revenue from events and training are recognised on completion of the event, when performance obligations are satisfied. Until then, payments received are recognised as deferred income.

Sponsorships

Sponsorships from participating parties are recognised when received and are aligned to the financial year of the Club. No adjustments are needed for portions relating to performance obligations in future income years.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2025

2 Summary of Material Accounting Policies (continued)

Other income

Interest is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. Government grants are recognised on an accrual basis at the time that the eligibility conditions have been fulfilled by the Club.

(d) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Grants related to assets

Government grants related to assets, including non-monetary grants at fair value are presented in the statement of financial position by deducting the grant from the carrying amount of the related asset.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Club, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Those charged with governance make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Inventories

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine inventory obsolescence. During the year, management has written off inventory based on the age and the model of the clothing stocks that in their view, are unsellable. During the year, there were no stocks written off (2024: Nil).



Club Captain Report

The Club completed its 115th consecutive season of patrolling in the period from 28 September 2024 to 27 April 2025. I am proud to confirm that, once again, no lives were lost between the flags.

In that period the 335 Members carried out 9,126 hours in providing 142 rostered patrols as well as water safety for the Boat Carnival, the Masters' Carnival, the Nipper Fast & Furious Carnival, the Open Carnival, the Barney Mullins Ocean Swim and four days of the NSW Surf Lifesaving Championships. Large surf was a common theme this season. The first weekend of patrols saw the beach closed due to large surf and it culminated with some of the biggest surf in living memory on Easter Friday.

In the 2024/2025 season our patrols protected nearly 295,000 beach-goers. They carried out 27 rescues, 185 first aid treatments and 415 preventative actions. It is a testament to the skills of our Members that they effectively intervene and keep the public away from danger instead of having to rescue them after they have got into trouble.

This season also saw the beach closed on several occasions across the summer months after the shark beacon was activated.

Our patrols were fed again for most of the season thanks to the efforts of our wonderful Director of Sponsorship Kimberley Dale. We are indebted to her and the extraordinary generosity of Freshie Chickens, Harbord Hotel and Grill'd Balgowlah.

Patrolling numbers have not recovered to the pre-pandemic levels and we may have to expect that future patrols will have to function on reduced numbers. Despite that, we are experiencing a surge in the number of Members who are prepared to do extra. More than 30 people did more than 100% of their patrols; 25 did more than 50 hours; and 10 bronze Members did more than 100 hours. In that regard, I particularly wish to thank Izzy Stapf-Giannakis, Caitlin Price, Grace Hardy, Kelly Dobrow, Richard Hawtin, Sammy Lever, James Crittenden and John Lo Schiavo. They regularly stepped in to fill holes in the roster. Without them, the Club would have breached the Lifesaving Agreement several times this season.

Special thanks are again required for our Patrol Captains. As a group, and individually, they do an amazing job. Grayson Killen on Patrol 1, Simon Wain on Patrol 2, Grace Seagrove and Mark Gilbert on Patrol 4, Ian Hills and Thomas Hills on Patrol 5, Dee Godoy on Patrol 6, Jake Landells and James Crittenden on Patrol 7, Andy Jones on Patrol 8, David Newhouse on Patrol 9, Kim Cook on Patrol 10, Kris Burrows and Michiel Tops on Patrol 11, Greg Gardener on Patrol 12, Bennett Freck on Patrol 13, Michael Raymer on Patrol 15 and Alex Chan on Patrol 16.

There has been a surge in interest in patrolling this season that has been led by our younger Members.

Patrol of the Year

The Patrol of the Year is often closely fought. It depends on various factors, the most important of which is the comparative attendance ratio of the patrol. Another significant factor is whether the Patrol had to attend to any major incidents during the season.

A number of patrols had quite good comparative attendance ratios. Special mentions go to Patrol 3 at 36.5, Patrols 7 and 12 at 35.4 and Patrol 14 at 35.3. Patrol 6, however, had a comparative attendance ratio of 37.8 and had to deal with a significant incident.

On 9 March 2025, a little after the commencement of the afternoon patrol, a man was returning to shore when he was unexpectedly caught by a wave and dumped in shallow water. He was assisted out of the water by his wife and brought to shore. On the initial assessment, he was found to have grazes to his face and right shoulder and had begun to experience symptoms indicative of a potential spinal injury. These symptoms included his report of neck pain, sharp radiating pain down from his neck into his left shoulder and arm with pins and needles extending from his elbow to thumb. The Patrol Captain, Deandra 'Dee' Godoy, immediately initiated spinal precautions, manually stabilising the patient's head and neck to prevent further injury. This stabilisation was maintained for approximately 45 minutes, until paramedics were prepared to take over the patient's care and apply a spinal collar.

Whilst the support was maintained for over 45 minutes, the Patrol Members also attended to the patient's various grazes and wounds on his face and shoulders, cleaning and dressing them and provided continual reassurance to the patient's wife and daughter.

The patrol also continued working in coordination with the Lifeguards to maintain general surveillance of the flagged area and respond to other beach safety needs, ensuring the broader beach environment remained safe and operational throughout the incident.

Once the paramedics had completed their primary and secondary assessments and were ready for transport, the full patrol team reconvened to assist transporting the patient off the beach to the ambulance.

The incident lasted approximately 1.5 hours in total. Throughout the event, the patient remained conscious, cooperative, and appreciative of the care and professionalism provided. The incident was managed with exceptional teamwork and communication. All



patrol members demonstrated a high level of composure and competence under pressure, ensuring both patient safety and ongoing beach coverage.

Rookie Patrol Person of the Year

Stacey Hardy obtained her Bronze Medallion, First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation awards in the 2024/2025 season. She began patrolling immediately upon obtaining her First Aid qualification.

She carried out 65 patrolling hours as well as volunteering to provide First Aid at the Freshwater Open Carnival in January 2025, the Barney Mullins Ocean Swim in February 2025 and various other carnivals hosted by the Club during the season.

Youth Patrol Person of the Year

Tyler "Tinsel" Libetrau went on patrolling rampage this season. It seems highly improbable that anyone has ever made the impression that he has in their first season of patrolling.

He carried 260 patrolling hours and patrolled with every one of the Club's 16 patrols. He was here so often that 4 different patrol captains nominated him for the award thinking that he was a member of that Captain's patrol.

Tyler carried out a number of board rescues during the season as well as assisting with a mass rescue on Boxing Day a group of fully clothed adults. He assisted with first aids and was often the first to volunteer to stand at the flags and direct swimmers back to safety.

IRB Driver of the Year

Grace Hardy carried out 154 patrolling hours this season, regularly stepping in to cover vacant driver or crew positions.

She undertook 3 shifts at the Open Carnival in January at Manly in XL surf as well as assisting in the pack-up of the course. She

provided IRB support at the Barney Mullins swim and other carnivals held by the Club this season.

Although, she only obtained her SM IRBD award in October 2024 she has already demonstrated a level of skill and driving maturity that usually takes many seasons to develop.

Patrol Captain of the Year

Simon is the Captain of Patrol 2, which ordinarily patrols on a Sunday afternoon and is usually the most difficult period of each weekend to patrol. He carried out 50 patrolling hours and regularly offered to substitute for other captains.

On Christmas afternoon, supervising a team of 'fill-ins', Simon calmly but surely and decisively managed several rescues and the treatment of man who sustained a significant laceration to his head.

Simon had to rebuild his patrol this season after losing several members over the previous winter. He did so, maintaining regular and early communication with the Club to ensure that his patrols had sufficient members. His clear communication and relaxed leadership style results in him being respected and liked by his team and the Council Lifeguards.

Patrol Person of the Year

Caitlin Price had an extraordinary season in 2024/25. She carried out 165 patrolling hours. She managed numerous first aid incidents including a dislocated shoulder (whilst most of the rest of the patrol was attending to a dislocated knee) and then a second dislocated shoulder later on the same day.

She was involved in the rescue of a surfer in the XL surf on Easter Saturday. She provided IRB support at the at the various carnivals the Club hosted during the season, including in the XL swell at Manly for the Open Carnival in January. She responded to two emergency call-outs during the season out of patrolling hours. She represented the Club at various carnivals and won medals at both Branch and State Championships. She has become involved in mentoring and encouraging our SRCs to remain involved in surf lifesaving and patrolling by actively engaging with them during patrols and by acting as a host for the Club's SRC Camp in April. She her Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award this season and is in the process of becoming a trainer.

Meritorious Service Award for Lifesaving and Bravery

On Tuesday, 18 March 2025, the surf was up. By most accounts it was comfortably double overhead.

A group of members were doing some board training in the northern corner, although most were staying inside the break.

At around 7:15 pm, the last three members, including Liam Lehane, decided to head in. The first two caught waves, but Liam didn't.

There were several members on the beach but they couldn't see Liam because of the size of the surf. Eventually he was spotted further north near the pool. Those on the beach couldn't work out what he was doing. Eventually it appeared that he had a second person on the board. That was eventually confirmed when Liam began signalling for assistance.

Unfortunately, due to the size of the surf and his location, the prospect of anyone being able to paddle out to assist him was remote. Those on the beach began running to ready the IRB, and gather the Oxy and De-fib.

On his racing mal, Liam attempted to catch a wave with the patient. Unsurprisingly, the pair nosedived. In the process, the patient kicked Liam in the jaw. Unperturbed, Liam managed to get the patient back on to the board and scramble back over a couple of waves.

Due to the limited visibility from the surf, those on the beach were still unsure whether Liam and the patient were ok. As the ATV drove down the beach towing the IRB, Liam was seen to take off on an enormous wave. This time, Liam and his patient survived the drop and surfed the wave to shore.

The patient was a man in his mid-20's who had been caught in the rip in the northern corner for nearly half an hour before being spotted by Liam. Although exhausted, the man was otherwise unharmed. But without Liam's actions and presence, it is highly probable that the patient would have drowned. He could not, for all practical purposes, be seen from the shore because of the size of the surf and the man could not escape the rip.

Liam's actions were above and beyond the normal call of duty. First, the surf was plainly in the XL range. Had the rescue taken place in patrol hours, the beach would have been closed and the swimmer would not have been permitted to enter the water. All who witnessed the rescue agreed that few people have the skill to rescue a patient significantly bigger than themselves on a racing mal. Liam undoubtedly put himself in danger in order to carry out the rescue.

IRB Report

Overall, it has been a quite season for the IRB section. November saw us providing water safety for the Boat Carnival, the Nipper Fast and Furious and the Masters Carnival. January brought big surf for the Open Carnival held at Manly. In February we had 4 boats and a jetski out for Barney Mullins Ocean Swim as well 4 shifts at the Branch Championships at Newport. In March we hosted the State Championships for Lifesaving and R&R over 4 days. Finally, we had a number of Drivers head to Queensland for the Aussies in April.

It was during the Aussies, that Richard Budd and James Coates won Rescue of the Month for their expert collection and safe return to shore of a rower who had been knocked unconscious in the break.

FRESHWATER'S FIRST PINK PATROL

INTERNATIONAL WOMENS' DAY 2025

"It was their perceived inability to handle the 'big guns' of the lifesaver's equipment - surfboats and the line, reeling and belt - that SLSC most frequently cited to explain its prohibition of [women's] full participation in the movement." (Freshie: The First 100 Years, p.52)

From the early 1970s, Freshwater SLSC underwent a "reorientation" they believed was necessary with the times – the involvement of women in surf lifesaving duties. At the time, some Freshwater Officials deemed it "quite unnecessary" as "women had their place already – in the [Freshwater] club kitchen" (p.172). Despite the inception of Surf Lifesaving in 1907, women were not officially included in active lifesaving duties until 1980. The above quote is reflective of this delay. On the 8th of March 2025, Freshwater SLSC proudly celebrated International Women's Day through its first 'Pink Patrol'. Consisting of active female patrolling members and male champions, the day celebrated the contribution of women in lifesaving and the support from our male peers.

The Pink Patrol, as run by Patrol 3 and 4, highlighted the abundance of talent and

leadership present within our surf club. Over the course of the day, the patrols saw the following attendance:

- Over 25 patrolling women
- 4x female patrol captains
- 1x female RWC operator
- Several talented competitors straight out of State Championships
- Lots of blokes keen to support the initiative

Specific shout outs go to Shanny, Kelly and Pricey for their proactive involvement and enthusiasm. Additional support from the executive committee further confirmed that women within Freshie SLSC are consistently appreciated and valued.

Skills Maintenance

The beginning of each season sees a group of delegated assessors running several skills maintenance sessions to ensure our

members skills are at the required level to be able to continue to patrol in the new season. This is a very big logistical effort lead by Belinda Dobson. I would like to thank all of the assessors and delegated assessors for their assistance during these sessions which at times saw in excess of 80 members attending the one session. Thank you Belinda, Lindsay, Steve, Jonathon, Andrew, Jackie, Emily, Andi, Grace, Sue, Tom, Paul, David, James, John, Michiel, Tahlia, Luke, Richard, Mark, Cheryl, Kev, Grace and also the water safety teams who helped set up the run/swim/ run course and provided water safety.

Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

A number of existing U14 nippers and some new members completed their SRC award early this season. A very large group of 43 candidates were very capably lead by probationary trainer Kirra Budd and assisted by John Goldrick, Kelly Dobrow and Tom Duffy. Due to the very large number of candidates, further training assistance was welcomed by Sami Lever and Isabelle Stapf-Giannakis. A small cohort of seven U14 age managers (who already held their Bronze medallion) were put through an in-depth proficiency and short training session so they could assist with the training of this very large SRC cohort. Their assistance of very welcome as keeping the attention of 43 U14 year olds can be challenging at times. These new SRC members were allocated to patrols and the feedback I have received from several patrol captains is very positive saying they are extremely enthusiastic and keen to participate in all patrolling activities.

Bronze Medallion

An SRC to Bronze transition course was

run and lead by Michiel Tops and assisted by Kelly Dobrow and probationary trainer Josh Orr. We had 18 existing SRC members achieve their First Aid Certificate as part of the upgrade to their Bronze.

Additional Bronze courses were run by Belinda Dobson, Luke Thornton, Isabelle Stapf-Giannakis, Michiel Tops, Andrea Malm and Kelly Dobrow. A total of 36 members gained their Bronze this season.

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART)

During the season, a small but enthusiastic group of 11 members undertook their Advanced Resuscitation Technique award lead by Lindsay Davis, Jackie Phillips and probationary ART trainer Mark Thornton. This award is an extension of CPR utilising oxygen and working in a team. It is a very important qualification that must be represented in each patrol.

IRB Crew and IRB Drivers

Several IRB courses were run throughout the season with 9 new IRB drivers and 5 new IRB crew awarded. Thank you to the IRB team of David Price, James Crittenden, John Lo Schiavo, Jordan Dobson and James Coates for their assistance running these courses.

Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (SMAR)

Five members received their SMAR award this season. Congratulations to Gina Bolton, Louis Wiat, Jack Barnett, Lily Barnett and Campbell Symington. This is an intensive course that involves candidates learning search and rescue skills including advanced water entry (rock and pier rescues) and retrieving submerged objects.



Silver Medallion Patrol Captain

This award is required to be held by all Patrols Captains. The course provides skills to enable the candidate to deal with emergencies and situations that may occur during patrols and includes working as a team, delegation and communications with emergency services. Caitlin Price, David Price, Kris Burrows, Andre Eerenstein, Michael Rees-Evans and Paris Giannakis gained this award this season.

First Aid Certificate

More than 5 Facilitated First Aid Certificate courses were run this season at Freshwater. Several of these were run by Herve Vichemont (Dee Why) and Kelly Dobrow (probationary facilitator). During the season Kelly Dobrow was endorsed as a Sydney Northern Beaches First Aid Facilitator allowing her to run First Aid courses for Freshwater members (and other SNB members). This season Kelly has run several First Aid courses for Freshwater members to either update their existing qualification or gain the initial award.

Rescue Water Craft (RWC or Jet-Ski)

Freshwater had 3 members gain their RWC qualification this season. Well done Jock Tyson, Jordan Dobson and Michael Rees-Evans. This is a long course run over several months in the pre-season.

Community CPR

A community CPR introduction course was run at Freshwater in January 2025 as part of the Community Bank Freshwater (Bendigo Bank) initiative supported by Sydney Northern Beaches Branch. North Curl Curl, South Curl Curl and Freshwater all provided a separate information evening where members of the public could learn about CPR and practice their skills on manikins.

Summary

Next season we see the introduction of Lifesaving CPR which is a new 'faster' method of doing CPR. All trainers and assessors in Sydney Northern Beaches will be up-skilled with this new method and they will then pass this new technique along to all members. Freshwater members will be trained in this technique in the skills maintenance sessions at the beginning of next season.

This season has been busy and satisfying at the same time and I thank all of the Freshwater trainers, probationary trainers, Assessors, Facilitators and subject matter experts for their assistance and time ensuring our Freshwater members have the skills required to be the best lifesavers possible.

Facilities Report

The most exciting news relating to Facilities for the season has been the approval of the club's DA for redevelopment of the club building.

The first work on the current proposal for redevelopment of the club building commenced in 2011. During the season 2010/2011 member engagement took place including member surveys and discussions aimed at gaining an insight into the wishes and needs of club members across all areas of the club. In October 2011 a Masterplan briefing document was prepared including an analysis of who the membership was made up of, what spaces the club offered then and how the club was being used, consideration of how the club might be used in the future, and finally a written brief of the spaces that a new club building could offer.

The written brief was provided to Bonus Architects who commenced work on concepts for changes to existing club buildings that might satisfy the needs and vision of the club members. Over the following 12 years interest in pursuing the redevelopment ebbed and flowed as various Executive Committees and Presidents brought their own agenda to the priorities for the club. Despite some pauses along the way, a long period of concept development, further member engagement, liaison with Council including a Pre DA meeting, and design development led to the lodging of a DA in 2023.

Subsequent delays followed as changes to Council's Mayor, CEO and financial priorities saw a change in attitude towards the DA from Council. Having committed to fund the cost of consultants needed to complete the DA, Council stopped all funding after the DA was lodged. Assessment of the application led to the need for further consultant costs that ultimately were funded by the club to the value of \$85,682.

The application was finally put to the Sydney North Planning Panel (an independent Planning Authority put in place by the NSW Government) who voted in favour of the

application. DA 2023/0998 was formally determined (approved) on 31/03/2025 but the Consent operates from 22/04/2025. The Consent includes conditions and lapses on 22/04/2030 if it has not been activated before then.

With a DA for the building works to the club the next steps involve fund raising, design work and further planning before any work can commence. Work will now commence in earnest to pursue the next steps.

Other than the DA, the year was business as usual. Jamie and Tracy lived through their 2nd summer season with the club and their efforts and commitment have not diminished since the day they started. The Club and members thank Jamie and Tracy for all their work. The relationship has only strengthened, and at the time of writing this report discussions are underway for an extension to the term for Jamie and Tracy; a testament to how happy the club is with their contribution, and to their passion for their role at the club. I'd also like to thank Carla's continuing support in the Club Administration role. The coordination between Carla and Jamie continues to allow a seamless approach to the club buildings operation and maintenance.

The Building Panel comprised the same members as the previous year; Linda Wiadowski, Maurice Mandalinic, Andrew Reed and Stephen Bennett. I thank them for their involvement. Their assistance and guidance has been welcomed throughout the season. Having several sets of eyes on the facility in addition to differing views on how to operate the club always ensures a better outcome for members.

A new initiative was introduced through the course of the season. A Working Group was formed of club members who have some time, some handy skills and some interest in maintaining and improving the club buildings. With the amount of cleaning and upkeep through the season it became apparent that the repair works were being left behind. The

Working Group assisted Jamie to start on some of those jobs that he just hadn't been able to get on top of through the summer season. Members of the Working Group include Eric Middledorp, Kev Dyer, and Phil Fagan. Thanks to those members whose contribution has been invaluable. We hope to build on this initiative next season and expand the group as well as the scope that they cover.

The EC has continued their support of the initiatives presented to them in relation to the club building and I thank them for their support.

Club members engaged very early in the season with a working bee arranged. This has become an annual event that is well attended by club members. It kicks the summer off with a bang and provides that much needed heavy lifting when it comes to the bigger jobs around the club. Finally, to Northern Beaches Council we say thankyou. The support you provide and the maintenance you carry out on some parts of the club building as well as the surrounding parkland is appreciated. Being a Council owned building, there is an agreement in place that sets out what Council are responsible for and what the Club is responsible for. All the external maintenance of the building and the parkland including the dunes and beach are managed by Council. That explains why some of those small things Club members see unattended to take a while to have rectified. The process through Council just takes a little longer than if the Club was dealing with it themselves. Having said that, Council always reacts to any emergency or critical matter and our thanks must go out to all at Council.

PROJECTS

Gym

The Gym has continued to evolve over the course of the last year. Tim Hollingsworth has continued as Gym Manager and has continued to keep up to date with club members wishes. Additional equipment has





been added to the gym over the last year including a treadmill, and a ski erg, and the EC has approved the purchase of a ski paddling erg for members use. Thanks for your work Tim.

Courtyard

The work to the courtyard was finally completed this year. The garbage bins were moved to the locked up area near the driveway and so the courtyard is a usable and attractive space again.

Members Lounge

The area that was built as a museum for the club was rarely used and appeared to be a waste of valuable club floor space. Throughout the course of the last year the area was converted to a 'Members Lounge' and furniture was purchased for that purpose. The space is now utilized by club members mid week as well as weekends and any club functions. It is serviced by the bar and is a huge success.

Our objective for the Nippers program at Freshwater is to continue building and growing in order to achieve our overarching purpose of creating the lifesavers of tomorrow. We want to pursue that purpose by providing a fun and engaging program for both Nippers and their Parents / Carers. We are pleased to report that this year has been a fantastic season of growth and achievement for our Nippers and we can't wait to see everyone back on the beach next season.

As we have seen over the past three seasons, the program continued to grow this year. We welcomed 810 Nippers into the program, from Under 6 through to Under 14. This is up 26% on the previous season. The growth we have seen and the retention of Nippers through the age groups demonstrates the engagement we are having with Nippers and their parents / carers. We welcomed families from across the Northern Beaches and across Sydney, many of whom have returned to us this year as well as new members who joined us looking for a fun and inclusive Nippers experience.

Congratulations and Farewell to our Graduating Under 14 Class!

"Creating tomorrow's lifesavers" is our purpose and this year we successfully graduated 35 U14's through the Surf Rescue Certificate Program (SRC). This is almost double the 18 graduates we had last year. It has been pleasing to see the majority of our SRC graduates moving to become active Patrolling members, exercising the skills they have built up over 9 years in the Nippers program. A big call out to our incredible Training team – especially Kelly Dobrow, John Goldrick and Michiel Tops for their support in training our Under 14s through the SRC program.

We are proud of this year's class of Under 14s and many tears were shed at the graduation dinner to celebrate the success of this class and completion of their time in Nippers. We are especially grateful to Adam Ewers for guiding this cohort as Age Manager through the years. This class was not just large in size, but also large in personality. We will cherish the signed Redback Board you have left to the club as your graduating gift.

It has been great to see the widening engagement with the broader club that this cohort has led. Our Junior Club Captains were Amelia Mandalinic and Emily Isaacs who together led our junior club members and represented the Club passionately and respectfully through the season.

Without these dedicated individuals, we couldn't run Nippers. On behalf of the club and all the Nipper children, thank you.

Thank you also to Brent Cahill (our Sunday Activities Coordinator) and Kathy Switzer-Lowes (our Age Manager Coordinator) for

all your hard work coordinating our Sunday activities each week.

Season Highlights

Some of the highlights from the season included:

- We raised in excess of \$2000 in our pre-season Bunnings BBQ. Thanks to everyone who came out and cooked sausages or baked cakes for our fun fundraising event. Thanks especially to the Under 14s for baking a range of goods to sell!
- We continued the tradition of the Freshwater pre-season camp – welcoming over 54 Nippers and their families to Ingenia One Mile Beach in September for our fun two-day camp to engage in some pre-season fun and games and to build the camaraderie within and across age groups. It was great to see the teamwork demonstrated between Nippers and between Parents again this year at these events.

Bennett Freshwater Fast & Furious Carnival

This is our very own Junior Carnival, held on the beach at Freshwater Beach every November. This year's carnival was great success – attracting 346 competitors from across 13 clubs. It was fantastic to have the support of Greg Bennett, sponsoring the event again this year. For the third year in a row, we were blessed with fantastic weather and the event was fantastically managed. Thanks to Richard Hawtin as Chief Carnival Referee. The highlight of course was the famous Iron Person event – and the long sprint to the finish line with all the supporters screaming their support to each and every Nipper who took on the challenge to compete. Special congratulations to Harry Ayer who won the U14 Iron person event,

Brad Nitz who was second in the U14 Iron person event and Piper Branchley who was second in the U13 Iron person event. We were lucky also to have Piper Branchley win one of the prize Boards in the lucky draw!

SNB Junior Branch Championships – Newport Beach

This year Junior Branch carnival for both Water and Beach events was held at Newport Beach. Pleasingly, Freshwater fielded a team of 53 in Water events and 36 in Beach events. The Branch Carnival is really the test run for the big events at State, but we made sure Freshwater showed up to these events with a focus on being one team and supporting each other. This year was particularly challenging for the Water events – which were ultimately cancelled and rescheduled.

Our strength really is participation and team events and it was no exception at this year's Branch Championships. We were proud to finish in 4th position in the land branch titles with 125 points, and 3rd position in the water branch titles with 141 points (up from 5th place last year!).

NSW Junior State Championships – North Steyne and Queenscliff Beaches

Proudly showing off their Nippers State gear – comprising a sun-shirt, a white polo and maroon shorts, our team of 76 Nippers across all age groups represented Freshwater at the 2025 State Championships (up from 68 the prior year). With the mantra of participation and being "one team", the Freshwater Nippers team displayed great mettle across 4 days of competition. Unfortunately, the weather was atrocious again, with many events cancelled amidst the cyclonic conditions. Youth Report

I've loved working alongside the youth of Freshwater in my first year in this role. It's been a great year for the youth and I'm excited to continue building our youth program in the years to come.

We began the season by establishing the Freshwater Youth Panel, a team dedicated to shaping the future of youth at the club. This group was instrumental in planning, organising, and delivering a full calendar of youth events, including several new initiatives introduced this season. A huge thank you to Samantha (Sammy) Lever, Kirra Budd, Isabelle (Izzy) Stapf-Giannakis, Liam Lehane, Caitlin Price, Grace Hardy, Harry Parker, and our outstanding U14 Club Captains, Emily Isaacs and Amelia Mandalinic. None of it would have been possible without your help.

We kicked things off by launching a survey to hear directly from our youth about what they value most and how we could improve their experience at Freshwater. One of the first outcomes was a minor revamp of the informal 'Youth Area' upstairs in the boardroom including the addition of couches, cutlery, bowls, plates, cups, a speaker along with a new outdoor lounge (still to come) transforming it into a more inviting space to hang out and study.

We started the season in September with the 2024 Youth Weekend Away at Lindsay and Steve Davis' beautiful property in Bungwahl (near Forster). It was a fantastic opportunity to reconnect during the off-season, build new friendships, refine our water and lifesaving skills, and complete our proficiencies—all while enjoying the stunning summer weather of the Mid North Coast. We were even lucky enough to paddle alongside dolphins and whales. A huge thank you to Kelly Dobrow and Paris Giannakis for your incredible support in leading the camp.

After the camp, we were energised and ready for a big season of patrols and competition. It was incredible to see our youth delivering record-breaking patrol hours, with 7 out of the top 20 patrolling members being youth, and impressively, all of the top five female patrollers.

On the competitive side, we focused on better communication and building an inclusive environment where everyone - from seasoned athletes to brand-new members could participate. Engagement in our Youth Board, Swim, Ski (BSS) and Lifesaving programs saw a good boost, with participation numbers growing significantly. One great achievement was increasing Youth BSS training attendance from just five

members per session in the previous season up to 20 this year. A massive thank you to our dedicated BSS Head Coach James Coates, Tom Duffy our Open BSS Team Manager along with Kelly Dobrow, Lindsay Davis, Mark Gilbert and Cheryl White for their tireless effort in coaching us across the lifesaving competition fields. We wrapped up the season with the 2025



SRC Youth Development Camp, where our SRCs got a taste of everything Freshwater has to offer beyond nippers. From IRBs, RWCs, surf boats, and board/swim sessions to a trivia night and a slip and slide. It was especially encouraging to see such strong enthusiasm from our emerging youth members as they transition into the senior club. Special thanks to Mandy Cannon and Luca Stein (who travelled all the way from South Curly to help), as well as our amazing parent supervisors: Carla Davies, Bec Isaacs and Andre Liebetrau thanks for your support throughout the camp.

Even as the season wrapped up, enthusiasm hasn't faded. The Freshwater Democracy sausage sizzle was a huge success, thanks to Caitlin, Harry, Pricey, Bree, Tom, Ollie, Cooper, Lucas, Lenny and Jake who helped to raise funds for our ongoing youth competition programs. And now we've launched straight into Winter Training (the Winter Arc), with a large group of youth preparing for the Coolangatta Gold. Thanks to Michael Kirkby for leading this program.

I'd like to extend a huge thank you to all the youth members of Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club who were involved this season. Your dedication and enthusiasm contributed hundreds of patrol hours, and your energy helped shape one of our most successful youth seasons in recent years.

Thanks to the executive of Freshwater for your ongoing support and I'm excited to see everyone on the beach throughout winter and into the new season.

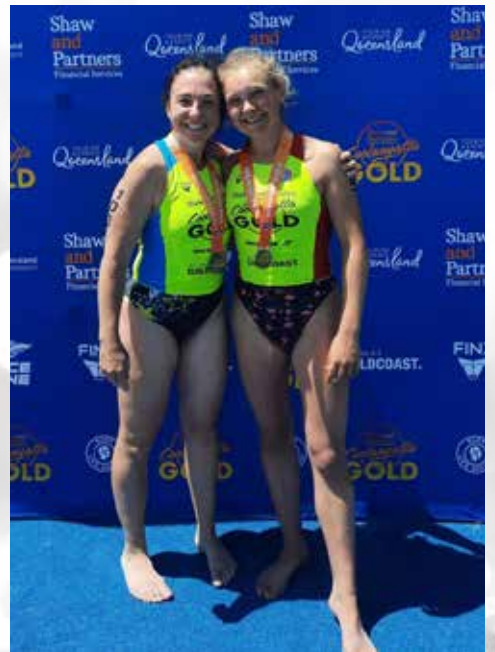

The weather for the day was about perfect, however surf and swell conditions required regular monitoring to ensure events could be run safely. Three Water Areas were “set up” for the commencement of the day with a 7.30am start being achieved and the last Water areas closing around 3.30pm. The conditions were “classic” for the events, the best seen for many years and relished (maybe apprehensively) by the competitors. Entry numbers were around 700 competitors, about the same as the 2024 carnival.

This year saw the continuation of the extended focus on Board events as part of the “Tim Kirkby Memorial Races” which continues to promote greater interest in the Freshwater event. The work that the volunteers at all surf lifesaving clubs around Australia is so critical.
